# KICK-OFF

with Bryan Freeman



#### **Welcome to Redding Way**

Good afternoon everyone and a welcome to Redding to the players, officials and supporters from Frimley Green. Our last meeting with today's opponents was at the end of January when Knaphill won the away encounter 4-0 with goals from Fox, Turner, Hogsden, and Baker. Last Saturday Frimley Green, whose league position is 15th, had a 2-1 win at home to Chobham, and now have 32 points from 30 games. Following the 2-2 draw away to Feltham last week Knaphill are now on 42 points from 27 games.

Today sees the start of a busy month of fixtures, eight in total during April, with five at home and three away. Our first league game under floodlights is one of those five games and takes place next Tuesday against Eversley kick-off 7.30pm. The first benefit for that fixture will be not having a 6.15 kick-off!

Our last home game here at Redding Way two weeks ago saw us drop a couple of points in the 2-2 draw with CB Hounslow. Despite taking the lead in the second minute through Gavin Brainch, and enhancing that with another goal from Ricky Hogsden, the lead looked comfortable. But the visitors struck back to make it 2-1, then an equalising goal in the second half for a share of the points.

In last Saturday's match against Feltham, the scoring procedure was reversed Knaphill were hit with a goal from the home side in the third minute, and a second after fifteen minutes. Matt Baker then scored two goals, both in the first half, and with a goalless second period, the end result meant a second successive week with a 2 -2 draw, and with just the two points gained in those matches, we stayed in tenth spot in the table. The result stretched our unbeaten run to twelve matches. Match reports on our last two games, plus news on the Reserves and Youth teams, are elsewhere in this programme.

There were a couple of surprise results in Division One last week, Sheerwater's 2-1 win over Eversley, and Worcester Park's 7-1 hammering of Warlingham. Worcester Park are on their way to 100 league goals this season with nine games remaining, having boosted their total to 92 on Saturday. Currently the second highest goalscorers in Division One are South Park with 89 goals. The two top goalscoring teams were due to meet in a League fixture on Wednesday night.

Our Reserves, having beaten CB Hounslow Reserves 4-1 three weeks ago, then had a week without a fixture, before playing Westfield at home last weekend. But for Manager Andy Martin and the team it was a disappointing performance and result, losing 2-0 to their local rivals. Today they face a tough game when they visit leaders Mole Valley Reserves, the first of eight remaining matches.

Meanwhile, getting back to the latest addition to our facilities here at Redding Way – the Floodlights. It's certainly was great news when the installation was finished and tested last week and we could look forward to midweek April fixtures and the first week in May to be played under lights. Forthcoming games at Redding Way in the next couple of weeks will be the visit from Eversley next Tuesday 5 April, kick-off 7.30pm, followed by Bedfont Sports here next Saturday 9 April kick-off 3pm and Chobham will be the visitors on Tuesday 12 April kick off 7.30pm.

For now though, we focus on this afternoon's fixture for which Knaphill will be looking to gain maximum points and another step up the league table.

Following my last programme notes we are still remain unbeaten which is now twelve games, nine of them wins however, our last two games have seen us draw games we should of really won. Firstly the last time we were at Redding Way we drew 2-2 with CB Hounslow Utd, a team we beat 3-0 only ten days before in a comfortable win. Things started so well for us as Gavin Brainch opened the scoring after only two minutes and Ricky Hogsden added a second on the half hour mark and we should of really kick on from there however, and although I did say to the players before the game that we cannot get complacent, we did exactly that and allowed our visitors back into the game with a sloppy goal and they drew level with a well taken goal late on. Despite all our efforts we could not find the winner and in the end we had to settle for a share of the spoils.

Last Saturday we faced an improved Feltham side and we got off to the worst possible start and although we were not helped on the day by the poor officials, the two goals we gave away were down to poor team play from us. Sav was a character here and is certainly helped raise the profile of this club.

Today we welcome Scotty Tarr and his players to Redding Way. The last time Frimley were here they ran out 3-1 winners last season but hopefully that scoreline will not be recorded in there favour this afternoon!. We met Frimley at the end of January this year and ran out in the end comfortable 4-0 winners however, after half an hour you would not of predicted that scoreline as Scott Tarr's side started the brightest and had a couple of opportunities to open the scoring. But goals from Chris Fox, Joe Turner, Matt Baker and Ricky Hogsden saw us pick up a decent three points.

There is still an outside chance of promotion providing we win all out remaining games but we really need favours from other clubs even though it will be a tall order to achieve this but the next best thing is too remain unbeaten for the rest of the season, something I believe we are capable of doing.

A very comprehensive win for Knaphill in a game they dominated for long periods, and although it was one way traffic in agoalless first half, three first class goals in the second, gave evidence of the visitors superior play to produce maximum points. It also produced their sixth clean sheet this year, and ninth overall, to make it their 9th successive league win.

The first half started with football at an accelerating pace from Knaphill, and within 90 seconds, Stephen Flinn's shot from 20 yards, was turned for a corner. Three minutes later, Dan Cox also had an effort pushed away for another corner, whilst skipper Nathan Miles clipped the post.

Richard Shelley's only real testing save in the first half, came after 11 minutes, although the odd breaks from the home side, were dealt with by the visitors defence. Plenty of pressure with chances created as Knaphill stayed in control, but were unable to make the breakthrough by the end of the first half.

The second half produced the goods, as Knaphill's attacking football and perseverance produced a five minute spell that saw a Nick Darnell header cleared off the line on 51


minutes, Chris Fox struck the post two minutes later, and the same player had a shot well saved by the keeper.



When Ian Savage was substituted after 54 minutes, he came off saying "I can't believe it's still 0-0". Not for much longer though, as Miles had an effort cleared off the line, Knaphill broke the deadlock after 63 minutes, when Fox delivered a cracking volley from 25 yards to make it 1-0.

Two minutes later it was 2-0 as defender Gavin Brainch weaved his way into the 18yard box to neatly tuck the ball away into the far corner, his fourth of the season. More quality came from the visitors when in the 76th minute Ricky Hogsden supplied a pin point cross for Matt Baker to plant a header firmly past the keeper for Knaphill's three goal lead.

Although with nearly fifteen minutes remaining, it was virtually mission accomplished, as Knaphill were looking to extend their lead with further opportunities.





#### WELCOMING

## FRIMLEY GREEN F.C



The club was founded in 1919 and currently play at Frimley Green Recreation Ground.

The present clubhouse was erected in 1972 when 'The Green' played in the London Spartan League and used a pitch on the lower part of the park with the changing rooms where the car park now is. A few years later a new pitch was laid adjacent to the clubhouse and changing rooms were added. The Reserve Team joined the Combined Counties League in 1979 and at the start of the 1981/82 season the First Team switched across and Floodlights were installed for the first time. The Club competed in the League for a period of 15 years, during which time they won the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Reserves won the Division One Challenge Cup.

Due to the financial situation in 1994 the club voluntarily dropped down into junior football. They were Runners-up in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in their first season but were denied promotion into the Surrey Premier League. The next four seasons saw a period of rebuilding and repaying debts and the club were finally accepted into the Surrey Premier League in 1999, after finishing Runners-up and winning the League Cup. Off the field new Floodlights were installed and a Boardroom created within the Clubhouse.

A three year spell followed, in the renamed Surrey Senior League, which saw the club finish fourth, sixth and Runners –up and attain promotion back into the Combined Counties League where they have played since. Season 2004-05 was the most successful to date, in the Combined Counties League, with the club finishing in 15<sup>th</sup> Place and amassing 58 points.

Season 2005-06 was very disappointing on the playing front but we managed to avoid finishing in a relegation position, however, despite substantial ground improvements we were demoted on 'ground grading', to make way for 7 clubs from the old Ryman Division two. In the past 4 seasons in Division One we have had mixed fortunes, finishing 6th at the end of season 2007/08 but then in season 2008/09 finished 3rd from bottom but had our most successful season ever in the FA Vase, reaching the third round and won an FA Cup match for the first time. Last season we managed to finish high enough up the table to retain our place in the FA Cup this season. We are also in the FA Vase as a Senior Club but, because of our Division One status, we are viewed as an 'Intermediate Club' by the Surrey County FA and will play in the Surrey County Premier Cup.

#### **Complacent Knappers!**

When these two teams met, which was only ten days prior to this game, Knaphill ran out comfortable 3-0 winners, but the return fixture at Redding Way did not produce such a convincing result for the home side who, after squandering a two goal lead, allowed CB Hounslow to a share of the spoils in this 2-2 draw.

Knaphill got off to a flying start to take the lead in the 2nd minute when Gavin Brainch drove in a cracking effort, as the home side went on to show plenty of possession and pressure in the opening period. Defender Jack Williams homed in on goal only see his shot palmed away by the keeper after 12 minutes, and then an opportunity fell to Ricky Hogsden whose effort went straight at the keeper.

But despite the opportunities, Knaphill had to wait until the 28th minute to enhance on their lead when Hogsden made it 2-0. Healthy enough lead, but then after 37 minutes, Richard Shelley's weak clearance went straight to Johnson for what was a gift wrapped goal to put the visitors back in the game.

The start of the second half almost went the same way as the first when Joe Turner's shot, despite lacking any venom, came back off the post. It was to be the closest they came to adding another goal in the half. The visitors could have been level but for a couple of fine saves by Shelley to deny a side who were quick on the break.

Knaphill were often found to be giving the ball away in a half that was lacking a cutting edge, although there were a number of chances, but no end product. Early in the half Baker had a header over the bar, and later Chris Fox's header flashed wide of the post. CB Hounslow battled away, and in the 78th minute creating an opening that counted as Akar took his chance well to steer his shot past Shelley into the far corner.

Both sides continued to have chances with Fox going the closest for Knaphill, but his quick flick went just wide of the post. All even at the end, but it was not so much a point gained, but two lost for Knaphill, although the result did increase their unbeaten run of games to eleven.

James Wills, who rejoined Knaphill on the 5<sup>th</sup> November last year after starting the 2010/11 season with Sandhurst Town, has been part of a team that since January this year has brought a complete transformation of results from a good blend of players and new management team. James had been with Knaphill for just three weeks up to the end of November when the Club were struggling, producing just three wins in the first fifteen games. James, an IT Sales Accounts Manager has been involved with playing football for around sixteen years.

This week we spoke to James about his footballing background from when he first became involved until the present day. James, born on 26 July 1984, first started playing football when he was 10 years old for Crookham Rovers. He was with them through the age groups up to the Under 15s, and had a lot of encouragement for playing football from his Dad over the early years.

James had, in his earlier years with Crookham, played in two Cup finals, winning one, but losing the other. It did appear a big jump from Aldershot Boys team to Sandhurst Town, but James settled in well at the higher level and said that fitness was a major key which made players stronger as they strengthened their game.

Following the spell at Sandhurst, James was at University in Chichester for three years, and in season 2002/03 played a season for Havant and Waterlooville, and then for Chichester City of the Sussex County League for two years. Leaving there in 2005, James moved to Fleet Town playing first team football, and went onto play for Midhurst also in the Sussex County League.

After James had played for several clubs, there was another move which took him to back to the CCL and Hartley Wintney. His travels were to see a couple more moves. From Hartley Wintney to Knaphill last season, and finally, this season which began with Sandhurst, and will finish with Knaphill, as James continues to be a first team regular at Redding Way. Outside football, James other sporting interests are Badminton and Sailing, whilst other interests are keeping fit and socialising.

#### **Battling Spirit**

For the second successive week, Knaphill had to settle for a share of the points, but although it's slowed down their steady rise up the league table, they have now stretched their unbeaten run to twelve matches. The previous week Knaphill led by two goals before conceding two, whilst against Feltham on Saturday, they trailed 2-0 before two goals from Matt Baker levelled the score at 2-2, with all four goals coming in the first half.

Knaphill suffered an early setback when in the third minute the visitors failed to clear their lines and were punished when Feltham's Chase tapped home from six yards. Then after fifteen minutes, Knaphill found themselves trailing 2-0, creating a harder task to get their grip on the game. But it was not long before they reduced the arrears when skipper Matt Baker took his chance well to make it 2-1 after 17 minutes.

The visitors defence then had a narrow escape when Feltham went close to a third, but Jack Williams was able to clear danger at the near post. Baker was not too far off target for Knaphill before he completed a good build up to the equalising goal in the 36th minute. Joe Turner threaded a pass through to Ed Cardona who in turn passed for Baker to hook the ball home from eight yards.

After their first half comeback, Knaphill needed to move up that extra gear and pressurise the home defence more in the second half. But despite creating opportunities, the final finish lacked penetration towards seeking a third goal to edge them in front. Feltham also were finding a similar problem, and at times play from both sides became a bit scrappy.

Knaphill went close in the 80th minute for what could have been the winner, when Ricky Hogsden's pass found substitute Chris Fox whose effort hit the post. Neither side were able to make any telling impact as the half entered the last ten minutes, and whilst aircraft were continually taking off over the ground from Heathrow, neither side could find a flight path through to increase the scoreline in a goalless second half.

Knaphill will no doubt be seeking to get back on the winning track when they play hosts to Frimley Green at Redding Way on Saturday, the first of eight games in April.


