Playing their first match in three weeks, Knaphill despite a shaky first half showing, came good in the second period, and from a goal down upped their tempo to finish worthy 3-1 winners at Redding Way on Saturday.

Knaphill hardly had time to settle down when they were exposed at the back as Warlingham's Michael Burton seized the opportunity to race towards goal and slide the ball past McGregor to give the visitors the lead after just three minutes. Conceding such an early goal, Knaphill took a while to get into any sort of rhythm, and although new signing Emmanual Oloyede was unlucky to see his shot hit the bar, Knaphill were not finding it easy to upset the visitors defence.

The second best chance of the half for the home side came in the 37th minute when Matt Edwards planted a header goalwards which was headed over the bar by a defender on the line. The remainder of the half had the visitors having another couple of chances, whilst Knaphill ended the half knowing they needed to step up a gear in the second half to make more of an impact.

Knaphill were on level terms after 57 minutes with a close range effort from Peter Biggs, an equaliser that led to the home side stepping up their pace. With a substitution on the hour, Charlie Postance coming on for Oyoyede, the striker was to make his mark with a goal in the 70thminute. Ross Murray delivered the ball across the face of the box which found Postance who took his chance well to give Knaphill the lead.

They came close to a third when Biggs had an effort that was parried away by the keeper at the near post. Although there were not too many opportunities for either side as the half entered its final minutes, the game and points were wrapped up in the fourth minute of time added on, when Postance struck again for his second goal and Knaphill's third, to complete a league double over Warlingham, in gaining maximum points.





Good evening everyone, and welcome to Spelthorne Sports players, officials and supporters, also to the three match officials for this evening's Division One encounter. This game, originally scheduled for 23rd March, was hit by the weather giving us this rearranged match tonight. Our visit to Spelthorne early in the season ended up with Knaphill conceding five goals without reply. Five players remain in the Knaphill squad from that game back in September. Spelthorne were without a game on Saturday and are currently hold 6th place in the table, whilst Knaphill dropped a place to 13th following the defeat at Farleigh.

Looking back on our last home game on Saturday 30th March, Knaphill's 3-1 win over Warlingham, saw was a shaky start for the home side, going a goal down after just three minutes, a lead the visitors held onto until the early stages of the second half. Big improvement for Knaphill in the second half as Peter Biggs notched the equaliser for Knaphill after 57 minutes, and substitute Charlie Postance made it 2-1 after 70 minutes, then added his second and Knaphill's third to wrap up the points in injury time. Match report can be found elsewhere in this programme.

Onto last Saturday and a trip to Farleigh Rovers, a rearranged game that saw the home side second from bottom and having lost their previous six matches. They brought that run to a halt and Knaphill were the victims of a 2-1 defeat. Farleigh took the lead after Craig Taylor had denied the home side earlier, by saving a penalty. Ross Murray scored the equaliser for Knaphill, but Farleigh made it 2-1 in the second half to gain their first win in seven games. We now face a quick return fixture with Farleigh Rovers in another rearranged match this coming Saturday. We'll be looking for a far better result for Knaphill this week!

Our Reserves were in action at Redding Way last Saturday and the points were shared in the 2-2 draw with Farleigh Rovers Reserves. Knaphill had a two goal lead through Matt Niven and Jamal Rodney after 21 minutes, then allowed Farleigh to grab two goals and a 2-2 halftime scoreline. Both sides had chances to forge a lead in the second half, but it ended level with a point each. Due to three away games still to be rearranged, our Reserves are not scheduled another league game until Saturday 27th April against Raynes Park Vale Reserves.

Our Youth U18s were in action last week chalking up a 3-2 home win over Cranleigh U18s, and their next match will not be until next Tuesday 16th April at home to Hartley Wintney. Their match originally scheduled for tonight against Shalford, will now be played on Thursday 2nd May.

Looking ahead to forthcoming first team fixtures, Knaphill have four games remaining, starting with Farleigh Rovers the visitors this Saturday, and on Saturday 20thApril are away to Epsom Athletic. No fixture on 27th April, but three days later on Tuesday 30th April, Knaphill are away at Worcester Park with a 6.45pm kick off. Then their final league fixture of the season is another one of those rearranged matches, when the last game sees them away to CB Hounslow United.

So, the last home game of the season for the first team this Saturday, with the last three all away. The Reserves last home game is against Raynes Park Vale on 27th April, whilst our Youth team will finish off their season with matches be home on Tuesday16th April, Tuesday 23rd April, Tuesday 30th April and Thursday 2nd May.

Matt Edwards will be returning to the Club as our Goalkeeping Coach in time for pre-season and the start of the 2013/14 campaign. Matt departed from the Club in the early stages of this season to join Surrey Elite club Virginia Water, where he was previously to joining Knaphill in 2011. Matt's playing career covered several clubs, Virginia Water, Egham Town, Camberley Town, Bracknell Town and Englefield Green Rovers.

Knaphill FC are still looking to recruit a highly organised kit person to join their management set up, although with time running out this season, we would be hoping to have that position filled by the start of next season. The successful candidate will assist team management and the rest of the coaching staff by organising all aspects of the Club's kit requirements. The Club's Dinner and Awards Evening will be held on Saturday 25th May at West Byfleet Golf Club. This is a Ticket only event which must be purchased in advance, tickets are £40 and available on matchdays from the Club through either David Freeman, Mick Garbutt, Nick Croshaw, or Bryan Freeman. A £20 non-refundable deposit is required per person for bookings.

NTRODUCING SPELTI-IORNE SPORTS



Spelthorne Sports Club

Located on the A308, Staines Road West between Sunbury Cross and Staines, Spelthorne Sports Club was founded in 1922. Historical archives show that "Some 63 acres of land between Charlton and Ashford Common were allotted at the inclosure to provide money for the buying of fuel for the poor". This land was later known as the Fuel estate or Parish farm. Between about 1895 and 1926 the land was sold at various times and the proceeds were invested in stock, of which the income was £115 in 1950.

Spelthorne Sports Club purchased around 11 acres at this time, our initial outlay for the land was around £20. If development was allowed on this land today it would be valued at substantially more - (shrewd men our original members!).

In the early years the club was little more than a converted air raid shelter surrounded by a large amount of London's western air defences; the foundations of which are still within the grounds to this day.

Things are somewhat calmer and much improved at the club today and the "tin shack" has been replaced with a purpose built club which houses a saloon bar that holds around 100 and functions hall with sprung dance floor that holds around 200 people.

Within the club house you will find several match play dart boards, pool tables, gaming machines, changing and shower rooms for our sportsmen and women. The Club boasts an (all important) reasonably priced bar, coupled with a friendly atmosphere.

Our outside facilities within 11 acres of land consist of 2 full sized football pitches & junior pitch facilitating Intermediate standard & youth football with purpose built changing facilities for teams and officials. Additionally we have a professionally maintained cricket pitch which

Since my last report, The Young Knappers have continued their unbeaten league run to a club record equalling 6 games with a hard fought 2-2 home draw against Farnham Town and a slightly less taxing 3-2 home win against Cranleigh.

The Farnham game saw an own goal from Farnham as a defender under pressure from a corner headed past his own keeper. The equaliser came just before half-time when a accurate cross beat the whole of the Knaphill defence and left the Farnham striker with just Craig Taylor in the Knaphill goal to beat, which he did with aplomb. Knaphill regained the lead with Nahaul Franchino's fierce drive, but Farnham were saved by a soft penalty after 'Man of the Match' Robert Litchfield was adjudged to have brought down the attacking player on the edge of the box. Both sides had opportunities to snatch all three points, but a combination of poor finishing (Farnham were caught off-side 17 times!) and great goal-keeping from both 'keepers kept the scores level.

Cranleigh faced Knaphill after drawing the match at Cranleigh 1-1, and the Knappers were not prepared to let them off the hook a second time. Goals from joint top-scorer Mikhail McLaughlin after 15 mins and Nico Aquino on the half hour gave the home side a 2-0 lead, Cranleigh pulled one back before Antonios Kozakis scored a third on 75 minutes. Cranleigh snatched a second before the end, but The Knappers were never seriously threatened.

It has been a great reward to the Youth Management team of Gary Taylor and Mark Dawber to see so many Youth team players appearing for the 1st & Reserves. When Knaphill started the U18's 3 years ago the desire was to produce youngster who could move into adult football smoothly within Knaphill FC. Of the current players, captain Jonny Coats, 'keeper Craig Taylor, Ahmed Abdali, Matt Bowers and Josh Dawber all have featured in 1st team squads recently. The Reserves have fielded sometimes 5, 6 or 7 Youth players and they have not disappointed with the step up to adult football.



Next season is already starting to look good as Gary Taylor uses Year 1, 2 & 3 players to blend experience and enthusiasm within the squad.

This year, 30 players have made at least 1 appearance with 18 of those players scoring at least once! The news that Knaphill have entered the FA Youth Cup has given a further spur to the players who will be returning for next season as this will be their first opportunity to play in a nationwide competition. It has been sad to see Colliers Wood United, Ash United and Cobham all resign from The Southern Youth League during the season. Colliers Wood withdrew after major problems with their home pitch resulting in nowhere for the U18's to play. Both Ash & Cobham have had to withdrawn after internal club issues.

With just four home games left for the Young Knappers, it is all about finishing the season in the best possible form. Four wins would secure The U18's their highest league finishing position after missing out on a Cup Final for the first time since they were formed.

The games are Hartley Wintney (Tues 16th), Guildford City (Tues 23rd), Godalming Town (Tues 30th) and Shalford (Thurs 2nd May), all KO's 7.30pm.

Knaphill 4 CB Hounslow Utd 1

Knaphill notched up their 10th win from their last twelve League games with a comfortable and convincing win over CB Hounslow Utd at Redding Way on Saturday. It was a game that Knaphill dominated with plenty of flair, passion and commitment. Having accumulated 31 points from a possible 36, they continue to put pressure on the teams above them in their pursuit of the Division 1 title with games in hand over them all.

The first half got off to a cracking pace with Knaphill putting pressure on the visitors defence from the start with some neat passing and fluent moves which began to put the game very much in Knaphill's control. As early as the third minute, Knaphill had a crack at goal, Ricky Hogsden slipping the ball to Gavin Evans, whose shot flashed wide of the post.

CB Hounslow defence was under pressure and often on the back foot during the first half, and on 20 minutes, Nick Darnell delivered a pass to Chris Fox who roared into the 18 yard box, but was unlucky to fire just wide. Fox, who was back in the starting line up after injury, was prominent when pushing forward from defence with pace to open up an attack. Hogsden went close, before Knaphill opened the scoring after 27 minutes, when Matt Baker drilled in a free kick through the defence and past Plock in the visitors goal to make it 1-0.

Four minutes later Knaphill increased their lead when Darnell's first effort was only half saved by the keeper and with a second chance, the Knaphill skipper tucked it away for his side's second. CB Hounslow had little time to recover from that goal before Baker struck his second free kick with fine aplomb after 33 minutes for a commanding 3-0 lead. Knaphill were purring, whilst CB Hounslow were stunned by the goal burst.

The visitors, although making the odd break, only tested Nick Rogers with one real serious effort in the half. A fourth goal was almost added to finish the first half when an Evans shot was pushed away for a corner by the keeper. The only surprise from the half was that Knaphill had not scored more in the first 45 minutes.

Although the pace slowed in the second half, Knaphill were always looking comfortable and confident which was shown from defence through to the strikers. However, only one goal was to enhance the first half display and that came in the 68th minute. A bit of a mix up between defender and keeper allowed Pym who had already latched onto the ball in the 18 yard box, to get a final touch away from the two players and into an empty unguarded goal, 4-0.

Although creating limited chances, CB Hounslow did manage to reduce the deficit in the 80th minute when Darren Buzzard was given too much space which allowed him to comfortably fire past Rogers. But a mere consolation for the visitors as Knaphill finished a good afternoon's performance.
