The playing record last season saw the team win 26 games, draw 4 and lose 10, scoring 98 goals and a total of 82 points. The Division has been reduced in number this season with 19 clubs, so 36 games to be played in Division One as opposed to 40 last season, which is not a bad situation, as 2009/10 produced a long season with the forty league games plus Cup competitions.

The Reserves fixtures have been drastically reduced with just 14 Clubs in the Division and 26 league games to be played this season. They also kick-off their season today with an away fixture against Warlingham.

During the close season, Knaphill collected three awards at the AGM and Presentation Evening of the Combined Counties in June. The Reserves won the Fair Play Award, congratulations to manager Matt Chesterman and this team. The Club won the Best Administered Club Award and the Best Programme Award in Division 1, the second time those two awards have been won by Knaphill in three seasons.

During the close season, Cup draws have been made, with Knaphill entering four Cups. In the 1st round of the El Records Premier Challenge Cup, Knaphill are at home to Molesey, the winners away to Warlingham in the next round. In the Lemon Recordings Division One Challenge Cup 1st round, Knaphill are away to Chobham, the winners at home to Bedfont Sports or Westfield in round two.

Knaphill play Chipstead Reserves in the Surrey Premier Cup, and in the Southern Combination Cup, which has no 1st round matches, Knaphill are away to Frimley Green in round two.

The Club have made some new signings for the coming season, Matt Brunt has joined us from Hartley Wintney, Alex Lumley joins us from Woking FC, Scott Bennett who has featured for Farnborough and Leatherhead and Michael Pym who rejoins the club after a year away at Ash Utd and Virginia Water. These new faces link up with many familiar faces from the 2009/10 campaign, and the team look to start their



challenge for honours in the season ahead.

Don't forget we are back here next Saturday as we entertain Worcester Park and then we travel to league new boys Farnborough North End in our first away fixture.

Our first local derby of the season is here on Saturday 28th August when we host Westfield, kick off 3pm.

I would also like to welcome the three match officials for today's clash, Chris Blackie, Kevin Leggatt and Clive Tidey and I hope there brief stay with us is a pleasant one.

Lastly we look forward to an entertaining game to kick-off the new season here at Redding Way today.

2009/2010 SEASON REVIEW

The 2009/10 season saw Knaphill finish 3rd in Division One, a position normally a place for promotion, but unfortunately not having necessary facilities in place at the time, the Club have to wait another season and a challenge for promotion, with the floodlights, to the Premier Division. However, we can look back on 2009/10 as a season of two halves, the second proving to be the strongest part of the League campaign.

AUGUST

In August there were seven games which saw two defeats, Frimley Green 3-1 and Hartley Wintney 5-3. There were four wins, CB Hounslow 4-2, Warlingham 5-0, Westfield 2-0 and Farleigh Rovers 2-1. The first result of the season was the 1-1 draw against Crescent Rovers



SEPTEMBER

Started with a 3-1 defeat at home by leaders Worcester Park. A draw with Mole Valley 3-3, was followed by a dismissal from two cup competitions, Ash United 4-3 in the Premier Cup, and Hartley Wintney 3-0 in the Divison 1 Challenge Cup.

OCTOBER

Came with three defeats, South Park 5-3, Guildford City 2-1(Cup) and Eversley 2-1. The two games that produced maximum points came against Croydon Municipal 3-0 and Feltham 4-1.



NOVEMBER

There was an extra time win against Chipstead Reserves in the 2nd round of the County Cup in November, a 5-2 league defeat by Staines Lammas, and an emphatic 6-2 win at Coulsdon. It was a month that also saw games postponed due to the weather.

DECEMBER

There were only three games in December. Following the 5-2 win over Tooting & Mitcham Reserves in the County Cup 3rd round, the team suffered two 1-0 defeats at Worcester Park and Frimley Green before the weather interrupted the league programme with no more games until 2nd January.

JANUARY

January 2010 and the first match of the year saw a share of the points in the 1-1 draw at South Park, then a 4-0 home win against Warlingham. After a heavy defeat by Met.Police (6-2) in the County Cup, the lads inflicted a 2-1 defeat on Cobham, their opponents first defeat in 18 matches.



February

Was to see the start of the best spell of the season, when after a disappointing 1-0 defeat at Feltham, the team launched their terrific, record beating winning run of 12 consecutive games with maximum points.

Starting on the 6th February the wins came as follows: Croydon Municipal 2-1, Westfield 4-0, Hartley Wintney 1 -0, Farleigh Rovers 3-1 in February.





MARCH

March continued the sequence against CB Hounslow 3-0 Coulsdon Utd 2-0, Bedfont Sports 2-1, and Eversley 5-1.



APRIL/MAY

In April, wins agains tCrescent Rovers 3-0, Farnham Town 3-0, Chobham 3-0 home and 3-0 away, which took us up to 13th April with win number twelve. The run came to an end with a 2-0 defeat by Mole Valley. However, the team soon chalked up another win a week later, defeating Sheerwater 4-0 followed by Bedfont Sports 2-0, the return fixture with Sheerwater 2-0 and in the final away game maximum points in the 3-2 win at Farnham.

The last game of the season brought a cracking finish at home to Cobham when Knaphill needed a point to finish third. That was achieved in the final minute of the game as Gavin Brainch scored a last gasp equaliser to make it 2-2 to the delirious delight of all the players to give the club a final finish of 3rd in Division One.

With so many changes taking place during the summer months involving a number of clubs, this season promises to be one of the most competitive and exciting in Divison One for a long time. Westfield, Cobham, Hartley Wintney to name but a few have all been busy recruiting new management and playing staff in an effort to make improvements on last season, when let's face it, ended up being a two horse race between Mole Valley and Worcester Park who were eventually piped at the post having led the title race for such long periods during the season. But this season I believe it will be different with may be 4 or 5 clubs in with a shout of promotion, we hopefully being one of them!

The league is also strengthened this season by new comers Farnborough North End previously of the Wessex League, and Hayes Gate, our visitors today who secured their jump up the ladder by finishing second last season in the Middlesex League. A goal from defender Gavin Brainch deep into time added on, clinched third place for Knaphill in their fina game of the 2009/10 season against Cobham at Redding Way.

Right up to that moment, it seemed it might be the same senario as the final day last season when then, the title was at stake, which Knaphill failed to clinch at Farleigh. But this time, the late, late goal secured what they were after in their last game, a third place finish.

It was Cobham who created more of the early chances, whilst Knaphill made only a couple of goal scoring opportunities before they forged into the lead after 18 minutes when, following a good build up, Nick Darnell hooked the ball past keeper Nick McGregor to make it 1-0. Two minutes later, Martin Cook, in for regular Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley, made a timely save to deny Cobham's Gerald Mensah.

Early in the second half, Knaphill launched an attack, but Chris Fox shot was driven straight at the keeper. In the 64th minute, Shane Rideout gave Cobham the lead when he found plenty of space in the home defence, to drill his shot into the far corner of goal.

The big push forward from Knaphill in search of an equaliser saw efforts failing to make their mark. But whilst Cobham were seeking a third goal, it was Knaphill who battled back with late perseverance that payed off just as it looked if time would run out on them.

Awarded a free kick on the edge of the 18 yard box in time added on, Matt Baker's fierce drive was blocked by the wall, and as Cobham failed to clear their lines in the final minute, up popped defender Gavin Brainch who planted the perfect header, inside the near post for the last gasp equaliser to earn the point and a top three finish.

THE STORY SO FAR... HISTORY OF THE KNAPPERS

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's

Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.


Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team. In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over. Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves. The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.

2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.



Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels.

With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

The 2009/10 season saw the team finish third in Division One, their best placing in the three seasons in the Combined Counties League. The previous two seasons the Club finished in seventh and fifth positions.

Third would normally have gained the Club promotion, but due to the proposed floodlights installation being delayed, Knaphill have to make another challenge for promotion in 2010/11. The team won 26 out of their 40 league games, losing 10 with 4 drawn, scoring 98 goals and finishing with 82 points. Season 2010/11 is the first for a Youth team at the Club, with Knaphill Youth U.18's playing in the Allied Counties League.


