# KICK-OFF

#### Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone, and welcome to Redding Way to the players and officials of Farnham Town, also today's three match officials for this our first game for three weeks. Knaphill's league position appears static at the moment when our last home game at the end of October saw a 2-1 defeat by Farleigh Rovers, who grabbed a late winner in a game the lads deserved at least a point from, but a defeat that left us lingering in the bottom six.

Similar circumstances the following week in the visit to Bedfont Sports, we came away pointless after a revived performance in the second half (as in the Farleigh game) to battle back from two goals down to finish up at 3-2 and went close to snatching a valuable point. Unfortunately Knaphill have been unable to field the same consistant line-up at anytime this season, as they seek to recapture the form produced in the past.

After the Bedfont game, Knaphill in 15th place remained with just 12 points from 14 games – a position and statistic the club have not encountered since we joined the Combined Counties League back in 2007.

Two blank Saturdays without a game, has certainly broken up any momentum the team might have struck after the two narrow defeats in the last two league games. So, a bit of catching up to do especially on the points front where we haven't gained maximum points since the Eversley game on 18th September, but also since that game and prior to this afternoon, Knaphill have played only four league games in 10 weeks! That includes three Saturdays without a match and one involved in a Cup competition.

It was at this time last season that Knaphill were in a healthier position having gained 26 points from 16 games. A vast difference from our current position. However, if we can pick up from where we left off in the match against Bedfont, we know we need to continue that this afternoon, against a team who have the third



best defence in Division One, but come on lads, put in a strong challenge, show what can be produced to move onwards and upwards!

Our visitors are currently riding high in Division 1 in fourth place, having played 15 games gaining 31 points. Our last meeting against Farnham earlier in the season resulted in a 4-1 defeat at the Memorial Ground, and back tracking to last season's meeting here at Redding Way, Knaphill took maximum points with a 3-0 win.

Away from the first team for a moment, and news on our Reserves and Youth teams. Last Saturday the Reserves progressed to the next round of the Surrey Intermediate Cup with a 3-2 win over Old Rutlishians in their 2nd round tie at Redding Way. Two goals from Jack Ball and an extra time super strike from Sean Harvey saw Knaphill into the third round when on Saturday 11 December they are at home to Dormansland Rockets kick-off 1.30pm.

Knaphill Youth Under 18s crushed Cove U18s 5-0 in their recent Allied Counties League match with Jack Ball, literally having a ball scoring four of the five goals! Last week, the Youth team lost 2-0 to Carshalton Athletic U18s in the 2nd round of the Surrey Midweek Floodlit Cup played at Molesey's ground.

Looking ahead, our next fixture is away to Worcester Park next Saturday 4th December, and whilst the first team are without a fixture (fourth blank Saturday) on the 11th December, the last league game before Christmas will be here against Cobham on Saturday 18th December kick-off 2.00pm.

So, things are not so bad as people make out, if only sometimes they would look beyond the results they would really see some of the positives things that are taking place at the club not to mention the installation of lights which I am reliably informed is imminent, furthermore, I was delighted to welcome back Gavin Brainch who returned after a short spell with Cove and James Wills who rejoined from Sandhurst.

It's a strange phenomenon that Knaphill have had to endure for some time that we have attracted our fair share of critics, whether its jealousy of the facilities we have here at Redding Way, or envy of the past success we have enjoyed during the past five seasons, it remains a mystery, whatever it is we will never stop the "knockers"; you meet them in every walk of life, I have plenty of them at moment and not that far away either, but in times like these it's a real test of character for all of us but you have a better chance of success by pulling together rather than only concentrating on your own individual gain or self motive, hopefully it will not be too long before we turn the corner and break away from that stigma of being "also ran's".

Another three points came against Farnham Town at Redding Way on Wednesday evening with a 3-0 win, and although they had an early lead, it was later in the second half that they made the lead more secure with two more goals.


Knaphill went one up after 12 minutes when defender Lee Gamble was on the end of a cross from Stephen Flinn, to head home to make it 1-0. Richard Shelley saved well to deny the visitors an early opener, and whilst Knaphill had a fair amount of possession, their goal scoring opportunities failed to enhance on their slender lead by halftime.

Ricky Hogsden had an effort spin wide of the far post on the hour, then in the 65th minute a move which involved Matt Baker, Hogsden, finished with Craig Parrington adding the finishing touch from six yards to make it 2-0. Shelley made a good save from Tigwell to keep Farnham at bay.

Knaphill increased their lead in the 80th minute when Chris Fox chipped his shot with perfection into the far corner for the third goal, and his fourth from the last three games. It was Knaphill's 10th consecutive win which put them one place up the table to fifth with 76 points from 32 games, and a sequence has now seen 36 points obtained from a possible 42 in 14 games since the beginning of January.








#### **Action replay**

For the second week running, Knaphill having suffered successive league defeats, again deserved to get at least a point from their visit to Bedfont Sports on Saturday. Again they fell behind to an early first half goal, as in the previous week's game, but although creating chances in the first half, put in a better hard working performance in the second half, to pull two goals back against the League leaders. There were changes to the side that lost to Farleigh the previous week, which included the return of Richard Shelley in goal, and a couple of enforced positional changes.

After just seven minutes, Knaphill went close to going a goal down, but for a timely clearance off the line by Lee Gamble. The visitors first effort came in the 10th minute when Chris Fox's header flashed over the bar. Bedfont's Tommy Hedges was proving some danger to the Knaphill defence in the early stages and it was his cross from the left that led to Azagba finding space to slot the ball home from eight yards after 15 minutes to give Bedfont the lead.

Knaphill's closest effort of the first half came in the 37th minute when a cracking drive from Chris Fox came back off the post, only for the rebound to be fired over the bar by James Norman when a bit more composure might have paid dividends. Bedfont continued to look dangerous on the break especially down the left flank, and after 44 minutes Hedges fired home to give Bedfont a 2-0 lead.

New signing James Wills, replaced Tony Hadley at the start of the second half and showed his determined pace into the game from the start as Knaphill were moving up a gear in the early stages of the half. In the 50th minute, Gavin Brainch worked his way down the left to provide Ricky Hogsden the perfect opportunity to fire over the keeper to reduce the arrears.

Wills hooked the ball just wide of goal after 58 minutes, but then a quick break from Bedfont on the hour finished with Bamford scoring the leaders third. Despite stepping up their game in this half, Knaphill needed to keep up their workrate to get back into the game. This they did when Wills shot from eight yards to make it 3-2 after 78 minutes. But it was not enough as Bedfont held onto their lead to leave Knaphill once again with nothing to show for their efforts.

#### **Brief History**

Farnham Town was formed in 1906 through the merging of Farnham Bungs (the Farnham Brewery) and the Farnham Star. From this point they graduated through the ranks of the Surrey Senior status. From the Surrey Senior League the club progressed to the London Spartan League. At the end of the 1979/80 season Farnham Town left the London Spartan League and applied to the Combined Counties League, their application was accepted and they finished 4th in their first season.

The club then went on to finish runners-up in the Challenge Cup in the 1980/81 season, losing to Malden Town in the final. In the same season the Reserves finished as runners-up to Ash United. Farnham Town then became runners-up to Guildford and Worplesdon in the 1983/84 Concours Cup and then again runners-up to BAE Weybridge in the 1988/89 season. The club did however salvage some success that season when they made it to the final and won the Challenge Shield against Ash United. The 1986/87 season saw Farnham take second place to Ash United in the league campaign. The glory days finally arrived in the 1990/91 season when the club won the league title. In the 1991/92 season, The Town got a clean sweep of the major trophies by winning the Combined Counties Premier League, the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Dan Air Challenge Cup.

With expectations and excitement growing the club began plans for the Diadora League and were accepted for the following season but badly needed development money for necessary ground improvements but there was no money forthcoming and resulted in the club not having a league to play in for the 1992/93 season. Many of the players who helped the club achieve their earlier success moved on to local neighbours, Aldershot Town who were instrumental in the Diadora Three Championship. If only Farnham Town had been able to continue with their good fortune at that time!

In 1993/94, with the Isthmian plans abandoned, Farnham Town were accepted back into the Combined Counties League. They won the Challenge Cup in the 1995/96 season after defeating Netherene 3-0 in the final. Recent years has not see a repeat of the success, but the club is building again, looking to become a strong force in the league and adopting a programme of continuous improvement. Farnham Town stayed in the Combined Counties Premier Division until, due to ground regulations and lack of finance, were placed in Division One at the end of the 05/06 season.

Farnham Town Football Club was now in it's centenary year. The First season in Division One got off to a flying start with new manager Barry Bridger taking the team to a top-of-the-table finish against tough opponents Warlingham. But, due again to ground regulations The Town could not return to the Premier Division and sadly saw the team finishing second, Horsham Town, taking their place. Simon Bates was manager for the season 07/08 which saw a respectable 5th place finish and a good league cup run through to a semi final place.

Barry Bridger was re-appointed as manager for the 08/09 season and The Town finished 8th place in Division One.



# THE STORY SO FAR... HISTORY OF THE KNAPPERS

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's

Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team. In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over. Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves. The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.

2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and

Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels.

With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

The 2009/10 season saw the team finish third in Division One, their best placing in the three seasons in the Combined Counties League. The previous two seasons the Club finished in seventh and fifth positions.

Third would normally have gained the Club promotion, but due to the proposed floodlights installation being delayed, Knaphill have to make another challenge for promotion in 2010/11. The team won 26 out of their 40 league games, losing 10 with 4 drawn, scoring 98 goals and finishing with 82 points. Season 2010/11 is the first for a Youth team at the Club, with Knaphill Youth U.18's playing in the Allied Counties League.





# WE'VE GOT YOUTH ON OUR SIDE


