

#### KICK-OFF

#### **Welcome to Redding Way**

Good afternoon everyone, and welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Sheerwater and today's match officials for this local derby. Both of today's teams are in the bottom six of Division One with last Saturday's results reflecting on what so far has not been very productive for either side. Both teams were on the end of a defeat last week, Knaphill at Chobham, and Sheerwater at home to Staines Lammas.

Knaphill go into this match having played eleven, won three, drawn two and lost six accumulating in just eleven points and in 14th place, whilst Sheerwater are just one place below, having played thirteen, won two, drawn three with eight lost and nine points. As far as Knaphill are concerned the last two and a half months have been the worst start to a season since we've been in the Combined Counties.

This is the first game I've be watching since September 4th, when we got a point in the 2-2 draw at Warlingham. But the pattern of results since then has propelled a big question – what is the problem? Recent performances have been pretty poor, and since the win over Westfield at the end of August, there's been just one win, in a well deserved 3-2 success at Eversley, five weeks ago.

By this time last season, the team had won six league games, had 20 points and were fourth in the table, and of course later came that fantastic run of winning 12 successive games starting in January. But what is currently going wrong this season? The passion, enthusiasm, determination, and commitment seem to be main ingredients in a game, but is this a telling factor?

It's a scenario that this Club is not used to, after three seasons in the Combined Counties League which has seen the team rise from seventh, to fifth to third in the table over those three seasons. We want to see more of the form shown during that spell, and to rise again and prove they are a side to be feared and reckoned with again.



Last Saturday, Knaphill were dumped out of the Division One Challenge Cup at the first hurdle by Chobham, which prior to this season would have been seen as almost impossible! At least they found a side to field for this meeting, and on the day were obviously up for it more that Knaphill, finishing with a 3-0 scoreline. Our last away game brought a heavy defeat at South Park, again a team we have done well against in the past.

Well, enough of the downside in form. Now come on lads, get those heads up, let's see you stepping up a gear or two and start driving your way onwards and upwards and put everything you've got into the game for the two home matches here at Redding Way, Sheerwater today and Farleigh Rovers next Saturday. Think positive and let's see maximum points in the bag to finish off the month of October.

Our Reserves and Youth teams have had League and Cup success in the past week. Last Saturday the Reserves had a 1-0 win in the league against Bedfont Sports Reserves, Lloyd Greenfield the goalscorer, The result moved the team up to 5th in the table.

On Monday night Knaphill U18s progressed to the 3rd round of the Grant McLellan Youth Cup when they beat Guildford City U18s 3-0 in the 2nd round tie played at Frimley Green FC. Goalscorers were Joe Turner, Sam Wilson and Harry Maynard. Well done lads!

#### MATCH REPORTS

### A View From The Opposition

Match reports from our last two encounters courtesy of our opposition.

#### South Park 6 Knaphill 2 - Saturday 9th October - Combined Counties League Division One

Knaphill started this game better than Park applying early pressure without really threatening the Park goal. It was not until the 11th minute that Park had an effort on goal when Smith's shot was deflected for a corner. The corner fell to Guscott who shot wide from 16 yards. With a quarter of an hour on the clock Park's swift counter attack from the edge of their own box found Smith on halfway, he fed Whiting-Balcombe who made ground down the right and when he crossed the ball it was Smith who was unmarked in the box to give Park the lead. Park now began to grow in confidence and Whiting-Balcombe and Ward both hit long range efforts narrowly wide. Lavery missed a good chance on 22 minutes when he snatched at his shot after fine work by Smith down the left.

A minute later Lavery ran on to Wastell's clearance and was denied by the woodwork as his effort clipped the top of the bar as the visitor's keeper narrowed the angled. It was now Knaphill that were playing on the break and when Baker was fouled on the edge of the box the free kick was wasted. Lavery ws now winning everything in the air against the Knaphill centre halves and from his knock down Smith rifled home an unstoppable 25 yard left shoot to double Park's lead on 33 minutes. With half time approaching Park went to sleep at a corner and when Savage crossed Baker flicked the ball in to the Park net.

Parker replaced the injured Smith at half time however Park increased their lead in the opening minute of the 2nd half when from a Park corner the Knaphill keeper punched the ball against the back of one of his defenders and the ball dropped at the feet of Guscott who hade the easy task of side footing the ball into the unguarded goal. Parker pounced on another flick on from Lavery and hit his shot early form 25 yards which just went wide of the target. Knaphill were now restricted to long range efforts which they could not get on target.

On 61 minutes Ward picked the ball up in the centre circle and ran at the Knaphill defence beating three players before he was brought down in the box. He picked himself up and struck his penalty into the bottom corner despite the valiant efforts of the keeper to increase Park's lead. A couple of minutes later Lavery got his just rewards when he ran through unchallenged and hit his shot under the advancing keeper to make it 5-1.

#### Chobham 3 Knaphill 0 - Saturday 16th October - Division One Challenge Cup 1st Round

The home side started well pushing forward, and they were rewarded quickly for their efforts. In the 5th minute Charles Anonam battled with the left back, he half tackled him forcing the ball into the area, he rode tackles before managing to produce a lofting strike wide of the keeper.

Chobham continued to press looking to increase their lead. They were winning everything in midfield with the extremely solid Jamie Doble, Ben Crew and Dan Risdon. This set up a number of half chances for the tireless Andy Carr and Eddie Edwards. Chobham doubled their lead in the 37th minute when Chris Paterson smashed a free kick from the edge of the area perfectly into the bottom corner. The home side went in at half time with a well deserved 2-0 lead.

Knaphill came out strongly in the second half and nearly pulled a goal back, but a shot from just outside the area through a crowd of players was superbly saved by the outstretched foot of keeper James Shaw, who didn't put a foot wrong all game.

Chobham's nerves were calmed in the 61st minute when they increased their lead to 3-0. After a Carr shot was blocked, the rebound broke to Anonam who drove a low first time shot into the corner. This sparked an acrobatic back flip celebration from Anoman and cheers of approval from the Chobham faithful.

As much as Knaphill tried they could not penetrate the extremely solid well organised Chobham defence, Paterson and Bloxham were dominate in the centre and Collins and Allwood stopped everything down the flakes. This with the constant vocal encouragement of newly installed player coach Richard Keown drove Chobham on. Even the harsh sending off of Crew late on couldn't stop Chobham recording a memorable win.

#### **Brief History**

Sheerwater Football Club was formed in 1958 and founded by the late John French. Sheerwater joined the local Woking & District League. Sheerwater progressed through the Divisions to obtain Intermediate status in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in the 1967-68 season.

This enabled the club to progress to a senior level, playing in the Combined Counties League for a number of seasons. In the 1982-83 season Sheerwater joined the new Surrey County Premier League which was formed for those Clubs who could not fulfil the Senior criteria.

Sheerwater were relegated after a number of seasons in the Surrey County Premier League to the South Eastern Intermediate League, which was the only space made available to the Club.

Sheerwater were then determined to either gain promotion or move to a more regional Intermediate League. They were granted two sideways moves, firstly to the Surrey Combination League and then moved to the Surrey Intermediate League (Western). In the 1991-92 season Sheerwater gained promotion back to The Surrey County Premier League but were relegated once more but were granted a pass back to the SCPL due to a wrong decision to relegate the Club the previous season.

In 2002 the Surrey County Premier League was disbanded as all the Clubs and League officers had decided to join the Seagrave Haulage Football League, forming the new Division One League for the season 2003-04.

The League has now a new sponsor so the League is now known as the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties League. Last season Sheerwater finished 17th in the league. The club are proud of achieving 50 years in football and celebrated this occasion on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2008 with over 270 guests at the H G Wells Conference Centre in Woking.

## THE STORY SO FAR... HISTORY OF THE KNAPPERS

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's

Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.


Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team. In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over. Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves. The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.

2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.



Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels.

With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

The 2009/10 season saw the team finish third in Division One, their best placing in the three seasons in the Combined Counties League. The previous two seasons the Club finished in seventh and fifth positions.

Third would normally have gained the Club promotion, but due to the proposed floodlights installation being delayed, Knaphill have to make another challenge for promotion in 2010/11. The team won 26 out of their 40 league games, losing 10 with 4 drawn, scoring 98 goals and finishing with 82 points. Season 2010/11 is the first for a Youth team at the Club, with Knaphill Youth U.18's playing in the Allied Counties League.

#### Last Time Out Knaphill 4 Sheerwater O

Cardona 2, Cox, Hogsden

Knaphill bounced back from a defeat by Mole Valley, which ended their 12 match winning run, and soon got back on track with a comfortable 4-0 win over local rivals Sheerwater at Redding Way.

Knaphill got off to a flying start after just three minutes, when Dan Cox finished off one of his dazzling runs down the right flank and delivered an effort that flew into goal to make it 1-0.

Early pressure came from the home side as Ed Cardona fired just over the bar, and two minutes later Ricky Hogsden brought out a quick reflex save from Nick Rogers who turned his effort away for a corner by his near post.



Sheerwater could have equalised after 10 minutes as a slip by defender Stephen Greene, let through Matt Charker, but keeper Richard Shelley came out to dive at the feet of the striker to deny the goal scoring opportunity.

Jack Ball was making his first team debut for Knaphill, in place of Matt Baker, and showed his early confidence, and following a move between Cox and Cardona, finished with Ball firing just wide of the post. Knaphill were creating a number of chances in the first part of the half, but the tempo slowed down as the half wore on, as they took their foot off the pedal, with Sheerwater able to contain the home side from increasing their lead, whilst seeking to get back on level terms themselves.

Knaphill's start to the second half was virtually a repeat of the first, at a swift pace, when in the 48<sup>th</sup> minute, Ed Cardona headed home from eight yards for a two goal lead. Sheerwater's attempt at reducing the deficit, brought Shelley back in action to save well from Sheerwater's Jerome Smart after 56 minutes.

Cardona was well placed to put Knaphill further ahead in the 67<sup>th</sup> minute, but volleyed his effort over the bar from just inside the 18 yard box. Sheerwater were reduced to ten men for the last 20 minutes of the game as Knaphill continued to create more chances from which they added two more goals late in the half.

After Gavin Brainch had his fierce drive blocked, Cardona got his second and Knaphill's third after 81 minutes, with Ricky Hogsden unleashing an excellent strike a couple of minutes later to wrap up the three points, and back on the winning track.

The Ladies play their league fixtures on a Sunday at Brookwood Country Park (Home of Knaphill FC) with 1.45pm KO's. 




