all the news from redding way

Good afternoon everyone and a Happy New Year to you all. We welcome Frimley Green players and officials, and the three match officials to Redding Way today for the first home game of 2012. Last season when we played Frimley Green, Knaphill put ten goals past them in the two meetings, winning 4-0 at their place and an incredible scoreline of 6-4 at Redding Way. This season the game at Frimley Green saw the home side, bottom the table at the time, hammer Knaphill 5-2. Quite a contrast!

Now well into the second half of the season, we will be looking at the next three months to be gaining valuable points in a steady climb up the League ladder. We finished 2011 on a losing note in the Christmas holiday local derby fixture at home to Westfield, a meeting we usually manage to secure all three points against. But despite taking the lead with a penalty early in the first half through Luke Craig, our visitors came back in the second half with two goals to secure the points with a 2-1 win.

However, 2012 started with a well earned three points away to Eversley on Bank holiday Monday. Third place Eversley, who the previous week had lost 4-0 at Hartley Wintney, found themselves with back to back defeats. Knaphill took a two goal lead with just eight minutes gone. A misjudged clearance by former Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley allowed Michael Pym to tap in the easiest goal he'll ever score as the ball rolled towards an empty goal to make it 1-0 in the 4th minute. Four minutes later Billy Jones, pictured making his debut rifled home the second goal from just outside the 18 yard box. Although the second half saw more pressure put on Knaphill by the home side, the visitors held firm with good defending to come away with a valuable and deserved 2-1 win.

That was or 24th League match of the season, which now leaves us with ten remaining starting with today's game. It was this time last year we embarked on a great 16 match unbeaten run that took us through until the middle of April before losing to Hartley Wintney. This season's target is slightly different. Now we've got less games to go on a similar run, and with fixtures reducing, we'll be likely to finish our League programme by the end of March – unless the weather intervenes! After today's game, Knaphill face a couple of hard games, away to Warlingham and Bedfont Sports. But after that win against Eversley, a similar performance against those two clubs would be most welcome!



Whilst our first team have not had a game postponed yet this season, our Reserves, who had two called off in December, together with two Saturdays without fixtures, have not played since the end of November. This afternoon they have any away game at Staines Lammas, their first in six weeks! It will be the first game in charge for new manager Gary Taylor who steps up from Assistant manager to replace Andy Martin, who resigned his managerial role due to work commitments.

Phil Ellery has recently signed two more players in his first team squad, the latest being Liam Parrington and Billy Jones, the latter scoring on his debut in the Eversley game. Both will be in today's line-up which sees the Ward brothers Matt and James unavailable with keeper Dan Pritchard missing through suspension.

Knaphill will however still be looking for back to back wins against Frimley Green today before the next two matches on Saturday14th January away to Warlingham, followed by a visit to high flying Bedfont Sports on Saturday 21st January. At the moment, Knaphill don't have a fixture on Saturday 28th January. The next scheduled home match at Redding Way will be on Saturday 4th February.

Meanwhile back to this afternoon's encounter.....and enjoy the game...

Show Racism the Red Card





The campaign against racism in football and society.







The club was founded in 1919 and currently play at Frimley Green Recreation Ground.

The present clubhouse was erected in 1972 when 'The Green' played in the London Spartan League and used a pitch on the lower part of the park with the changing rooms where the car park now is. A few years later a new pitch was laid adjacent to the clubhouse and changing rooms were added. The Reserve Team joined the Combined Counties League in 1979 and at the start of the 1981/82 season the First Team switched across and Floodlights were installed for the first time. The Club competed in the League for a period of 15 years, during which time they won the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Reserves won the Division One Challenge Cup.

Due to the financial situation in 1994 the club voluntarily dropped down into junior football. They were Runners-up in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in their first season but were denied promotion into the Surrey Premier League. The next four seasons saw a period of rebuilding and repaying debts and the club were finally accepted into the Surrey Premier League in 1999, after finishing Runners-up and winning the League Cup. Off the field new Floodlights were installed and a Boardroom created within the Clubhouse.

A three year spell followed, in the renamed Surrey Senior League, which saw the club finish fourth, sixth and Runners –up and attain promotion back into the Combined Counties League where they have played since. Season 2004-05 was the most successful to date, in the Combined Counties League, with the club finishing in $15^{\rm th}$ Place and amassing 58 points.

Season 2005-06 was very disappointing on the playing front but we managed to avoid finishing in a relegation position, however, despite substantial ground improvements we were demoted on 'ground grading', to make way for 7 clubs from the old Ryman Division two. In the past 4 seasons in Division One we have had mixed fortunes, finishing 6th at the end of season 2007/08 but then in season 2008/09 finished 3rd from bottom but had our most successful season ever in the FA Vase, reaching the third round and won an FA Cup match for the first time. In season 2009/10 we managed to finish high enough up the table to retain our place in the FA Cup but last seasons poor performance has seen us excluded this season. We are, however, still in the FA Vase and continue to make ground improvements to ensure that we retain our level 6 status at our own ground.

the last time we met here

Knaphill extended their unbeaten run to 13 games in an extraordinary scoreline against Frimley Green that produced ten goals, eight of them coming in the second half. When the two teams last met, Knaphill were comfortable 4-0 winners, but at Redding Way it was not quite so easy, as Knaphill left it late to finish with a final flourish, scoring two late goals to record their tenth win in the unbeaten sequence.

Knaphill got off to a fine start with early pressure and penetrated the visitors defence when Ricky Hogsden received a through ball from Jack Williams and the leading goalscorer drilled home to make it 1-0. Frimley gave the home side an early scare, but with play evenly balanced in the early stages, it was Knaphill who went close to scoring a second after 19 minutes when, following a dazzling run, Chris Fox was unlucky to see his shot come back off the post.

The visitors launched a quick break after 28 minutes, and in an effort to clear danger, Knaphill defender Alex Lumley could only divert the ball into the net.

Knaphill went close to regaining the lead on the half hour but Hogsden's shot was saved and diverted for a corner, and the first half finished without any further advantage for either side.

It was the second half that was to produce a glut of goals, but it could have been a clearer scoreline for Knaphill had their defence not been vunerable to quick breaks from Frimley Green which at times produced some sloppy defending which was shown up with the visitors scoring three goals in the half. Some of their distribution was also letting them down. The visitors took the lead in the 50th minute through Michael Lacey, and it was only keeper Richard Shelley who denied them a third, making a fine save from Daniel Fisher.

After 65 minutes, Knaphill were back on level terms from a penalty with Matt Baker coolly slotting the ball past the keeper. Soon after, Hogsden had a chance for his second, but his header flashed past the near post. Both sides were seeking to forge a lead, and it was Knaphill who did just that in the 75th minute, when Ed Cardona latched onto a through ball, burst into the 18 yard box to finish with quality to make it 3-2.

Five minutes later Chris Fox was upended on the edge of the 18 yard area, and free-kick specialist Matt Baker drove home to give Knaphill a two goal cushion at 4-2. It was short lived. Within two minutes Frimley Green netted a third goal through substitute Jordan Giddings, and with little time for the home defence to recover from conceding that goal, they were punished again when Giddings hit the equaliser to make it 4-4 after 85 minutes.

But there was another dramatic turn in this encounter when Knaphill piled on the pressure in the closing stages and in the 88th minute, Alex Lumley swung over a well flighted free kick that glided into the far corner of goal. Lead regained by Knaphill at 5-4, and with a well taken sixth goal from Cardona two minutes into stoppage time, the home side ended 6-4 winners. What a finish!


Eversley pulled one back ten minutes into the second half when Matt Baker found the channel down the middle of the visitors half and route one to goal, as he slotted past Pritchard.
