Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon everyone and a welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Farleigh Rovers, also to the three match officials for this Division 1 encounter today. Our last meeting against Farleigh was at the end of August when we secured maximum points with a 2-1 win, Nick Darnell and Chris Fox the goalscorers.

This season, Farleigh are riding higher in the league than they were at this stage last year and are currently fifth in the table with 45 points from 24 games, whilst Knaphill have, after holding around a midtable position for a while, moved up the table with five wins and a draw from the last seven league games and are now on 42 points from 25 games and in seventh place. This included a draw at South Park, wins over Warlingham, Cobham, Croydon Municipal, Westfield and Hartley Wintney.

Looking back on our three recent games, the last one at home two weeks ago, saw a 2-1 win over Croydon Municipal, with both goals coming from Gavin Brainch, and it could have been a bigger margin with one effort striking the bar from Nick Darnell, and the other a post from Matt Baker.

Then came the local derby at Westfield producing a display from Knaphill which Woking News & Mail Sports Editor Clive Youlton described as "simply scintillating as they tore Westfield apart in the second half". Knaphill led by a Craig Parrington goal on the stroke of halftime, with second half goals from Matt Baker(2) and Ricky Hogsden, to make it 4-0. With some better finishing, we could have scored even more !

Westfield team boss Dave Robson praised Knaphill's performance by saying "I couldn't fault my lads commitment, but the difference was in their quality. They outplayed us in the second half, and are a much



better team than Staines Lammas who beat us on Saturday, and their back four was on a different level to the one we faced earlier in the season".

Last Saturday it was a trip to third placed Hartley Wintney, a side who had beaten us in Cup competition earlier in the season, and inflicted a 5-3 defeat in the league at Redding Way. What a great result though came from that game !

Knaphill's commitment, desire, determination, and good defending, overcame the loss of Ricky Hogsden, who was sent off after just 12 minutes. But to play for nearly 80 minutes with 10 men, one couldn't praise those players enough as they went on to gain the three points in the 1-0 win, the goal coming from a well struck, typical trademark free kick from Matt Baker after 83 minutes. That result put Knaphill just four points behind 3rd place Hartley Wintney in Division One.

Looking ahead to fixtures coming up, starting with next Saturday 27 February away to Farnham Town (3pm) followed by two home games, Saturday 6 March, CB Hounslow are the visitors, and on Saturday 13 March, Knaphill, play hosts to Coulsdon United. All home and away league games have now reverted back to 3.00pm kick-offs. Fixture wise after today, Knaphill have 14 games remaining.

So, that's about it from Knappers Matters for this week, more news, views and match reports elsewhere in the programme.....

I have said for a long time that consistency plays a big part in a team's progress and the season is proving to be a tale of two halves. The second half of our season is certainly more productive than the first when we struggled to regain the form of the previous season and we could not get a run of results together. 

### Combined Counties League Division One Wednesday February 3 2010 Feltham 1 Knaphill 0

A disappointing night for Knaphill with the 1-0 defeat by Feltham on Wednesday night from a game that was played on a poor pitch, making it impossible to play good, if any football on for both teams. However, despite the conditions, Knaphill were unable to capitalise on the chances they had from which with better finishing could have secured at least a point.

Knaphill went into the game off the back of two good wins from their previous two League games against Warlingham and Cobham. They had an opportunity to open the scoring in this game after 21 minutes when Ricky Hogsden tried to work his way round the keeper, but left himself a tight angle and shot wide of goal. Although both sides were creating opportunities, Feltham had a slight edge and took the lead in the 23rd minute.

On the half hour, Knaphill defender Dan Cox delivered a fine cross which zapped across the face of goal, but no Knaphill player was close enough to connect with a shot on goal. The hosts seemed quicker to the ball, and although Knaphill did create chances, the final delivery and cutting edge was missing. Shortly before the break Matt Edwards layed the ball off to Hogsden whose effort went agonisingly wide of the far post.

In the second half, Hogsden had a chance to score but with too much lift on the ball, shot over the bar. The Knaphill goal had a couple of lucky escapes as Feltham were looking for a second, and Richard Shelley denied the home side twice, the second was a tip over the bar following a fierce effort from Luke Craig.

It was not a night for skilful football with the condition of the pitch, but there was the opportunity late in the second half for Knaphill to equalise, but two opportunities, the best one from Chris Fox, were not capitalised on and went wide of the post.

It seems to have been a while since I can honestly say I think we might just have turned the corner. The result at Hartley Wintney was incredible. We won 1-0 away from home with 10 men. The team we beat managed to beat us quite easily at the beginning of the season. If anything, they boasted at being a stronger side than when we played them previously. The whole squad deserve a massive pat on the back. They chased, fought and played some very good football. I think that was the best team performance I have seen since joining the club.

We were down to 10 men very early in the first half after Ricky Hodgson was sent off for so called kicking out at an opponent. Ricky was, in my opinion, badly treated and had to withstand a lot of abuse before the incident. Bob Pritchard re-organised the team and got the success he deserved. Of course the winning goal came from a trademark free kick by Matt Baker. Can I also thank the Chairman and his committee at Hartley Wintney for their hospitality and welcome.

If my understanding of statistics is correct we now have won 5 of the last 7 fixtures. One of these fixtures was away at our local rivals Westfield. I cannot put into words any better than the way Clive Youlton of the Woking News and Mail described it: "ANYBODY watching Knaphill on Tuesday night will be wondering just how they have managed to be so below-par with such quality."

Bob Pritchard's men were simply scintillating as they tore Westfield apart in the second half, having led through Craig Parrington's goal on the stroke of half time. Knaphill had the game wrapped up 15 minutes into that second period, with Ricky Hogsden and the superb Matt Baker on target, before a Baker penalty made it 4. Frankly, it could have been 8 and both strikers were guilty of poor finishing.

"Westfield were gone after quarter of an hour of the first half and couldn't cope with our football even though our first goal came at a good time for us," said Knaphill boss Pritchard. "The scoreline was a better reflection of the play later on."

Westfield boss Dave Robson, who gave a debut to Adam Yates, mused: "We hung on well in the first half despite their possession. "I couldn't fault my lads' commitment but the difference was in their quality. They outplayed us in the second half and it makes you wonder how they have got a team like that together....They are a much better team than Staines Lammas who beat us on Saturday. After the game I did a collection for the girl who broke a leg during the ladies fixture, Knaphill v Westfield last Sunday. We managed to raise a very creditable £100.00.

We will also shortly be introducing an appeal for the money needed to pay our part of the cost of the ground developments. We are going to need to raise upwards of £6000.00 so let's have your help and ideas. Do not leave it to the few of us to pay for this bill.

# farleigh rovers





Farleigh Rovers was formed in I922 being formerly called Farleigh & Chelsham and their first home was Farleigh Common. They played in the Edenbridge & Caterham League between 1923-57. Rovers were representated in the Croydon league between 1958-76. They purchased their present home at Parsonage Field in 1959 when the players had a whip round and bought the ground.

They won the Surrey Intermediate South East Division Three in 1978-79 and the Premier Division Surrey Intermediate in 1981-82. One of the founder members of the Surrey Premier League in 1982-83 and promoted to the Combined Counties League in 1983-84 where they finished mid table in there first season. Farleigh's highest finish in Combined Counties League was in the Premier, 6<sup>th</sup> in 1990-91 however they were relegated to Surrey Premier in the 93-94 season despite finishing half way up the league!.

Remained in Surrey Premier winning the Premier League Cup in 2002-03. Rejoined Combined Counties when Surrey Senior League amalgamated with Combined Counties 2003-04. Finished 12<sup>th</sup> last season and reached the final of the Surrey Premier Cup where they lost 2-1 to the Metropolitan Police Reserves. This season they are at present 5th in the League having won 14 and drawing 3 of their 24 games Knocked out in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round of the EL Premier Cup by Dorking and lost in the second round of the Surrey Premier Cup to Tooting and Mitcham Reserves, lost to Mole Valley SCR in the Divisional Cup.

# last time we met here

### Combined Counties League Division One Saturday April 25 2009 Knaphill 3 Farleigh Rovers 1

Knaphill followed up their midweek win over local rivals Sheerwater, with three more points in the 3-1 win against Farleigh Rovers at Redding Way on Saturday, as the challenge for the title remains on course. Despite a first half of missed chances and an early strike against the post, it was the second half that Knaphill showed the better football blitzing Farleigh with three goals in a five minute spell.

Although the game opened at a fast pace, the early effort from Michael Pym whose shot came back off the post, and further opportunities, were not strong enough to give them the advantage as the half wore on. Chris Fox, who was proving instrumental when Knaphill went on the attack, had a shot cleared by the outstretched leg of keeper Ollie Waiton, whilst at the other end, Richard Shelley was forced into his first serious save from Paul Spencer after 32 minutes.

Chances fell to Knaphill when David Stevens sent a perfect cross into the 18 yard box, but two players failed to get a touch on the ball. Then after 36 minutes, a good cross from Fox was met by Ricky Hogsden whose shot was scooped out by the keeper, only as far as Pym who was too slow to react and the chance had gone. Shortly before the break, a header from Pym went close, but was tipped over by Waiton.





The second half produced a much more positive and livelier display from Knaphill as they were driving forward with confidence, and in a five minute spell early in the half, stormed to a 3-0 lead. In the 50<sup>th</sup> minute, Pym's pass found Baker who turned for goal, and rifled the ball past the keeper form 15 yards. It was the leading goalscorer's 25<sup>th</sup> goal of the season.

After 52 minutes, Chris Fox made a brilliant solo run weaving past defenders to finish in style and make it 2-0. Knaphill were now moving into top gear with some neat one touch football and pressure on the visitors defence. In the 54<sup>th</sup> minute they increased their lead when Ricky Hogsden, with time and space, unleashed the perfect shot and into the far corner of goal. Three well taken goals that had rocked Farleigh as the home side's pressure continued.

However, Farleigh did break through reduce the deficit after 65 minutes when Chris Gedman found room in Knaphill's back four, to fire past Shelley, who had just got a hand to the ball as it flew into goal. In search of a fourth goal, Edwards fired just wide on 72 minutes, and a Pym shot was blocked by the keeper.

## thestorysofar

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in there respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

## historyofknaphillfootballclub

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).

In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.



To visit third place Hartley Wintney and hope to continue their revived league form with a win, would have been pleasing for Knaphill with eleven men, but after the dismissal of Ricky Hogsden, just 12 minutes into the game, it made Knaphill's outstanding performance with ten men, an even better achievement in the 1-0 win. ## **BOOTROOM BANTER** nathan miles

### This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk from ......defender Nathan Miles

Nathan Miles, now in his second season with Knaphill, has recently been given the opportunity of becoming captain in the first team and with this responsibility, he feels that it's injected more life and inspiration in his defensive role within the team. But being captain of a team would have been furthest from his thoughts as Nathan started out playing football when he was just six years old !

From that age, Nathan donned the kit and joined the Juniors set up at Meadow Sports, where he stayed until he was fifteen. During that spell he was involved with teams that won two league titles and he became a long serving member in the many age groups that Meadow Sports produced. At the age of 15, Nathan joined Cobham Youth and went on to progress to playing in the Reserves and also a place in the first team squad. Nathan was in the Reserve team that won the League Cup in 2006, and in the same season won the Players Player of the Year award.

Moving on, Nathan was at Hellinic League side Bisley for the 2007/08 season in their Reserve team. After the one season at Bisley, he signed for Farnborough, but it was to be a short stay, as he had loan spells with Godalming Town and Burnham until around mid-season of 2008/09. But the short stay at Farnborough via loan spells, was to become their loss and Knaphill's gain when Bob Pritchard signed him for Knaphill.

Nathan's first games for Knaphill were in late December 2008 against Staines Lammas in the 1-0 defeat and the 5-1 win at Westfield, and he went on playing regularly until April, when he sustained a hamstring injury at Warlingham, which put him out of action from those last few weeks of the season. He was unable to start playing again until just after the new season 2009/10 got underway, 13 weeks since his last game.

When 23 year old Nathan signed for Knaphill, he obviously knew that it was a drop in League status from his previous clubs, but he expected the League(CCL) to be a tough one. Nathan believes it is even tougher this season, with those clubs coming down from the Premier, Cobham and Hartley Wintney, and some of last seasons clubs in Division 1 like Worcester Park and Farleigh Rovers becoming stronger and a bigger challenge in the Division.





"Bearing that in mind, we've had to raise our game, I believe we are performing better now than last year, and especially since the beginning of this year" said Nathan. How's being captain playing a part of your season now ?" I feel the role is improving my playing and the responsibility that goes with the captain's role is helping towards us getting the best results over the recent games and the feeling of confidence".

A difficult final question to fire at Nathan, but does he feel that gaining say a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish, a possible reality ? Nathan said "It's a tall order, but have no doubt at all, we are capable of a winning streak to obtain that".

Yes, a tall order indeed, and with consistency also being an important factor as part of that possibility, Knaphill, will need to show a strong challenge between now and May.




