KNAPPERS MATTERS

Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Welcome this evening to everyone from Farnham Town, the match officials, and home supporters, for this the first of the midweek games in April. It's going to be a busy month for a lot of clubs this month, playing catch up on the fixtures after postponed matches at different stages of the season.

Farnham have a more games to fit in than any other club in the Division, a total of 14 games, whilst Knaphill have nine remaining. Results wise last Saturday saw Farnham lose 4-2 away at Hartley Wintney, whilst our unbeaten sequence continued at Crescent Rovers in the 3-0 win. That makes it nine successive league wins, including six clean sheets from the last 13 games which has gained the team 33 points from a possible thirty eight.

Following the win over Eversley at the end of March, the next match on the agenda, was the visit to Crescent Rovers last weekend, which became one of just four games played in Division One, with waterlogged pitches hitting not only Division 1 games, but some in the Premier as well.

Knaphill dominated for long periods of the game, plenty of possession and attacking in the first half creating chances, but for all their efforts, the score remained goalless by halftime. But the second half showed more pressure and perseverance and the breakthrough finally came after 63 minutes when a cracking 25 yard volley from Chris Fox, made it 1-0.

Two minutes later it was 2-0, when defender Gavin Brainch made a good run through the defence and in to the box to produce a quality finish, his fourth goal of the season. The game was virtually wrapped up after 76 minutes when Ricky Hogsden supplied the perfect cross to Matt Baker who planted a perfect header past the keeper to make it 3-0.



Overall, with shots off the line, hitting the post, and three well taken goals, Knaphill made it a very comfortable win. However, we still remain in 6th place with 60 points from 31 games, and just three points separates the clubs between sixth and third positions.

It's home again this Saturday when we play hosts to Chobham, the first of two meetings between them in 4 days. The reverse fixture is at Chobham Recreation ground next Tuesday kick-off 6.30pm. With such a busy April, who would have thought we'd have a blank Saturday. But we have, on Saturday 24 April when our scheduled home fixture versus Cobham is postponed due to the League allowing Worcester Park to play their last home game against Cobham. The Cobham game will now be played on Saturday 8th May.

Our Reserve game was one of the postponed games last week against Bookham Res, that's now rearranged for Tuesday 11 May.

touchline talk

with manager

This week is the start of a hectic programme with games coming thick and fast for both the 1st and reserves, however, no sooner had the revised fixture list been published, within a week it had changed, and although I accept that it must be a real headache for the CCL to arrange all the remaining fixtures during April and May, I strongly believe that some of this fixture congestion could be avoided if more mid week games were played in the early part of the season especially the clubs, including us without floodlights.

Of course no one can predict the weather and this year has been exceptionally wet and we are not without our problems because of the poor drainage of the pitch here at Redding Way, however, I feel the months of August and September could be utilised better before the clocks change in October.

The simple answer is for everyone to have floodlights then we would not be faced with such fixture congestion, but of course for some clubs in division one this is never going to happen due to ground sharing arrangements with other sports such a cricket, but you cannot always blame the clubs, it is for the CCL to make the appropriate arrangements to avoid such fixture congestion similarly to what we face now, after all, it is the CCL who accept the application of the clubs based on the facility they have to offer, therefore they should be more accommodating and understanding of the problem, but I'm sure if the CCL were questioned on this subject, they would argue that they are!!.

The other issue for clubs faced with these ridiculously early kick off's is whether they are able to field a side capable of doing the competition justice especially with players not being available because they have to finish work so early, compounded by problem of players having to travel, can sometimes leave the club with no choice other than to field a less than full strength side making a farce of the fixture.



Looking forward to the future hopefully the club will soon have lights installed which will limit such problems of the end of season fixture pile up, but Woking Borough Council have also got a big part to play by rectifying the poor drainage here at BCP. Every season we suffer the consequence of a wet winter no matter by how much or how little it rains, the drainage is no longer fit for purpose and is not getting any better and unless something is done soon, WBC will have an even bigger problem in the future and a bigger bill to pay to get it right!

We are lucky that we have one of the best facilities in the CCL, including the pitch (when it's dry) but last Saturday we played at Crescent over in Wallington, not the best place to go and play football perhaps, but credit where credit is due, the pitch was in very good playing condition despite all the rain we had the previous few days, which is more than can be said for BCP. I'm no grounds man, but for me it can only be about the ground maintenance and in my opinion SERCO who are responsible for the ground maintenance here, do not fulfil their contractual obligations compared with some other local grounds which will remain nameless.

It's no good having the best facility if it is not maintained properly or regularly, and no matter how much assistance the club offer to help get the pitch in good working order, we are just told it is not our responsibility. I know there are worse pitches than BCP, but this pitch will end up like many others unless WBC and SERCO get their acts together.

Enjoy today's game.

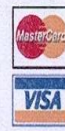

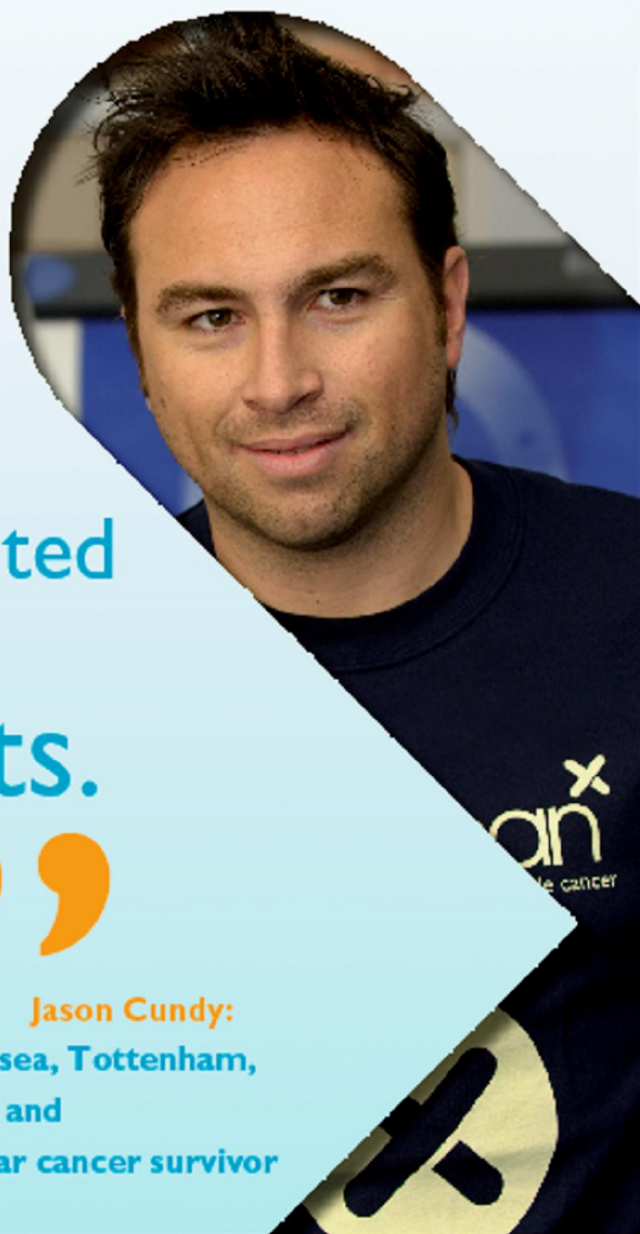

farnham town



Farnham Town was formed in 1906 through the merging of Farnham Bungs (the Farnham Brewery) and the Farnham Star. From this point they graduated through the ranks of the Surrey Senior status. From the Surrey Senior League the club progressed to the London Spartan League.

At the end of the 1979/80 season Farnham Town left the London Spartan League and applied to the Combined Counties League, their application was accepted and they finished 4th in their first season. The club then went on to finish runners-up in the Challenge Cup in the 1980/81 season, losing to Malden Town in the final.

In the same season the Reserves finished as runners-up to Ash United. Farnham Town then became runners-up to Guildford and Worplesdon in the 1983/84 Concours Cup and then again runners-up to BAE Weybridge in the 1988/89 season. The club did however salvage some success that season when they made it to the final and won the Challenge Shield against Ash United. The 1986/87 season saw Farnham take second place to Ash United in the league campaign. The glory days finally arrived in the 1990/91 season when the club won the league title.

The Town got a clean sweep of the major trophies by winning the Combined Counties Premier League, the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Dan Air Challenge Cup.

With expectations and excitement growing the club began plans for the Diadora League and were accepted for the following season but badly needed development money for necessary ground improvements but there was no money forthcoming and resulted in the club not having a league to play in for the 1992/93 season.

Many of the players who helped the club achieve their earlier success moved on to local neighbours, Aldershot Town who were instrumental in the Diadora Three Championship. If only Farnham Town had been able to continue with their good fortune at that time!

In 1993/94, with the Isthmian plans abandoned, Farnham Town were accepted back into the Combined Counties League. They won the Challenge Cup in the 1995/96 season after defeating Netherene 3-0 in the final.



Recent years has not see a repeat of the success, but the club is building again, looking to become a strong force in the league and adopting a programme of continuous improvement. Farnham Town stayed in the Combined Counties Premier Division until, due to ground regulations and lack of finance, were placed in Division One at the end of the 05/06 season.

Farnham Town Football Club was now in it's centenary year. The First season in Division One got off to a flying start with new manager Barry Bridger taking the team to a top-of-the-table finish against tough opponents Warlingham. But, due again to ground regulations The Town could not return to the Premier Division and sadly saw the team finishing second, Horsham Town, taking their place. Simon Bates was manager for the season 07/08 which saw a respectable 5th place finish and a good league cup run through to a semi final place.

Barry Bridger was re-appointed as manager for the 08/09 season and The Town finished 8th place in Division One.

the first time we met here

saturday 13th october 2007

combined counties league division one - knaphill 0 farnham town 0

Both Knaphill and Farnham Town produced an evenly matched Division 1 encounter at Redding Way on Saturday, and despite the goalless draw, both sides had their chances to pluck more than just the point apiece from the game.

With neither side able to take any real advantage in the opening spell, Knaphill's first threatening effort came after 23 minutes when Sam Barnett's pass found Matt Baker, whose shot veered past the far post. Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley, was to deny Farnham having a sniff at goal on several occasions throughout the match, the first of which was from Abery's effort on the half hour.

Continuing the first half on an even keel for both sides, Farnham had a shot just wide of the near post, and Shelley averted danger saving at the feet of Duff just before the break. Knaphill defender Michael Walters showed composure and awareness with the intent of starting a few promising moves on the left flank. But with plenty of openings scattering the first half, it was the final finish that failed to break the deadlock by halftime.

The second half showed a richer vein than the first as far as opportunities were concerned. In the first ten minutes, Knaphill set up three chances to forge a possible lead. Baker's through ball found Alex Hutton and his effort squirmed just wide of the keepers near post. Then Hutton was unlucky again when a curling shot was just inches from dipping into goal.

But the best opportunity fell to Baker, who after 54 minutes faced a one to one with the keeper with a defender on his heels, but a rather hurried shot, missed the target from 10 yards. An effort he would normally have buried in the back of the net.

Farnham were often looking dangerous on the break and they had another one of their chances in the 68th minute, but Shelley turned the shot smartly away for a corner. As the game swung back into the visitors half, it was the home side's turn to have another crack at goal, Hutton fired over from 12 yards, before play switched to the other end where Knaphill skipper Lee Crozier stopped Farnham snatching a possible lead, with a timely clearance close to the goal line.

In the final fifteen minutes, Shelley saved at the feet Chivers when it looked certain the Farnham striker would have scored, whilst other opportunities fell to Knaphill. A Baker effort was turned round for a corner, Neil Roissetter's header brushed the bar and over, and Hutton's shot from eight yards out, was parried away by Green in the visitors goal.

Although the game provided creativity and open football, it failed to find a striker that produced enough of the clinical finishing to produce a vital goal. So, a game that ended without any goals, and that's something that doesn't usually happen at Redding Way.



Most local derbies are fiery encounters and this one was no different. This was the first time both sides had met at senior level and the game was packed full of drama.

We found us ourselves 4-1 down after 45 minutes. However three goals in the second half from The Knappers with Orando Pike grabbing the equaliser in the 89th minute.

HOME OF THE KNAPPERS ON THE NET

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park. Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1. Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into their new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to be finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in their respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division. Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the club's history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division 4(North).

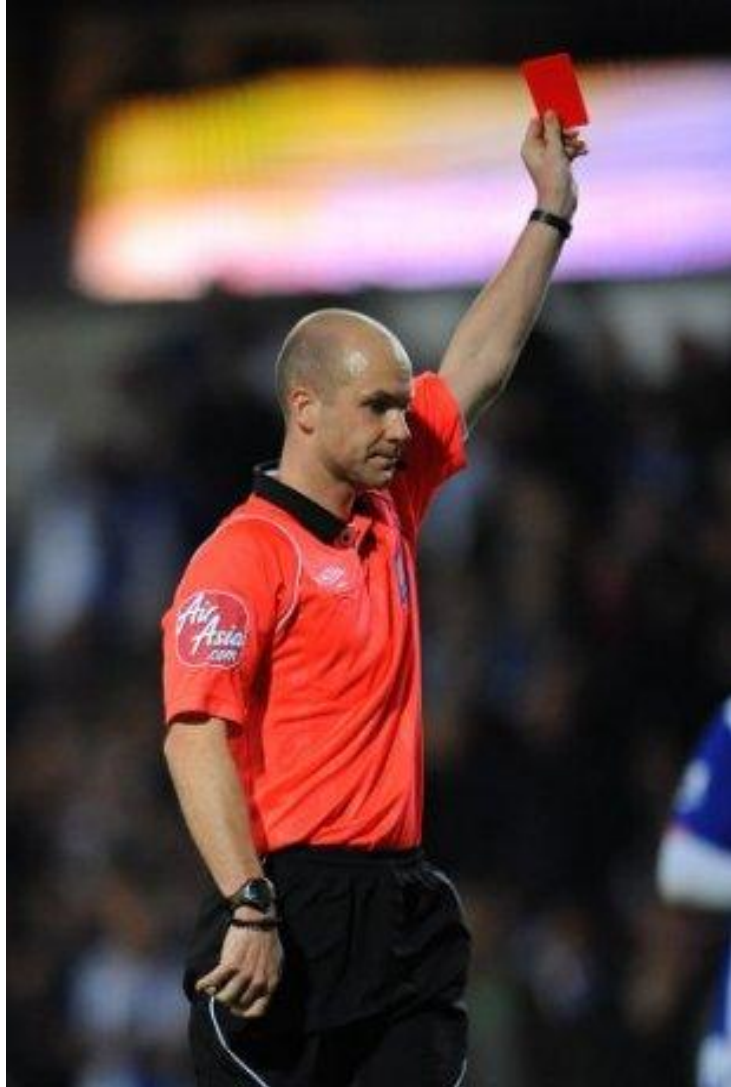
In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.

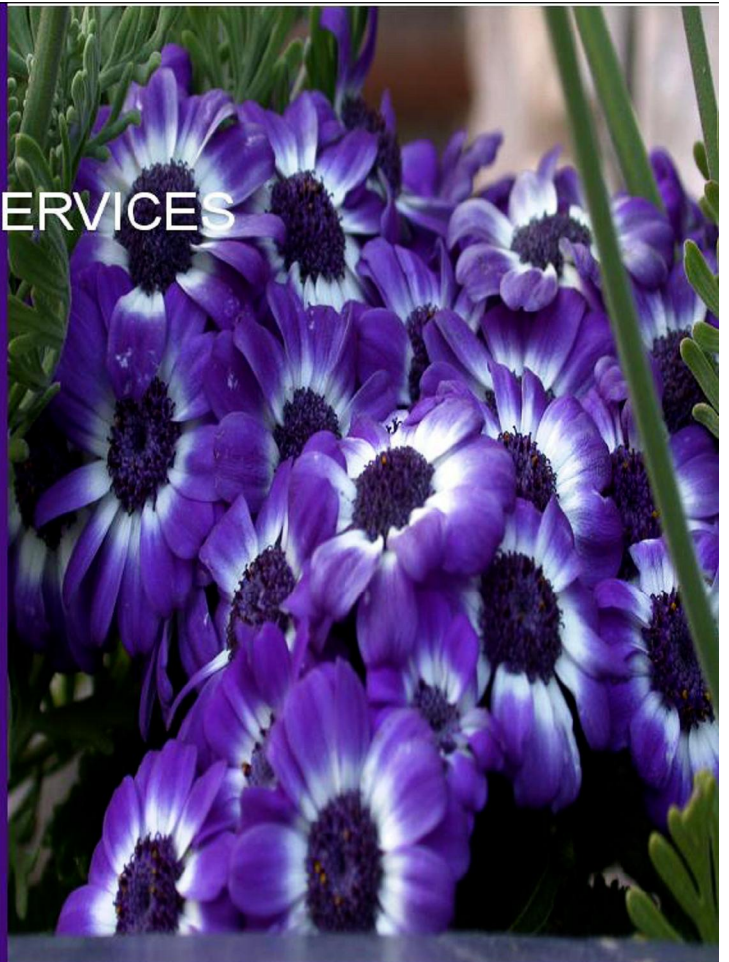

A very comprehensive win for Knaphill in a game they dominated for long periods, and although it was one way traffic in a goalless first half, three first class goals in the second, gave evidence of the visitors superior play to produce maximum points. It also produced their sixth clean sheet this year, and ninth overall, to make it their 9th successive league win.

The first half started with football at an accelerating pace from Knaphill, and within 90 seconds, Stephen Flinn's shot from 20 yards, was turned for a corner. Three minutes later, Dan Cox also had an effort pushed away for another corner, whilst skipper Nathan Miles strike clipped the post.

Richard Shelley's only real testing save in the first half, came after 11 minutes, although the odd breaks from the home side, were dealt with by the visitors defence. Plenty of pressure with chances created as Knaphill stayed in control, but were unable to make the breakthrough by the end of the first half.

The second half produced the goods, as Knaphill's attacking football and perseverance produced a five minute spell that saw a Nick Darnell header cleared off the line on 51 minutes, Chris Fox struck the post two minutes later, and the same player had a shot well saved by the keeper.

When Ian Savage was substituted after 54 minutes, he came off saying "I can't believe it's still 0-0". Not for much longer though, as Miles had an effort cleared off the line, Knaphill broke the deadlock after 63 minutes, when Fox delivered a cracking left footed volley from 25 yards to make it 1-0.

Two minutes later it was 2-0 as defender Gavin Brainch weaved his way into the 18yard box to neatly tuck the ball away into the far corner with a right footed finish, his fourth of the season. More quality came from the visitors when in the 76th minute, Ricky Hogsden supplied a pin point cross for Matt Baker to power a header firmly past the keeper for Knaphill's three goal lead.

Although with nearly fifteen minutes remaining, it was virtually mission accomplished, as Knaphill went looking to extend their lead with further opportunities.

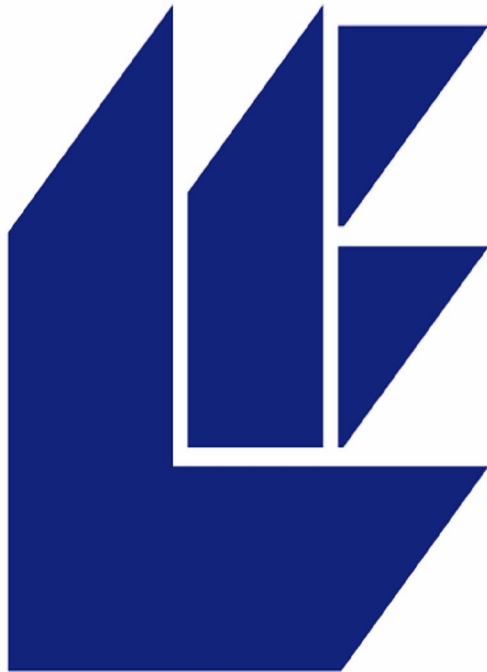

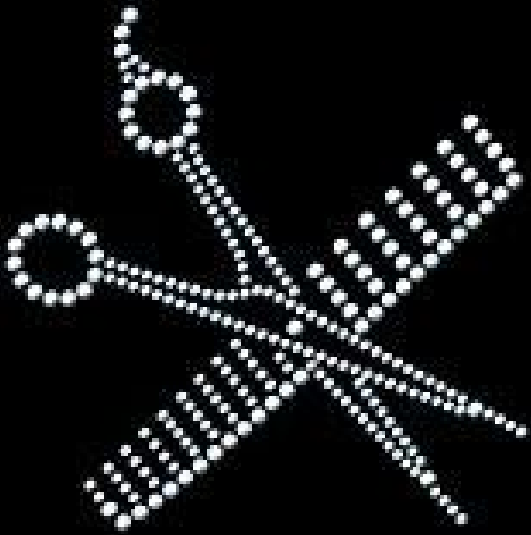
