Good evening everyone, and welcome to our opponents Warlingham, their players and officials, also tonight's three match officials for this Division One Challenge Cup 2nd round tie. It's the first of two meetings this month between the two Clubs, the next will be in the league on Saturday 22nd October. Our two meetings with Warlingham in the league last season saw a share of the points in the 2-2 draw away, and our opponents winning 2-0 in the game at Redding Way.

Our last game here was a week ago against Premier Division side Epsom & Ewell in another Cup competition, the Premier Challenge Cup. But despite a battling performance which got the home side level at 2-2 with goals from Perry Coles and Craig Knowles, Knaphill lost 3-2.

Last Saturday Warlingham won 3-1 away at CB Hounslow, whilst Knaphill suffered their seventh successive defeat(four in the league, three in Cup competition), when they were beaten 5-2 by basement club Frimley Green. Trailing 3-1 at halftime, Knappers goal coming from Craig Knowles after 25 minutes, and Frimley scored two more in the second half, with Ricky Hogsden scoring our second goal on 47 minutes.

An alarming 31 goals have now been conceded in those seven games over the past month, nineteen in the league. Not a productive month, but what can be done to stem the tide? Knaphill have never leaked so many goals in one month since we have been in the Combined Counties League. Yes, the team have scored twelve goals in that period, but alas when you concede so many, scoring goals become very little consolation when there is nothing to show for it, especially concerning league points.

The recent performance against Epsom and Ewell was an improvement in form after defeats by Staines Lammas and Spelthorne Sports, but then four days later slump to the defeat at Frimley Green. It is now crucial that results need to produce a turn around to halt slipping down the league table, sooner than later.

Looking back on other Division One results last Saturday, one surprise was Guernsey losing their first match of the season in the 2-1 defeat by Spelthorne Sports, whilst at Woking Park, Westfield were hammered 6-1 by Hartley Wintney.

Knaphill Reserves moved up to second place in their Division on Saturday following the 4-2 home win over Sheerwater Reserves. The visitors took an early lead, but after 19 minutes Jonny Philips equalised for Knaphill, and the lead was increased as they showed their supremacy when George Pearce drove a free kick into the far corner of goal in the 27th minute. Five minutes later is was 3-1, Lennie Harding the scorer.

Both teams had chances in the second half, each scoring a goal. Perry Coles cross to Josh Hughes gave the latter an easy task of tapping the ball home to make it 4-1, before Sheerwater got their second soon after. A well deserved victory for Knaphill who have now won four and drawn three of their eight league games this season.

Back to the first team, and they now have two successive home league games coming up at Redding Way – this Saturday(15^{th}) Cobham are the visitors, then Warlingham return for a League game on Saturday 22^{nd} October.

Well, on Tuesday night Knaphill's Premier Challenge Cup tie against Epsom and Ewell provided plenty of new faces in their line-up with just three players that started the season in the squad that came up against the Premier Division club at Redding Way.

The rest of the squad, newcomers to the team, all hoping to show their footballing talent on the night. Two of Knaphill's regular players, Chris Fox and Joe Turner, were out injured following the weekend game against Spelthorne Sports, and their replacements were just two of the new contingent.



It stayed even until the 75th minute when Epsom substitute Nathan Ayling put the visitors in front for the third time, a lead they held onto until the final whistle, to give them a passage through to the next round.

Warlingham F.C – A Brief History

Warlingham F.C was founded in 1896 and is affiliated to the Surrey F.A. The clubs base is at Church Lane, Warlingham where they moved in the early twenties. At this time they amalgamated with Warlingham C.C to form Warlingham Sports Club.

In the early years the team played at various local venues including Blanchman's field (now a nature reserve), the School field just past the green, and what are now allotments off Hillbury Road. The current Church Lane site was left to the people of Warlingham for the pursuit of sport and is now used to support our 13 junior teams and our "A", "B", and 2 Veterans teams.

For the coming season 2011-2012 we have again entered into a ground sharing agreement with Ryman South team Whyteleafe having spent an enjoyable year there last season. This allows us to retain our position in the Combined Counties league and pursue promotion to the CCL premier division. We will continue to look for alternative local sites to build our own facility to meet the ever increasing demands of the Football Association.

Our reserve team and new "C" team will play at Verdayne (Hamsey Green Playing Field), which was leased, from Tandridge District Council in March 2004 specifically to allow us to gain promotion to the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties league.

In our long history we have gained virtually every honour available in Intermediate football and also achieved success at the next level having won the Combined Counties Div 1 title in season 05/06 and the Reserve section in both 04/05 and 06/07. Last season we entered the FA Vase for the first time and embarked on another exciting chapter in our history, reaching the 2nd round proper and finally losing 1-0 to Reading Town F.C. This year we will make history again with our first entry into the FA Cup.

In September 2008 we completed work on a new floodlit Astro training facility which has improved what we can offer our members in both our adult and colts sections.

Season 10/11 was a disappointing year for our adult teams with them all closing the year in strong positions in their respective leagues and then falling away in the New Year.

Our Colts section continues to go from strength to strength and we are beginning to see the very real benefit of players coming through into the senior teams. Last year we ran 13 Colts teams and the U11's B won the Tandridge South Division. The U12's A won the Tandridge League Cup. The U13's won the Epsom Premier Division and the U14's won the Epsom League Division 1 with the U15's gaining promotion to the Epsom League Division 1. Our Soccer School has also proved successful and has already created new teams in Mini Soccer for the Colts section.

We ran 6 senior teams during season 2010-11 and will add another team for 2011-2012. With our Colts section running 13 teams we will start the season bigger than we have ever been in our history – again!

Warlingham F.C. is a "community" club providing football for local people from age 4 through to Veterans and look forward to the future with excitement and determination as we strive for further success across all our teams.

This season we will be working hard to achieve the FA's Charter Standard accreditation.

After an unsteady start to their season, the U18's managed by Gary Taylor and Mark Dawber, have settled into winning ways. The season started with former manager Dougie Ford having to withdraw at late notice due to work commitments and Reserve Team Assistant Manager steeping into his shoes at very short notice.

The season began with a trip to Bracknell Town where Knaphill struck early on with a goal from Jack Bailey-Caulfield settled early nerves; however Knaphill's defensive frailty reared its ugly head. In a mad 10 minute spell, The Knappers concede two sloppy goals and despite having the majority of the play thereafter, an equaliser was not forthcoming. Their second game was away to Thatcham Town, and on a cold and misty evening a poor performance saw two early gilt-edged chances go begging and mistakes at the back and in midfield let Thatcham go 4-0 up by the hour mark. A smart lob from Josh Hughes was the only consolation from a disappointing match.

More agony followed with a trip to Ascot United and after dominating the first half and taking a 2-1 lead courtesy of a Josh Hughes thunderbolt and Harry Maynard's superb dribble and shot, the same defensive errors crept back in. The final scoreline of 2-5 didn't reflect on the majority of the play, but the score-line does not lie. The season turned on 45 crazy seconds at Sandhurst Town on another misty evening at Bottom Meadow. With Knaphill 1-2 down with 4 minutes injury time on the clock and the result being reported as such, a long ball from goalkeeper Craig Taylor found Haluna Masembe on the half way line, the quick striker shrugged off his defender and surged forward to hit a rasping shot from the edge of the box for a deserved equaliser.

From the Sandhurst kick-off, Liam Welsh thundered into a tackle springing the ball to Haluna's feet, he sprinted forward, steadied himself and slotted the ball past the advancing keeper for the winner. Josh Hughes scored the opening Knaphill goal in the first half.

With this boost in confidence the team travelled to Alton Town for the fifth consecutive away game and dominated throughout, Josh Hughes provided the winner just before the half hour mark, but two performances stand out. Firstly Craig Taylor who had an inspired game in gaol saving from point-blank range on a number of occasions and Man-of-the-Match, Johnny Phillips, who was immense in the centre of midfield cutting out the Alton attacking options and providing the catalyst for many of the Knaphill's counter -attacks.

It is gratifying to see a number of the youth team already making their mark in adult football with the 1st and Reserve teams already this season and this is the reason for Knaphill to be justifiably proud of their youngsters.

One of our aims is to build a reserve side that all players have the potential to move up, I believe we now have that.

Jimmy Edwick, our recent signing from Hanworth Villa, has come in performed well in goal, giving us a winning mentality on and off the pitch. In front of him Sean Harvey and Mark Harding are building a very sold partnership in the middle of our defence and Saturday we had the luxury of playing George Pearce, ex Chertsey Town, alongside the highly rated youth player Johnny Philips in midfield. With all these players six foot plus it was no surprise that we scored twice against Sheerwater from corners and always looked a threat from set pieces. Full back Lloyd Greenfield and youth lad Ross Greaney both added to a solid defensive unit.

In midfield Lennie Harding has been very consistent, scoring important goals and he adds quality to complement his fully committed approach. Perry Coles, another new signing this season, is a player blessed with genuine natural ability and was involved in all four goals in our last game. Up front Shane Cummins gives us pace and aggression. As he develops he will be an even greater threat and should be able to push onto the next level. His strike partner on Saturday was 16 year old Josh Hughes who has scored four goals in the last five youth games and two goals in two games in the reserves. Another player with pace and aggression who at 16 years old is physically able to compete at senior level. Lloyd Pearman, Callum Slattery, Sean Smith all youth players gave us strong options on the bench and while we have to balance their youth football to ensure we don't overplay them we have the luxury of players that have, this season, already travelled to difficult places like Alton Town and come away with great victories.


