Good afternoon everyone, and welcome to the players and officials from Feltham, and our three match officials for this afternoon's match at Redding Way. The meetings between the two Clubs last season ended in a 3-1 win at home for Knaphill, scorers Cox, Baker and Wills, whilst we shared the points in the 2-2 draw in the away match with Baker scoring both goals.

Already a month of the new season is behind us, and for several clubs, including Knaphill, a slightly unbalanced ratio of results to date. Feltham suffered their first defeat of the season last Saturday, after winning the first three games, when they lost 2-0 at home to Westfield, but bounced back in the 3-0 win away at South Kilburn on Monday. Knaphill have unfortunately not fared quite so well during August, gaining just six points from six matches and in 11th place in Division One. This time last season, Knaphill had gained seven points from seven games played during August.

Our last two League games have seen contrasting fortunes. Last Saturday away to Farleigh Rovers produced a comfortable 4-1 win, but was followed by a 2-0 defeat by Eversley on Monday. Woody Cardona scored the first goal against Farleigh with a header after 15 minutes, but the second goal did not come until five minutes into the second half, again Cardona the scorer, before Farleigh netted a soft goal to reduce the deficit. The two goal margin was restored in the 58th minute through Chris Fox, and after 66 minutes, Marcus Slimane made it 4-1. Skipper Craig Woodley received a knee injury halfway through the first half, which put him out of Monday's game against Eversley and today's game with Feltham.

Hopes of back to back wins, evaporated on Monday with the visit of Eversley to Redding Way when a goal in each half gave the visitors a 2-0 win. But again, just like the recent Hartley Wintney game, Knaphill should have got at least a point out of the encounter. In the second half, Knaphill had a penalty, but Ricky Hogsden struck the post with the spot kick, Matt Squires skied over the bar when it appeared easier to score, and Lee Gamble was unlucky as he hammered the ball into the net, only to be adjudged offside. However, let's hope the League programme this month can reap some winning results and valuable to points, still plenty to play for - another 28 league games! Match report of the Eversley game is elsewhere in the programme.

Looking ahead now, and the big one for Knaphill Football Club next Saturday 10th September when the Club make their first ever appearance in the FA Vase. Again, this is another step of progression for Knaphill and the 1st Qualifying round tie against Horley Town will we hope, attract a good crowd here at Redding Way. Last Saturday Horley drew 1-1 at home to Banstead and won 6-1 away at Colliers Wood on Monday which put them in second place in the Premier Division. We look forward to our first FA Vase game.

Meanwhile, enjoy today's game.....

match report



Saturday August 27 2011 Farleigh Rovers 1 Knaphill 4 Combined Counties League Division One

Following the midweek match against Hartley Wintney, Knaphill enhanced on their recent improved form with a comfortable and decisive performance in the 4-1 win against Farleigh Rovers on Saturday. Two changes were made from the midweek game, with Chris Fox back in the starting line-up, and Matt Burton making his debut in goal for the unavailable Richard Shelley.

Knaphill made their mark after just five minutes when Marcus Slimane delivered a cross field pass to Lee Gamble, who then delivered the ball into the 18 yard box where Woody Cardona planted a header past the keeper to make it 1-0 from fifteen yards. Farleigh's Doherty forced Burton into a save in the 11th minute, with the Knaphill keeper having a confident debut for his new club.

After 14 minutes it was Cardona who went close to a second for Knaphill, but the keeper turned the effort away for a corner. The closest Farleigh came to scoring was in the 21st minute of the half when they struck the bar. Knaphill skipper Craig Woodley received a knee injury and was replaced after 24 minutes by substitute Adam Watts making his debut for the visitors.

Within a few minutes of coming on, Watts had an effort cleared off the line as Knaphill pushed forward in search of a second goal. After 34 minutes, Cardona had a shot saved by the legs of the keeper, then Ricky Hogsden shot wide from a Fox cross, and another effort was denied by the keeper close on halftime.

The second half soon settled down to the same pattern as the first with Knaphill increasing their lead within five minutes of the start, when Cardona latched onto a pass from Slimane to strike home his and Knaphill's second goal. Knaphill conceded a soft goal when Farleigh's Prendergast reduced the arrears from close range, then a header that was just over the bar, before Knaphill strengthened their lead and commanding role after 58 minutes, Chris Fox heading home from Lumley's cross to make it 3-1.

It was 4-1 after 66 minutes as Hogsden became provider and Slimane the executioner for Knaphill's fourth. The visitors could have had at least three more goals but for hasty efforts that sailed over the bar. But overall, a good team performance by Knaphill and a definite boost as they move up three places in the table with this result.

touchline talk

with joint manager david freeman



Despite our win last Saturday against Farleigh Rovers we failed to build on that victory against Eversley on Bank Holiday Monday. I challenge the players before the game to go and do something we have failed to do so far this season as that's back to back wins and then to try and go on an unbeaten run. I told the players that we need to start keeping clean sheets which we should use as a platform if we are going to make this season a success because we cannot go into games hoping to score two, three or four goals to win, its not possible.

The players have been reminded it does not matter what you do in the middle of the pitch, its what you do in your penalty box and at the other end and first and foremost we have got to start to defend our area better.

A lot of people have said we have had a tough start which is true but if you want to be serious contenders for the title and promotion then we have to beat or at least not lose our rivals . I have also heard a number of people say we are nearly there, well we are not, results have shown that and it is no secret that both Adie and I are determined to turn our fortunes around and if that means bringing in fresh faces then that's what we will do. It's frightening sometimes when you look at our squad of players on paper and I would say most of our squad would get into most sides in this league if not higher but at the moment the lads are not quite fulfilling their potential which is a shame as they are a decent set of players who on their day will beat any team in this league.

With regard to our recent results I felt that the Farleigh game we did more then enough to win the game despite having a dodgy period in the second half when our hosts pulled a goal back when we were 2-0 up. However, luck for once was on our side and we then went onto add a further two goals and should have had a t least another three to the total.

But the Eversley game I think we were the architects of their own downfall. I thought we started well, created chances and picked up from where we had left off against Farleigh but our weaknesses were exposed as they have been on a number of occasions this season and it's up to us to address that both on and off the field because teams go nowhere unless they keep clean sheets, we can defend better and we have to.

We also had a great opportunity to get ourselves back into the game but for once the ever reliable Ricky Hogsden missed a penalty and despite having two further clear cut chances to get something from the game we came away with nothing.

Our games continue to be tough and I don't see any team in this league as 'easy'. Today we welcome Feltham to Redding Way. Our visitors have a decent start to the campaign and their only bleep so far being a 2-0 defeat to our local rivals Westfield. Since our arrival in the Combined Counties Feltham have always been tough opponents and I expect today's encounter to be no different.

Off the pitch both Adie and I are pleased to welcome back to the club Neil 'Bobby' Woodyer as first team coach. Some of you will remember Neil was coach last season here before he decided the grass was greener on the other side and departed for Farnborough. Well 'Bobby' is back partly because his banter at Boro was that poor that the Farnborough chairman banned him from the clubhouse and we felt sorry for him and allowed him to come back!

On a serious note Neil is a good coach and hopefully he will help turn our fortunes around and get us to where we want to be.

Lastly please remember we host Horley Town here next Saturday in the FA Vase. This is the first time the club have entered the competition and we are asking all supporters to bring friends and family to help cheer the team on as we set off on the road to Wembley. This is without doubt the biggest game in the club's proud history so please show your support on the day.

Combined Counties League Division One



After their 4-1 win over Farleigh Rovers on Saturday, Knaphill's Bank Holiday Monday match against Eversley at Redding Way produced a disappointing result for the home side when a goal in each half for the visitors gave them maximum points in their 2-0 win. But two of the best opportunities in the second half, could have rescued at least a point for Knaphill, who also had a goal ruled out for an offside.

Fairly even share of the play for both teams in the opening stage of the first half, but it was Eversley who took the early initiative by opening the scoring in the 16th minute through Liam Fisher. Knaphill were unable to offer a great deal in the first half as far as scoring opportunities were concerned.

Ricky Hogsden had one effort turned away for a corner, and Joe Turner fired wide of the post. Former Knaphill player Matt Baker tested Matt Burton after forty minutes, but the keeper saved well, and denied Eversley another chance just before halftime.

Knaphill showed more creativity with more chances and opportunities to pull level which started to show in the early stages of the second half. But before that, Burton denied Eversley when saving Baker's free kick three minutes into the half, then in the 51st minute it was Knaphill's opportunity when Turner had his shot partially saved by Rastall, but Matt Squires had a good chance to follow up and hammer home, but scooped well over from close range.

Two minutes later, Woody Cardona delivered a pass into the path of Lee Gamble who hammered his shot into goal, but the effort was ruled offside. Just as Knaphill were working for an equaliser, Eversley increased their lead when Baker made it 2-0 after 55 minutes. Knaphill's Chris Fox had a header wide in the 67th minute, then three minutes later Eversley went close to a third with an effort just over the bar.

A chance for Knaphill to reduce the arrears came after 77 minutes when they were awarded a penalty after a hand ball in the box. But from the resultant spot kick, Hogsden struck the foot of the post. Opportunities had come and gone and so too did any chance of a point, as in the end Eversley did sufficient to take all three. Knaphill now look ahead to this Saturday and another home game when Feltham will be the visitors to Redding Way.

Feltham Football Club was founded in 1946 as Tudor Park and competed under that name until the end of season 1962/63 when the name Feltham was adopted upon being granted Senior Status by the Middlesex County Football Association. Tudor Park played at Rectory Meadow in Hanworth, and also at the Remo Depot in Feltham, whilst Feltham FC played on the Glebelands playing fields before moving into its former home of Feltham Sports Arena in 1963. The Arena's grandstand was opened in 1966 by former club President and Mayor of Hounslow, Edward Pauling JP.

In 1990, Feltham merged with local Southern League side Hounslow and the side competed under the name of Feltham and Hounslow Borough until the end of the 1994/95 season when it was decided to change the name back to Feltham FC.

For their first three seasons, Tudor Park were members of the West Middlesex Sunday Football League but in 1949/50 became affiliated to the Middlesex County Football Association and played Saturday football under the County's jurisdiction as members of the Staines and District League and in turn were elected to the Parthenon League.

Feltham had their first taste of senior soccer from 1963/64 in the Surrey Senior League in which they had a successful five-season spell. 1968/69 saw the club replace Petter's Sports in the Spartan League. At the end of the 1972/73 Season they were promoted to the Second Division of the Athenian League after finishing third.

In 1977, Feltham, along with fifteen other member clubs of the Athenian League resigned to join the newly-formed Second Division of the Isthmian League. It was from here that the club was promoted to the First Division in 1980/81 after securing maximum points in the very last game of the season at Barton Rovers, thereby winning the Second Division title. The 1982/83 season saw Feltham being the first team outside of the Football League to play their league fixtures on an Artificial Pitch.

In 1983/84, Feltham dropped back into Division Two South of the Isthmian League and in turn, they transferred to Division 3 in 1992 after the league was again restructured. The club stayed in this division until 1995, when due to new league rulings about ground grading, they were forced to resign.

Feltham joined the Combined Counties Football League for the commencement of season 1995/96.

Season 1996/97 saw Feltham defeat Godalming & Guildford 5-1 in the League Cup Final.

Season 2002/03 saw Feltham lift the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup after beating Northwood 2-0 in the Final. The Blues completed a cup double that season by defeating Hendon in the Final of the Middlesex Super Cup (The George Ruffell Memorial Trophy).

At the end of Season 2005/06 despite other clubs resigning, Feltham were relegated into Division One of the Combined Counties League. Their first season saw them finish in 9th place. Recent seasons have seen the club finish in mid to low positions and 2009/10 saw the side unsettled by management changes, and resulted in the club finishing 20th – just avoiding relegation. Fortunes were of a similar keel last season, which resulted in the club finishing in sixteenth place.

Season 2009/10 saw the Reserve team lift the club's first piece of silverware in 7 years – the Jeff Nardin Reserve Division Cup.

Feltham was forced to move out of their Feltham Sports Arena ground due to constant vandalism and have spent the last few seasons ground sharing with local neighbours. Firstly Egham Town, then Hampton & Richmond Borough. Feltham are currently ground-sharing with Bedfont Town at The Orchard, home of former local club Bedfont.

Season 2011/12 sees Wayne Tisson at the helm, with Steve Potter as his assistant. The Division 1 structure now includes Guernsey FC which will see Feltham play their first away 'international' in a number of years. Feltham have been given permission by The London Borough of Hounslow to redevelop Feltham Sports Arena which will eventually allow the club to build its own ground for its teams. Work is ongoing and the club hopes to be back there in the future.

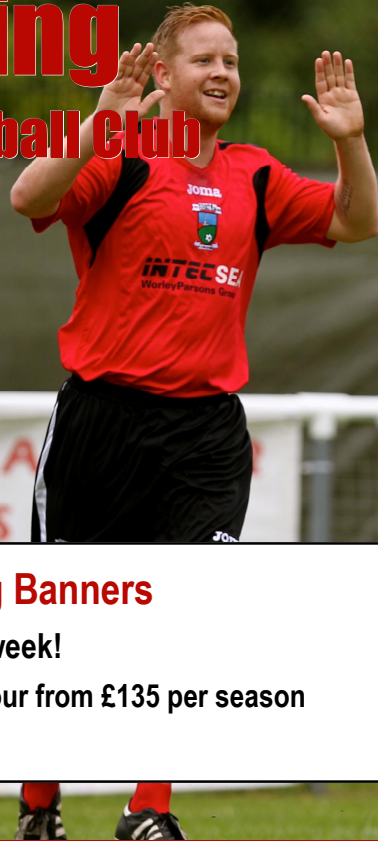
