KICK-OFF

with Bryan Freeman



Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone. Welcome to Redding Way to the players and officials from Staines Lammas, and our three match officials for today's Division One encounter. It's eight weeks since we last played here on a Saturday, against Farnham at the end of November. Our first game since then came on Monday 3rd January when Feltham were the visitors, which after the long lay off, we won 3-1.

Five days later, whilst the majority of games were hit by the weather, we actually played another one! Knaphill's game against Farleigh Rovers (at Croydon Arena) was just one of three played in Division 1. It brought about our first back to back wins of the season, with a 3-2 victory. Today's game will be only the third we've played since November.

Last Saturday our home fixture against Bedfont Sports was postponed whilst Staines Lammas, who are currently fifth in the table, were held to a 2-2 draw away to basement Club Chobham. Our opponents today have played four games more than Knaphill, and have gained 35 points from 21 matches.

It has been so frustrating this season to have had four matches postponed due to the weather, one postponed due to a County Cup fixture, two Saturdays without an allocated fixture, and one against opposition who couldn't field a team. Today sees Knaphill just reaching the halfway stage of the league programme.

So, the two matches Knaphill have played this month, has brought us maximum points, with wins over Feltham and Farleigh Rovers. What a fine start to the New Year, not only for the players, but for the new management of David Freeman and Adie Wilson, in their first games in charge of the team.

Against Feltham, Knaphill could have had a three or four goal lead by the break following created chances, as opposed to the only goal of the half which came after 32 minutes from Dan Cox as the defender burst down the right flank to deliver with speed and accuracy to make it 1-0. Richard Shelley made some crucial saves to help maintain Knaphill's lead, before Matt Baker, back at the Club following a short stay at Eversley, slotted home to make it 2-0 after 77 minutes. James Wills added a third, and soon after, Feltham netted their consolation goal.

Another boost for the team came against Farleigh, as goals from Matt Baker, Nick Darnell and James Norman, saw Knaphill come away worthy winners. The win moved us up a couple of places, now 14th, with 18 points from 17 games, one point behind Westfield who have played a game more.

Last Saturday, our Reserves also had their match postponed at Bedfont Sports, which means they haven't had a game since the last Saturday in November. On the Youth side, Knaphill U18s played a midweek Allied Counties League game against Binfield on Wednesday 5th January and drew 2-2 after taking a two goal lead early in the second half, but their game against Bracknell the following week, was called off.

Knaphill's next fixture is away to Westfield next Tuesday 25th January kick-off 7.30pm, a fixture defeated by the weather last month. Knaphill have seven matches to reschedule, five at home and two away. Next Saturday 29th January, Knaphill are away to Frimley Green, kick-off 3pm.

Light at the end of the tunnel

After a meeting with Woking Borough Council 13th January, Knaphill FC are pleased to announce the following:

Woking Borough Council have confirmed the starting date for the contractors to carry out the installation of the floodlights at Redding Way, as the 15th of February, 2011. There had been a hold-up in the production of the lights as the pylons, which have to be coloured green to comply with the granted planning permission, have taken longer than anticipated. The stand will be delivered on 11th of February, once the concrete base has been installed. As can be appreciated the recent bad weather has also held up the planned timetable for the contractors.

The proposed changes to the entrance of Brookwood Country Park are to be placed before the Planning Committee next month. If passed, then work would start once the current football season has come to an end.

Once the contractors have started the floodlight installation process, Knaphill FC can look forward to their first floodlit match hopefully in early March. Details of an official 'Opening Game' against invited opposition will also be announced in the near future. Ground Development Manager Nick Croshaw notes, 'After all the hard work put in by the Committee Members of Knaphill FC, supported by Woking Borough Council & The Football Foundation; the final few weeks before the final installation are going to seem to last as long as the four years it has taken to get this far! We would like to thank the local residents for their support and patience during the planning period and we are assured that the installation process will not impact greatly on their day to day lives'.

THE FA INVITES FOOTBALL FANS TO UNITE AGAINST THE GOBBY MORONS AND JOIN RESPECT F.C.

The Football Association has taken a radical new approach to tackling bad behaviour from fans and players by launching its own football club Respect F.C. The aim of the club is not to win silverware or secure a Champions League place; its goal will be to unite fans against the ugly side of the beautiful game to create a safe and enjoyable environment in which it can take place.

Appointing comedian and avid Bristol City fan Mark Watson as Chairman, the Club has been founded through concern from both the top level of the game and the grassroots community around abuse towards referees and poor sideline behaviour. Respect F.C. is not your usual football club; it's a football club made up of people from all walks of life, with one collective goal – to bring Respect back to the game we all love.

For every fan that joins Respect F.C., The FA has pledged to put £1 back into the Respect initiative within grassroots football (up to the value of £50,000). Members of the Club will be able to vote online at www.RespectFootballClub.com to say how this money is used at the end of the 2010/ 2011 season.

Rallying fans to get behind Respect F.C. Chairman Mark Watson has filmed an impassioned plea from the club's modest headquarters, which features starring roles from former Liverpool captain Neil 'Razor' Ruddock, Portsmouth legend Steve Claridge and Sky Sports commentator Chris Kamara.

Depicting the intolerable bad behaviour of a gobby moron, scenes feature Neil Ruddock ruining a child's birthday party by barking abuse at the children's entertainer and singling out the birthday boy for some special attention for passing the parcel too slowly. Muddled with comedy gold, the film also sees player turned football pundit Steve Claridge donning a Strictly Come Dancing style outfit and dancing across a waterlogged pitch. The rousing closing scenes from the Chairman's speech see Mark Watson in unison with football fans wearing white Respect F.C. scarves and joining mascots from Chelsea, Bristol City, Swansea City, Nottingham Forest, Watford, Fulham, Birmingham City, Sheffield Wednesday, and Millwall to show support for the radical new club.

Respect F.C. is not just about raising awareness; it's much more than that. Everyone who is involved in the game in some way is aware of poor behaviour and knows that – be it towards referees, players or fellow fans – it is wrong. The challenge now is to unite, change people's attitudes and make them realise that verbal and physical abuse are not acceptable in the game.

Respect F.C. Chairman, Mark Watson, said: "We know that it's so much easier to take a stand against poor behaviour if you are not on your own, if you have someone else on your team. Collectively we can stand up to the gobby morons. Alex Horne, FA General Secretary, said: "Football fans from all clubs and all leagues have a collective responsibility to let others know that they will not stand for this behaviour from the grassroots of the game up to the international stage. That's why we're asking everyone, to ask everyone, to join the club and together win the match against bad behaviour."

Latest research from The FA has shown that 45% of players, coaches and referees think the Respect programme has improved their experience of the game. The majority of participants surveyed were also aware of the Respect programme's key objectives with 68% recognising that Respect aims to create a safe and enjoyable environment for the game.

WHAT HAPPENED

After seven meetings between these two clubs and 660 minutes of league and cup football, with Staines Lammas winning the first six in the previous two seasons, Knaphill registered their first win over their opponents at the seventh attempt with a 3-1 win at Laleham Recreation Ground on Saturday. It was a deserved success, with Knaphill having the better of the second half to finish worthy winners. It also produced their fourth win from their four away games so far this season.

The first half was scattered with rushed tactics as neither side settled into a settled rhythm, with both guilty of hasty passing and inadequate goal scoring opportunities, although the second half appeared more constructive and fluent, and an impressive showing from Knaphill. Staines Lammas saw their first early chance flash by when Jamie Smithers ball across the face of goal, but not within touching distance of anyone to finish with a shot. Knaphill appeared unfortunate not to have a penalty after 12 minutes, Ricky Hogsden was fouled in the box, but the appeal for a spot kick was negative from the referee.

Knaphill keeper Nick Rogers made a good save on 28 minutes to thwart the home side, the only real dangerous moment he had to deal with during the half. Knaphill took the lead after 36 minutes when Ricky Hogsden latched onto the ball, and from just outside the 18 yard area, rifled in a shot that zapped past the desperate clutches of keeper Daniel Cox. With Knaphill's defence holding firm against whatever the home side had to offer, the visitors held on to their single goal lead until the break.

The second half showed a lot more constructive and attacking football. Staines had three chances in the first eight minutes of the half, but it was the third that counted when in the 51st minute, Smithers gave them the equaliser, although gaining a deflection off defender Mark Tomlinson on the way. Within two minutes, Knaphill took the lead after Nick Darnell was upended in the box and Hogsden calmly slotted home the spot kick past the keeper to make it 2-1. It was his fourth goal in two games, and his seventh of the season, to make him leading goalscorer.

Despite efforts from the home side to haul themselves back in to the game, it was Knaphill whose probing and pressure when pushing forward, brought the third goal after 77 minutes. Chris Fox's swift break led to a perfect cross that found Bradley Cann whose strike made it 3-1. Near the end a couple of neat moves almost paid off for Knaphill, whilst at the other end, Staines Lammas late hopes of getting a second were dashed when Rogers made a good save which kept them at bay.

Youth Development is the major incentive for running an Under 18 Youth side at Knaphill Football Club. As the Youth Team Manager it is my responsibility to work very closely with Dave Freeman and Adie Wilson, 1st Team Managers and Andy Martin, the Reserve Team Manager, to progress players into senior football. Currently we have a large number of players signed to the CCL and I fully expect the youth players to prosper at CCL level. I have always said that Youth football is a superb stepping stone from park football into senior football. It provides a technical education and gives a greater physical challenge. It is not by accident that we continue to work with our contacts in other potential feeder clubs to ensure we have access to their best players in future years. I believe we can compete with the other senior clubs and will over time, offer a better and quicker opportunity for players to enter senior football, within a 10 mile radius of Woking.

Our current squad has a great balance of 15, 16, 17 and 18 year old boys and have now settled as a side into the pace and physicality of this league and can compete with anyone on our day. We face a number of tough games during January and February, many at our temporary home ground at Hanworth Villa. With the recent news that the lights will be in by the end of February is fantastic and we can't wait to play several home games at Redding Way before the season ends.

After a rusty start to the second half of the season against Binfield FC on Wednesday 5th January, when we let a 2-0 lead slip and finished with a 2-2 draw, the Knappers youngsters have continued to work hard in training and remain focused for the challenge ahead. We welcome Thatcham Town this coming Wednesday 26th January, kick off at Hanworth Villa FC is 7.45pm. We are already planning for next season with Knaphill entering a side into the Arsenal International Invitation Tournament again in July 2011. We will also continue next year with the same philosophy and commitment to developing our boys over the 2 years they are with us. This still remains as our primary focus and I look forward to watching our youngsters develop and prosper.

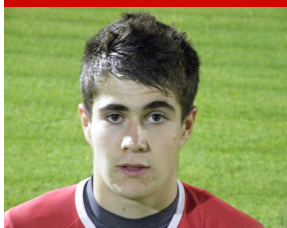

Remember the football song 'Football's Coming Home'? Well, football certainly did at Redding Way on Saturday when Knaphill returned to their home ground for the first time in 11 weeks, and marked the 'homecoming' with a convincing win. Following a goalless first forty five minutes, four goals in the second half, completed a league double over visitors Warlingham this season.

A bit of a frustrating first half for Knaphill, who created a number of chances, several of which were thwarted, not only in the first, but second period too, by goalkeeper Daniel Eaton. First scoring opportunity for the home side came in the fourth minute when Craig Parrington's 25 yard effort was tipped over by the keeper. Then three minutes later, Matt Baker's free kick was spilled by Eaton, who quickly retrieved the ball to deny the striker.

The opening spell produced some fast pace football from both sides. Tom Davis fired in a Knaphill effort from 18 yards, which was well covered by the keeper. Although Knaphill were creating some good openings and opportunities,

Warlingham also produced a few anxious moments for the home defence as the half wore on. Nick Darnell's header for Knaphill, was gathered just short of dipping under the bar, before Ricky Hogsden saw his blistering shot parried away after 25 minutes.

In the 27th minute, Warlingham were reduced to ten men when James Ang was sent off for a foul on home defender Nathan Miles. Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley was well tested by the visitors after 34 minutes, having to tip away a goalbound effort. Knaphill, who continued to press for an opening goal, were still unable to find a way past the visitors keeper as the first half ended goalless.

The deadlock was broken in the 58th minute when Daniel Cox threaded the perfect pass through to Darnell who took his chance well to fire into the far corner of goal to give Knaphill the lead. Following another effort on goal from Davis, Knaphill increased their lead as Baker worked his way into space, and from the edge of the 18 yard box drilled home to make it 2-0.

Two minutes later, Parrington's seering drive from 25 yards was pushed over by Eaton as Knaphill entered the last twenty minutes, their play flowing well. But despite Knaphill looking comfortable with their two goal lead, a couple of good chances were spurned by Warlingham, as the visitors were looking to pull a goal back.

But extended pressure paid off for Knaphill, and near the end of the game, two goals came in time added on, when Baker's shot was partially saved by Eaton, leaving Hogsden to glide the ball home from close range, then Parrington finished off the scoring with a well flighted lobbed effort that beat the keeper from 35 yards to seal the win for Knaphill, in only their second league game in the space of six weeks.
