# **Welcome to Redding Way**

Good morning everyone, and a very warm welcome to Redding Way to the players and officials, today's three match officials and all supporters for this first game of 2011, and a Happy New Year to you all.

Let's hope we finally get a game underway today as Knaphill have only played one match in eight weeks which was against Farnham Town on 27th November. It's proved a mixed bag of why the team haven't played on a number of Saturdays – two weekends without a scheduled fixture, a County Cup match for the Reserves which took preference over our first team game against Eversley, and two due to bad weather. The latest one to be hit by the weather was last Tuesday's away game at Westfield. So here we are beginning of January, only fifteen league games played, another twenty one to go!

The lone fixture of the past two months against Farnham was a performance that saw Knaphill suffer their biggest defeat since the Club started playing here five years ago. Two goals in the last fifteen minutes of the game was scant consolation on a day when we were trailing by six goals by the time those two were scored. We certainly needed more games after that result to put that game behind us and gain a better momentum in search of points.

Following that result, there were to be changes in personnel. As Manager Bob Pritchard and Assistant Simon Bates both departed from the Club. Several weeks before, players Gavin Brainch, Matt Baker and Alex Lumley had left Knaphill, but all three have now returned to the Club. A big boost to the side who have faced a lot of changes, positional and otherwise in the latter stages of 2010.



Now we have what will be a challenge for the new Managerial team of David Freeman and Adie Wilson who, since their appointment, are still awaiting their first game in charge. With the team having been without a game for the last five weeks, it will not only be the players raring to get a game today, but also Management! We wish David and Adie all the best and together with the team, have a successful second half of the season, and climb away from the lower regions of Division One over the forthcoming weeks. We have a current squad who are capable of doing this. Come on Knaphill, onwards and upwards!

Last season the meetings between Knaphill and Feltham ended in a win apiece, Knaphill winning 4-1 here at Redding Way, whilst Feltham won the return game 1-0. Feltham are a bit like ourselves, not having a very good run so far this season, and prior to the Christmas period were second from bottom with eight points from 17 games, whilst Knaphill have been lingering in 16th spot with twelve points from 15 games, unfortunately our lowest position in the league since joining the CCL in 2007.

The only Knaphill team to get a game in last month were our Youth U18s side, who lost to Winchester U18s in the Allied Counties League in mid-December. Their next game is against Binfield U18s this Wednesday at Hanworth Villa FC.

This Saturday, the first team are away to Farleigh Rovers, whilst the Reserves play their first game since the end of November, with a home fixture against Mole Valley Reserves. The next home game for Knaphill will be on Saturday 15th January when Bedfont Sports will be the visitors to Redding Way kick-off 2.00pm.

# Last Time We Met Here **Knaphill 4 Feltham 1**

Knaphill are getting back on track, as Saturday's result at Redding Way proved in the 4-1 win over Feltham. Whilst their away form has been more impressive this season, Knaphill's comfortable win against their opponents, produced maximum points for only the second time at home this season. But following the morale boosting win over Ascot United in midweek, the side rekindled some of the home form they are capable of with their performance against Feltham. Richard Shelley returned in goal following a recent shoulder injury, with new signing from Banstead, Stephen Greene, making his Knaphill debut.

There were several goal scoring opportunities for both sides in the first half hour, but it was Knaphill who made the all important breakthrough to establish a 1-0 lead, which led to Matt Baker's cross come shot deceiving the keeper as it glided into the net after 28 minutes. But it was Baker's second goal in the 37th minute that enhanced Knaphill's lead as he drove a terrific 25 yard strike pass the Feltham keeper to make it 2-0. It wasn't all one way though as the visitors battled away in their endeavours to pull a goal back before the end of the half.

In the second half, Knaphill went straight into top gear from the restart with pressure on the Feltham defence, continuing their commitment, looking lively and dangerous going forward. In the very first minute of the half, Ricky Hogsden hammered in an effort worthy of a goal, but saved by the keeper. Feltham had a goal scoring opportunity five minutes later, but direction and final touch saw it go wide of the far post...

Knaphill looked determined to increase their lead as they had two shots on goal denied, with Matt Edwards, then Hogsden seeing their efforts blocked. Then in the 55th minute, a neatly executed move saw Nathan Miles power towards goal, swung over a perfect cross which Edwards connected with to drive home for the third goal. Hogsden then had a chance from a Miles pass, but saw his shot sliced wide of the post.

Knaphill's commanding lead was added to after 61 minutes when Baker produced a fine strike for his hat-trick and Knaphill's fourth, to bring his tally to eleven this season. Feltham pulled one back after 78 minutes, by then the result was in no doubt with Knaphill finishing with three worthy league points.

# Club News

An update on the ground development from the clubs ground development manager Nick Croshaw.

Welcome to Redding Way for today's clash against Feltham, hopefully the weather has held off long enough to allow the game to go ahead! As the season has progressed the weather has decimated much of the league programme over the last few weeks. This means that our postponed home games would normally have to wait until the lighter evenings in April & May. However we will be in a much better situation once the lights are installed as we can then re-arrange our games mid-week.

Woking Borough Council has now instructed the contractors to begin the process of arranging for the installation of the floodlights and grandstand. However due to poor weather in December the base for the stand will be laid by the Council during January with the stand being delivered soon after the base is completed. This also means a slight delay with the floodlights which will be installed late January/early February (weather permitting) and everything should be in place before the end of February. The next project will be to complete a hardstand walkway all the way around the pitch. Once all of these projects are completed we will have a ground to be proud of.

I have also been informed by WBC that the plans for the new access road and additional car parking will be submitted to the Planning Committee in February. This new access road will alleviate the need for any-one to drive through the residential area of Strathcona Gardens as this will be blocked off at the Current entrance. This new development will not only enhance the look of the country park, but allow much more use of the facility by local residents and users of the football ground alike. We as a club support all the additional benefits being added to the Country Park as we believe that Knaphill needs this excellent open space and sports facility.

The introduction of the floodlights will mean a release from the constrictions of playing Saturday games only and allow the club to be eligible for the FA Cup, Vase & Youth Cups in the future. We aim to limit the number of scheduled games played to the minimum, but we will be forced to play County Cup matches and re-arranged games under lights, especially if we continue to be beset with the poor weather over the winter months as we have been for the past couple of years. The idea of a winter break in the football season has long been discussed, but from our perspective the Boxing Day and New Years Day games are usually the best attended home games of the season which bring in much needed income.

Starting today, let's hope that the season gets back on track and that Knaphill can re-group behind the new management team of David Freeman, Adie Wilson & Neil Woodyer and make a good fist of the rest of the season.

# Welcome Feltham FC



Feltham Football Club was founded in 1946 as Tudor Park and competed under that name until the end of season 1962/63 when the name Feltham was adopted upon being granted Senior Status by the Middlesex County Football Association. Tudor Park played at Rectory Meadow in Hanworth, and also at the Remo Depot in Feltham, whilst Feltham FC played on the surrounding Glebelands playing fields before moving into its former home of Feltham Sports Arena in 1963.

A merger with Hounslow of the Southern League happened in 1990 and the side competed under the name of Feltham and Hounslow Borough until the end of the 1994/95 season when it was decided to change the name back to Feltham FC.

For their first three seasons, Tudor Park were members of the West Middlesex Sunday Football League but in 1949/50 became affiliated to the Middlesex County Football Association and played Saturday football under the County's jurisdiction as members of the Staines and District League and in turn was elected to the Parthenon League.

In 1963/64 Feltham had their first taste of senior football in the Surrey Senior League in which they had a successful five-season spell. 1968/69 saw the club replace Petter's Sports in the Spartan League. At the end of the 1972/73 Season they were promoted to the Second Division of the Athenian League.

In 1977, Feltham, along with fifteen other member clubs of the Athenian League, resigned to join the newly-formed Second Division of the Isthmian League. It was from here that the club was promoted to the First Division in 1980/81 after securing maximum points in the very last game of the season at Barton Rovers, thereby winning the Second Division title. The 1982/83 season saw Feltham being the first team outside of the Football League to play their league fixtures on an Artificial Pitch.

In 1983/84, Feltham dropped back into Division Two South of the Isthmian League and in turn, they transferred to Division 3 in 1992 after the league had been restructured. The club stayed in the league until 1995, when due to new league rulings about ground grading, they were forced to resign. Feltham then joined the Combined Counties Football League in season 1995/96. Season 1996/97 saw Feltham defeat Godalming & Guildford 5-1 in the League Cup Final.

Season 2002/03 saw Feltham lift the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup after beating Northwood 2-0 in the Final. The Blues completed a cup double that season by defeating Hendon in the Final of the Middlesex Super Cup (The George Ruffell Memorial Trophy).

At the end of Season 2005/06 despite other clubs resigning, Feltham was relegated into Division One of the Combined Counties League. Their first season saw them finish in 9th place, whilst in season 2007/08, Feltham finished in a mid-table position. 2008/09 saw an improved second half of the season in which the Blues finished 7th.

Season 2009/10 saw the side unsettled by management changes, and resulted in the club finishing 20th. However, the Reserve squad lifted the club's first piece of silverware in 7 years – the Jeff Nardin Reserve Division Cup.

Feltham was forced to move out of their Feltham Sports Arena ground due to constant vandalism and have spent the last few seasons ground sharing with local neighbours. Firstly Egham Town, then Hampton & Richmond Borough. Feltham are currently ground -sharing with Bedfont Town at The Orchard, home of former local club Bedfont.

Feltham were given permission by The London Borough of Hounslow to redevelop Feltham Sports Arena which will eventually allow the club to build its own ground for its teams. Work is ongoing and the club hopes to be back there in the near future.

# THE STORY SO FAR... HISTORY OF THE KNAPPERS

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's

Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.


Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team. In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over. Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves. The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.

2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.



Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels.

With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

The 2009/10 season saw the team finish third in Division One, their best placing in the three seasons in the Combined Counties League. The previous two seasons the Club finished in seventh and fifth positions.

Third would normally have gained the Club promotion, but due to the proposed floodlights installation being delayed, Knaphill have to make another challenge for promotion in 2010/11. The team won 26 out of their 40 league games, losing 10 with 4 drawn, scoring 98 goals and finishing with 82 points. Season 2010/11 is the first for a Youth team at the Club, with Knaphill Youth U.18's playing in the Allied Counties League.




