Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon, and welcome to our visitors Eversley, and the match officials for our last game this month before starting a busy April from next weekend. Although this is Eversley's first season in the Combined Counties League, it's not their first visit to Redding Way. The two Clubs last met here when Knaphill were in the Surrey Intermediate League, before we joined the CCL in season 2007/08. Our meeting with Eversley this season was back in October which resulted in a 2-1 win for the Hampshire side.

Both Clubs achieved maximum points last weekend, Knaphill 2-1 winners away at Bedfont Sports and Eversley having a 2-1 success at home Farleigh Rovers. At Bedfont, it was not good conditions on a wet afternoon, and certainly wasn't the best circumstances for attractive football.

It was a disappointing first half, which Knaphill failed to produce any really serious threats on the Bedfont goal, as they trailed by a 43rd minute goal from the home side in the first half. Knaphill equalised on 58 minutes, with the equaliser coming from new signing Edward Cardona, and with a battling performance and some hard grafting eventually got their reward in the 90th minute, when Matt Baker fired in the winner. It was our seventh consecutive win, and the ninth from 11 league games played since the beginning of January.

Eight points separate the two teams today, Knaphill in 6th place with 54 points from 29 games and Eversley 9th on 46 points from 26 games. It's certainly getting interesting in the pack behind the top two of Worcester Park and Staines Lammas, which sees Knaphill six points behind Hartley Wintney in 3rd spot, who have played three games more, whilst Cobham and Mole Valley(who played on Tuesday night)occupying fourth and fifth place respectively.



Our Reserves, like the first team, have also had good results over the past two weeks. Last Saturday they chalked up a fine 3-0 win last against Crescent Rovers and the previous week beat Staines Lammas away 2-1. Playing well at the moment, the Reserves can start climbing the table with their current form and still with 11 games to play. See Manager Matt Chesterman comments on the recent results in his 'Plenty In Reserve' column elsewhere in the programme.

As time marches on with this month almost at an end, we hope to end on a winning note to complete a successful month of results in March. Then it's onto a busy April with eight games to play, with four taking place in midweek, those matches during the week, resulting from the postponed games during the season. We are scheduled to finish our season away at Farnham on 3rd May. So a busy time ahead, and we start next month with a visit to Crescent Rovers next Saturday 3rd April.

For now though, enjoy the game today, and have a safe journey home.....

We have 54 points from 29 games whereas they have 46 from 26 with three games in hand, so today's game adds just that little bit of extra incentive to say the least.





eversley fc

Eversley Football Club has roots dated as far back as 1910 and is one of Hampshire's oldest affiliated clubs. For a number of years the club was managed and administrated by members of the local community, including Tim Spencer and Gary Clarke, who ran the club during the mid and late nineties. However, we have come a very long way in the last 9 years since the current committee took control at the turn of the Millennium.

After spending the majority of seasons lingering in the Aldershot & District League, with limted success and occasional silverware, our 1st XI and Reserves eventually progressed into the Surrey County Intermediate League Western in 2005 thanks to the work of our then 1st XI Manager, Richard Vangrove. Form was consistent and both teams finished in or around mid-table for 3 consecutive seasons, where we held our own but didn't really making any major impression. However, despite the lack of successes the club has continued to aim high and be ambitious and in 2008 our application to join the newly constituted Surrey Elite Intermediate League was accepted and the impact was instant.

Under the control of a new management team our 1st XI won the League Challenge Cup, beating Epsom Eagles 4-1, and we then went onto win the League title with 1-0 win against Battersea Ironsides in the very last game of the season.....and almost the last kick of the season. It was certainly a nail biting finish!!!

In the same season our Reserves narrowly missed out on first place in the League after only losing one game all season, but success came with a Cup double triumph. First Croydon Greenside Reserves were beaton 2-1 in the Subsidiary Cup Final and the season ended with a pulsating League Challenge Cup conquest over Liphook Reserves and a penalty shoot-out win after a dramatic 3-3 stalemate after 90 minutes and extra time.

Our achievements from last season enabled us to gain promotion to the Combined Counties League Division 1 and be part of the National Football



League System for the first time in our history. This is a fabulous accomplishment and is a reward for all the hard work that has gone on over the years behind the scenes. Confidence is obviously high after the success of last season but we know full well that the standard of football is going to be one step higher than what we are used to. Realistically, this first season should be about holding our own and coming to terms with the pace and competitiveness of the Division, but the ambitious nature of the committee, management teams and players means that we will once again be aiming high, looking to make an instant impact. Last season we were the lowest ranked team going into the Surrey Elite League and we were probably took everyone by surprise, who says that we can't do the same again?!?!?!

The club has never really had a ground or a pitch that it can call its true 'home' and has spent the last 9 years flittering between various local authority owned pitches located away from the Village. Prior to this, the home pitch can only be described as a cow field with a shed for a changing room block, it really was that basic and we still have a number of players around you started their careers on this ground!! In view of this homelessness situation, in 2002 we joined forces with California FC (a Charter Standard Junior Football Club) and Eversley Cricket Club (one of the oldest cricket clubs in the country) to form the Eversley Sports Association (ESA).

The aim of the ESA was to plan and implement the development of additional sports facilities on land to be leased from RMC Aggregates (now Cemex), and provide common services to the participating three clubs. It has been a long time coming but the new ground and facilities are now finally complete and look magnificent. Years of hard work and effort now seem worthwhile and we are incredibly grateful to the ESA committee for all the time they have spent on the project. We now have a recognised ground to call 'home' and fantastic new changing room and clubhouse facilities all built to a high standard. Further expansion of the site is still in negotiation, and there are plans to install floodlights within the next 12 months and a 3G training facility is also in the pipeline for 2010. The project continues......

The total cost of this new sports development exceeds £2M, and includes a grant from the Football Foundation of £700k, the largest single award in Hampshire at the time. In 2006 Steve Coppell kindly came down to present us with the cheque, which was great for the whole community. The remaining money has come from various other local donors and contributors as well as annual fund raising activities that the ESA and the 3 clubs have run over the past 7 years.

Having run two Saturday teams for over 9 years, last season saw the club expand to three Saturday teams as well as two new Sunday teams. This just proves the level of interest that there is in the club at this moment in time and we have now established ourselves as one of the largest in the area in respect of player base. We have the right people on board who are committed to running a successful football club, and we are certainly heading in the right direction.

Plus now that we have a connection with a Junior club this will ensure that youth continues to flow into our teams which in turn provides for a very bright and long-lasting future.

In late 2010 the club will be celebrating its centenary year so we look forward to having a great big party with players and committee members of past and present.

MATCH REPORT THE LAST TIME WE MET OUR VISITORS

Knaphill's disappointing form at home was taken with them on their travels when they visited League newcomers Eversley on Saturday. Knaphill's had won all their previous five league games away, but the home side dented that 100% record bringing it to an abrupt end in the 2-1 defeat. A rather lack lustre performance from Knaphill failed to ignite a great deal of spark or cutting edge against an Eversley side who were often more fluent than their visitors.

The last time the teams met was in the Surrey Intermediate League 2006/07 season when Knaphill became Premier champions before entering the Combined Counties League, and with Eversley making their CCL debut this season, they look like a valuable asset in this Division.

A fairly bright opening for both teams with equal possession and looking for an early opener. One of the few efforts for Knaphill came after 18 minutes from Matt Edwards who, after a good run into the box, fired inches wide of the far post, their closest threat to a goal in the first half. Other chances came and went without too much danger.

Knaphill's defence had a couple of narrow escapes as desperate defending and a slice of luck, cleared the home side's efforts on goal as Eversley started to look more dangerous going forward. In the 34th minute, a defensive blunder gave Matt Stamp the gleeful opportunity to punish Knaphill, and fire into the far corner of goal to make it 1-0.

Not too much action at the start of the second half until Kieron Thorne brought out a fine save from Nick Rogers, the keeper tipping the effort over the bar after 57 minutes. Two minutes later he had to be sharp to turn a shot from defender Daniel Taylor away for a corner. The same player had an effort blocked and cleared by Gary Campbell before Thorne tucked away a well taken goal in the 67th minute.

As Knaphill tried to haul their way back into the game, Nick Darnell hooked a shot over the bar on 72 minutes, then a minute later the visitors pulled one back. Campbell worked his way into the box, slipped a pass to Ricky Hogsden who steered the ball home to reduce the arrears. But, there was to be no further comeback or enough pressure on the home defence, for Knaphill to gain even a share of the points.

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park. Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1. Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in there respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division. Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).


In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

Although there was a certain lack of quality, this was more of a battling performance and some hard grafting, that steered Knaphill to another three points against Bedford Sports on Saturday, with a 90th minute winner coming from Matt Baker.

As far as chances in the in the first half were concerned, Knaphill fell short of seriously testing Bedfont's keeper, whilst the home side gave their visitors defence some cause for concern, especially in the first fifteen minutes. A quick break in the ninth minute almost saw Bedfont steal the lead as Turner struck the crossbar, and two minutes later, the ball bobbled off the bar and clawed to safety by Richard Shelley.

Bedfont were looking dangerous on the breaks, from which the Knaphill defence had to be alert. With Knaphill's Dan Cox always eager to push forward, the defender drilled an effort wide of the far post on 33 minutes, but just as it was looking to be a first half stalemate, Bedfont took the lead two minutes before the break, when Saman Kanani took his chance well to drive his shot into the far corner of goal.

More determination and chances showed in Knaphill's second half display, and substitute Chris Fox had two chances early on, driving the ball wide of the post, and firing over the bar. Knaphill got themselves back in the game after 58 minutes, when new signing from Farnham Town, Edward Cardona, pursued his intentions into the box and surrounded by two defenders, got the better of them as he scrambled the ball over the line from close range for the equaliser.

Knaphill's best, and most clear cut chance of the half came in the 73rd minute when Matt Baker's shot was palmed away by the keeper, as the ball bounced invitingly for Cardona who should have buried it, but fired over from 12 yards.

Whilst Bedfont had been pressing for a second goal, it was Knaphill's pursuance that brought them the winning goal in the 90th minute. Fox threaded a pass through to Baker who executed the delivery with perfection to make it 2-1. Knaphill held on during the five minutes of time added on, but were relieved when Bedfont's final chance hit the post, in the final minute, as Knaphill recorded their seventh consecutive league win.

This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk frommidfielder Nick Darnell

Nick Darnell joined Knaphill in their second season in the Combined Counties League, not that he was new to the CCL, as his previous club was Westfield. A good signing for Knaphill in a season that produced some good football. Let's go back to Nick's earlier days in football and as in several of our players that have featured in our 'Inside Talk' feature, he inevitably started playing at an early age, which appears to be a good start for youngsters who share the enthusiasm for the game.

Nick started playing when he was 6 years old, and continued playing at the level of Junior football throughout a number of teams until he was sixteen whilst living in Hertfordshire. At the age of 14, Nick played two years for the County and District teams, before moving to Guildford when he was 16 years old.

Football also moved on for Nick as far as higher levels were concerned, he had trials with Woking, playing in their Youth and Reserve teams until he was eighteen, being part of two League title winning teams. From the last year of his teens, he went to University – where he also played football – of course. Nick played for 3 years at Cardiff University where the team played in the Wales League, but he suffered a few injuries and struggled for fitness at times.

After University, Nick joined Merrow FC, winning the League title in first season there in 2002/03, and became captain of the side, and in his second season at Merrow, the team finished 6th in the League. Time for a move, this time it was to be Westfield in the CCL Premier 2005/06 season, but the side went down into Division 1 a season later.





From then, Nick said "I got bored at Westfield, they had a new coach, football not a good quality, and decided to join Knaphill for season 2008/09". He liked what he saw at Redding Way, including the good facilities, and knew some of the players prior to his transfer from Westfield. He suffered a knee injury in the latter stages of the season, but overall it was a good one for Nick, whilst this season he feels the team are doing well, good run at the moment, more enjoyable all round from defence, through midfield to the strikers, especially in this second half of the season.

"The first half of the season could have been better and had it matched the current form in the second half, we could have been higher in the league" said Nick. When asked about the captaincy role Nick said "I enjoyed the role of captain, and although that has now been relinquished, I feel I am playing better in an individual role, whereas being captain, you feel as if you're concentrating on everyone else around you, instead of your own role". Nick, or as he is known by his nickname, 'Tank', is now looking ahead to a good final run in and some good results in the latter stage of the current season.



LAST YEAR



Knaphill ended the month with their third successive win, in the 2-1 success over Warlingham at Redding Way on Saturday, and from their last ten league games have now gained 25 points from a possible 30, keeping them in touch with the top three of Division One with nine games remaining.

The opening spell saw Knaphill show their intent of looking for an early lead against visitors Warlingham on Saturday, as they did the previous week at Coulsdon, only this time it took a little longer. As they applied pressure on the visitors defence, one of the early efforts came from Ian Savage with a free kick driven towards the top corner of goal and clawed out by Algar in the visitors goal.

Despite pressure from the home side, Warlingham showed their first threat in a quick break after 13 minutes that caused a mistake by Lee Crozier who failed to clear cleanly, only for Nathan Miles to avert danger with a timely clearance from Mardiamid.

However, having shaken off a few minutes of defensive jitters, Knaphill recovered and restored attacking mode, and in the 20th minute took the lead. Matt Edwards saw his effort from a cross by Michael Pym, only half cleared out to Matt Baker, who gathered the ball, turned and drove low into the far corner of goal, his 19th of the season. At the other end, Knaphill keeper Nick Rogers, was forced to make his first serious save after 30 minutes, as the visitors went in search of an equaliser.

Knaphill increased their lead after 37 minutes, Gavin Evans providing the perfect cross to Pym whose neat flick in the 18 yard box beat the visitors keeper to make it 2-0. In the latter stage of the first half, Knaphill's defence had to be alert to stop their opponents breaking through, and when they did Crozier, already beaten for pace into the 18 yard box, gave away a penalty in the 45th minute, from which Paul Stuart's spot kick put Warlingham back in the game.

The second half laboured at times with Knaphill finding it difficult to find a clear route to goal. Gary Campbell's close range header veered wide of the post, then Nick Darnell cut in on goal at an angle, but his effort hit the side netting after 75 minutes. The best opportunity fell to Pym who met Crozier's cross, and from close range should have been on target. But Knaphill hung on for their three points without stepping up the tempo and finding an extra gear in the second half.

These are my first programme notes for a few weeks and it's nice to be able to say we have now managed to get a run of games on, and come away with some good results. 
