Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone. We welcome to Redding Way the players and officials from South Park, also today's three match officials for this Division One encounter. The last meeting between South Park and Knaphill was in the away game back in October, a poor month for any decent results for us, as Knaphill suffered a 6-2 defeat. Neither of the teams played last weekend due to waterlogged pitches, but the two clubs were not alone with postponements, as a total of seven matches were called off in Division One, the same number also in the Premier, with just two games surviving in each Division.

So our last match played was two weeks ago, on a day that Knaphill's rich vein of form continued in the visit to Chobham where the team recorded their seventh successive win to make it a haul of 21 points gained since the beginning of the year. Some contrast to what was gained in the first four months of the season, which was just 12 points from fifteen matches.

The winning sequence in January, has continued into this month with two more wins. In our last home game against Cobham here three weeks ago, Knaphill reversed the away result of a 1-0 defeat back in August, as the return fixture at Redding Way, saw a 3-1 win for Knaphill with goals from Alex Lumley, Ricky Hogsden and Ed Cardona, producing a sixth consecutive win and another step up the table.

Away at Chobham two weeks ago, maximum points came in the 4-2 win against a side who had a rare success over us in a League Cup tie at the Recreation Ground. In this encounter, confidence, commitment and quality again became the theme as the winning run continued. Knaphill took the lead after 17 minutes when a cross from James Wills was met with a header by Ricky Hogsden to make the early breakthrough. It was 2-0 in the 24th minute when Matt Baker slotted home a penalty, after Chris Fox had been fouled in the box, and Knaphill went close to a third goal ten minutes before halftime when Fox's effort hit the post.

Three minutes into the second half, Chris Fox made it 3-0, and a few minutes later, Richard Shelley denied the home side with a fine save from Carr. Substitute Jack Ball was only on the pitch for a minute and with his first touch slotted home Knaphill's fourth after 73 minutes. Chobham got two goals in the last fifteen minutes, but the result was never in doubt. Knaphill ran out worthy winners and secured the slot behind 10th place Eversley who were also on 33 points, although the Hampshire side added another three more to that total last weekend from one of only two games played in Division One.

Our Reserves have had their last two games, against Farleigh Rovers and Mole Valley postponed, and face a third blank Saturday today with no fixture allocated. They will be hoping to resume next week in the home match against Sheerwater Reserves, with 11 games of their 26 match league programme still to play.

Knaphill Youth U18s were in action last week, and completed a league double over Cove U18s with a 5-2 win in the Allied Counties League, with goals from Sam Wilson(2) Dan Kelly(2) and Fraser Wilsh. The previous week produced an excellent result in the Quarter-final of the Grant McLellan Cup, the Youth team defeating Camberley Youth 2-0, with goals from Liam Welch and Bradley Fraser to reach the semi-final of the competition. Well done lads. Their semi-final opponents are not yet known.

As you can see around the Ground, our 50 seater stand is now installed, and work is getting underway on the preparation for the installation of the floodlights. With rearranged fixtures now being put into place, we'll be looking ahead to a busy couple of months of the season, and after today's match, we still have 13 games to play between now and the end of season. Eight of the games will be played in April. Just as well our 2010/11 programme consists of 36 league games as opposed to 40 last season. Next Saturday 5th March, Knaphill are away to Sheerwater, followed by a fixture away to CB Hounslow on Thursday 10th March, which will be played at Bedfont Sports FC kick-off 7.30pm. At the moment there is no fixture allocated for Saturday 12 March, so the next home match will be on Saturday 19 March, when there's a quick return fixture against CB Hounslow who will be the visitors to Redding Way kick-off 3pm.

WELCOMING SOUTH PARK F.C



SOUTH PARK FOOTBALL CLUB A BRIEF HISTORY

South Park Football Club was formed in 1897 and immediately became founder members of the Redhill & District Football League along with other local clubs Godstone, Meadvale and Reigate Priory Reserves. The club remain members of the league today.

Although the facilities were basic the early matches were played in the original sports field which was in upper South Park between Crescent Road and Church Road. In 1925 under the direction of Canon Gregory from the local church, the football club together with the village cricket club formed the South Park Sports Association with the aim of the Association to provide sport and sporting facilities for the people of South Park.

Within a few years it was realised that this new concept would be better served by an improvement in facilities and playing conditions. Fortunately for both club's suitable land existed in Whitehall Lane, the clubs current home and with the co-operation of the public spirited landowner, Harold Swannack, four acres of ground were purchased there. Always strapped for cash in these early years, the money was raised for the field largely by public subscription, which included door to door collections.

In order to preserve the land as a permanent sports ground, great foresight was exercised in vesting the land and subsequent purchases of further lots of two acres and four acres making ten acres in all in the National Playing Fields Association, now known as Fields in trust. The land became known as the 'King Georges Field' from 1935. The changing rooms were located on the far side of the field from Whitehall Lane at the bottom of the number two football pitch. Although the facilities were an improvement on their previous home they remained basic.

The football club flourished in the years leading to the Second Great War but obviously declined during and immediately after it. A handful of stewards rallied to the cause however and quickly resurrected its fortunes. One legacy of the hostilities, the air raid shelter, became the focus of attention when it became clear that further improvements were needed to the facilities if sporting aspirations were to be advanced.



Thus it was that a shower room and toilet block and a modest clubhouse were attached to this building. Funding for this was achieved through the tireless efforts of the 'Friends of South Park Sports Association' organisation. Despite these commendable efforts, the Association lived for many years on a hand to mouth basis with the management all too frequently having to put their hands into their own pockets to ensure its survival.

During this period the playing side of the football club flourished with numerous honours won in the local leagues and cups together with appearances in County Cup finals. The club were also honoured in the fact that a number of players progressed to senior football with clubs such as Redhill and Eastbourne Town in the fifties and sixties, the heyday of non league football. The seventies and eighties brought further improvements to the changing facilities and clubroom and the purchase of the land that is now our main pitch were made. In the early seventies the football club started the junior's section. Over the years the number of teams has increased on a regular basis and today we have boy's teams from under eight's through to under sixteen's.

In 1997 the football club celebrated its Centenary year, the highlight of which was a celebratory dinner held at Reigate Manor Hotel at which over 150 people attended. Many players both past and present attended along with guests from The Football Association and Surrey County Football Association.

The club was presented with its own unique framed certificate from the Football Association to mark this occasion. The club was once again celebrating in 1998 when Geoff Thatcher was awarded a Gold Medal by the Football Association to commemorate over 50 years service to football, the whole period with our club dating back to the war years when the club only played friendly matches as their was no competitive football during the war.

2001 saw Reigate Town Football Club move to South Park and the club became known as South Park & Reigate Town Football Club. In 2002 the club saw the formation of the first girl's team to play under the clubs name and we now have four girl's teams. The following the year saw the introduction of the youth team who are currently playing in the Southern Youth Floodlight League. The youth team played their home matches at Merstham Football Club from 2003–2007 as at the time we did not have floodlights.

For the 2003/04 season the club reverted back to its original name of South Park Football Club. In February 2004 the club became only the fifth in Surrey to be awarded the status of 'FA Charter Standard Community Club'. In 2006 the first team were promoted to the Combined Counties Football League and as our new changing facilities were being built played their home matches at Cranleigh. In their first season in the Combined Counties League the team finished in seventh place in the league. 2007 saw the completion of our new changing rooms and the erection of floodlights around our main pitch. This ensured that our first and youth teams could now play their home matches in South Park.

The 2008/09 season saw another landmark in the history of the club when we hosted Shoreham in our first ever FA Vase game. The 2009/10 season saw the club finish in their highest position (6th) since joining the Combined Counties League. The club has continued to progress and in August 2010 our stand will be erected which will give us the ground grading required for the first team to gain promotion.



The 2010/11 season will see the club participate in the FA Cup for the time with an away tie against Greenwich Borough.

It must also be noted that without the tireless efforts of the late Fred Dearmun, Geof Thatcher, Ray Wilson and Geoff Arnold to name but a few, the club would not be in the position it is today.



WHAT HAPPENED HERE

On their current form, Knaphill's better football it seems comes away from home, having won all five league games on their travels so far this season, – but at home, well it's almost like Redding Way is becoming more advantageous to the away team than Knaphill. Saturday's 5-3 defeat by their opponents South Park emphasising that point, as Knaphill have registered just one home win so far this season.

Knaphill had won their previous four meetings against South Park, but after starting brightly with early pressure on their opponents, South Park burst upon the scene to disrupt that spell by scoring two goals in the space of three minutes. The first after 14 minutes, saw Mottram weave his way towards the six yard box and slip the ball past Nash, then in the 17th minute the visitors increased their lead after Parkerc first effort was blocked by the feet of Knaphill keeper Richard Nash, but only straight into the path of the striker to slot home. Nash was making his first team debut, with Knaphillc other two keepers, Shelley and Rogers, both sidelined through injury.



The visitors took the initiative following the quick smash and grab of the two goals as Knaphill's early spark was defused and they struggled to find their shape and cutting edge. A couple of chances did come Knaphill's way, a Ricky Hogsden shot which was deflected for a corner inches from the post, and Gavin Brainch delivered the ball across the face of goal which failed to find a Knaphill player who could latch onto.

South Park nearly extended their lead on 36 minutes when Mottram's shot with little pace on it, was heading towards goal leaving Nathan Miles to desperately scramble the ball away with Nash stranded in front of him. Like the first two goals, the build up to the third was similar when after 42 minutes Mottram hooked the ball home from close range to give the visitors a a commanding halftime lead.

Two instant substitutions were made at the start of the second half with Matt Baker and Gary Campbell replacing Vic Flynn and Micky Walter, and with Brainch dropping back into his regular defensive role. In the first fifteen minutes of the half, Knaphill began to show a bit more bite and vigour in their play after coming off from the first half second best. The first warning sign came when Chris Fox was unlucky when a cracking shot cannoned off the crossbar. Then in the 56th minute, Knaphill were awarded a free kick 22 yards out from which Baker glided round the defensive wall to reduce the arrears.



The comeback appeared to be taking shape as after 59 minutes, an outstretched tap on from Baker reached Hogsden who slid the ball past Roberts from six yards for Knaphill's second goal. Knaphill went close to equalising on 68 minutes when Baker's effort was pushed away by the keeper, before Hogsden drove a shot inches wide of the post soon after. Following Knaphill's second goal, South Park were getting to grips with the game again and in the 74th minute made it 4-2 when Mellows planted his header inside the near post.



At the other end, the visitors keeper was then to foil a Hogsden effort, but South Park were to dash any hopes of Knaphill getting any further back into the game, making it 5-2 through a well worked goal from Mellows after 80 minutes. Although Knaphill did get a third goal when Baker netted in the 88th minute, the main damage had been done in the first half as Knaphill were left to reflect on another disappointing home performance which has seen them gain just one win from seven league games and one Cup match at home so far this season and an even grimmer statistic of conceding 24 goals in those eight matches.

Jack Williams, who joined Knaphill from Premier Division side Cove in late January, is settling in well and although having only played a limited number of games since joining, Jack is enjoying his football with Knaphill. I caught up with Jack earlier this week and one of the first questions I put to him was about how and when did he first get interested in playing football.

Like other youngsters, it was an early age for Jack, playing in the Under 7s for Onslow Village and progressing through with other age groups, he also played for Meadow Sports during those early years.

By the time Jack was in his mid-teens, he had joined Merrow, a Club who prior to playing in the Combined Counties League had played in the Surrey Intermediate League. After University, Jack then joined Cove in the Premier Division of the Combined Counties, and was with the club for 18 months before making the move to Knaphill. Although having been at Knaphill for only a few weeks, I asked Jack how is he finding the level of football in Division One as opposed to the time he was playing in the Premier. "I believe the Premier sides are defensive, cagey and faster, whereas in Division One, the level of football flows with the emphasis on attacking football".

Although football appears to be Jack's number one sport at the moment, he has shared interests in other sports, having played Rugby for Guildford and Godalming, and been involved in Hockey and Cricket. LATEST MATCH REPORT

Saturday February 12th 2011 Chobham 2 Knaphill 4 Combined Counties Division One



Moving On Up!

The previous meeting between these two clubs back in October saw Chobham chalk up a rare win over Knaphill in the League Cup. It came during a barren spell of results for Knaphill who recorded just three wins in 15 games in seeing out 2010. But how times and fortunes have changed! Saturday's visit to the Recreation Ground was a different story as the visitors continued their points haul, defeating Chobham 4-2, to make it a maximum 21 points from seven games since the turn of the year, blended with a theme of confidence, commitment, and quality adding to their recent form.

The local derby, which had early exchanges of creating chances for both sides, saw Knaphill take the initiative as they opened the scoring proceedings after 17 minutes, when a cross from James Wills was met by a Ricky Hogsden header to put the visitors 1-0 up. Seven minutes later, they increased that lead when, following a foul on Chris Fox in the box, Matt Baker stepped up to plant the spot kick past James Shaw with aplomb to make it 2-0.

Knaphill, although beginning to take control, had their opponents creating some opportunities which lacked a finishing touch, failing to cause any real trouble for the Knaphill defence. On 35 minutes, Fox had a chance to strengthen Knaphill's lead, but he saw his effort come back off the foot of the far post, their closest effort in the remainder of the half.

Chobham were given very little time to settle down at the start of the second half when Knaphill made it 3-0, Chris Fox hooking the ball home from just insie the 18 yard area after 48 minutes. Chobham then had an opportunity to reduce the arrears in the 53rd minute, Andy Carr's drilled effort pulling out a fine save from Richard Shelley.

Knaphill defended well to deny any chance the home side had, although Rocha and Anonam both miscued worthy chances. After 72 minutes, Knaphill sub Jack Ball replaced Ricky Hogsden, and within a minute of coming on, received a threaded pass across goal from Wills, and Jack was on the ball with his first touch to steer home Knaphill's fourth.

Chobham's closest effort came in the 75th minute when a Bloxam free kick was tipped over the bar by Shelley. But a minute later, they had the opportunity to reduced the arrears when awarded a penalty, from which Roche slotted home the spot kick. A defensive lapse in Knaphill's defence allowed Carr to shoot past Shelley after 83 minutes.

But despite conceding two goals in the last 15 minutes, the result was never in doubt as another accomplished Knaphill performance pushed them up the table, and having scored 23 goals from the last seven games, are now on 33 points, the same as 10th place Eversley, whose goal difference is better than Knaphill's.




