



Welcome to Redding Way

Good evening everyone, and welcome to the players and officials from Warlingham, also tonight's three officials and all supporters for this our penultimate home league game of the season. Our previous meeting with Warlingham was back at the beginning of September, the game finishing in a 2-2 draw, our goals coming from Jack Ball and Ricky Hogsden.

Reflecting on the past week's football, has seen our tremendous sixteen match unbeaten run halted by Hartley Wintney last Friday night at the Memorial Ground where we lost 2-1, our first defeat since the end of November. The unbeaten run reached a club record which included thirteen wins and three draws. Our previous unbeaten sequence came in the early months of last year when we had twelve successive wins. But the recent run has been a credit to the team and for the joint team managers of David Freeman and Adie Wilson, who took over the managerial reins from Bob Pritchard following his resignation after the Farnham game last November.

In last Friday's game, Knaphill conceded a goal after only six minutes, but battled back for Joe Turner to score the equaliser in the 20th minute. Prior to that we lost Chris Fox with a hamstring injury as play in the first half continued with both sides expressing attacking football.

Knaphill showed a lot of commitment and created a number of goal scoring chances in the second half, and at least three efforts should have brought some reward. Despite all those efforts though, it was to remain all square at 1-1 until the 77th minute. But it was not Knaphill's fortune, but that of Hartley Wintney who were the beneficiary of a second goal for what proved to be the winner that brought our unbeaten run to an end. Three days previously Chobham were the visitors to Redding Way, and for Knaphill's fourth successive home game it was another three points in the 3-1 win. Chobham took the lead shortly before halftime, but Knaphill's equaliser came on 57 minutes with a terrific strike from Ed Cardona, and they went onto seal the game with two goals from Ricky Hogsden in the 88th and 90th minutes, to move into fifth place in the table. Match reports on both the Chobham and Hartley Wintney games elsewhere in the programme.

Two of our other teams were in action last week, the Youth U18s booked a place in the final of the Grant McLellan Cup with a 3-1 semi-final win over Cobham with goals from Dan Kelly, Sam Wilson and Bradley Fraser. Knaphill now meet Bedfont Sports in the final at Ashford Town FC on Thursday 28th April. Our Reserves were in action last Thursday and Saturday, losing 3-2 at home to Farnham Town Reserves, and held to a goalless draw at home to CB Hounslow respectively.

Now we go into the final two weeks of the 2010/11 season, and after tonight we have three more games to play. This Saturday Knaphill are away to one of the season's league newcomers, Hayes Gate(playing at Hanwell Town FC) kick-off 3pm, and is followed by our last away fixture in the visit to Worcester Park on Easter Monday 25th April kick off 1130am, with the final game of the season taking place at Redding Way on Tuesday 3rd May when the visitors will be Farnborough North End Kick off 7.30pm.

Back to tonight, as we look for to an entertaining encounter.

It's been another long season once again with many ups and downs at the club but thankfully the second half of the campaign we have shown the division what we are all about and hopefully we can now carry on and push for promotion next season. The players have been brilliant and there attitude has been spot on. Warlingham F.C – A Brief History

Warlingham F.C was founded in 1896 and is affiliated to the Surrey F.A. The clubs base is at Church Lane, Warlingham where they moved in the early twenties. At this time they amalgamated with Warlingham C.C to form Warlingham Sports Club.

In the early years the team played at various local venues. The current Church Lane site was left to the people of Warlingham for the pursuit of sport and is now used to support our 16 junior teams and our "A", "B" and 2 Veterans teams.

For the coming season 2010-2011 we have entered into a ground sharing agreement with Ryman South team Whyteleafe having spent an enjoyable year at Merstham last season. This allows us to retain our position in the Combined Counties league and pursue promotion to the CCL premier division. It will allow us to move closer to our real home at Warlingham and hopefully boost our support. We will continue to look for alternative local sites to build our own facility to meet the ever increasing demands of the Football Association.

Our reserve team will continue to play at Verdayne (Hamsey Green Playing Field), which was leased, from Tandridge District Council in March 2004 specifically to allow us to gain promotion to the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties league.

In our long history we have gained virtually every honour available in Intermediate football and also achieved success at the next level having won the Combined Counties Div 1 title in season 05/06 and the Reserve section in both 04/05 and 06/07. This season we have entered the FA Vase for the first time and embarked on another exciting chapter in our history, reaching the 2nd round proper and finally losing 1-0 to Reading Town F.C.

In September 2008 we completed work on a new floodlit Astro training facility which has improved what we can offer our members in both our adult and colts sections.

Season 09/10 was a successful year with 3 of our adult teams winning the league ("B" Team/Vets "A" & Vets "B"). We also had some near misses with the Reserves losing on penalties in the Challenge Cup and the Vets "A" losing in the Sutton Vets Cup final. However, they did win the Vets Charity Cup.

Our Colts section goes from strength to strength and we are beginning to see the very real benefit of players coming through into the senior teams. Last year we ran 11 Colts teams and 3 had successful cup runs which ended in victory (U18/U11/U10). Our Soccer School has also proved successful and has started to feed the Colts section with new teams at 7x7 level.

We ran 6 senior teams during season 2009-10 and are doing so again during 2010-2011. Our Colts section has grown again to 13 teams which means that yet again we will start a season bigger than we have ever been in our history.

Warlingham F.C. is a "community" club providing football for local people from age 6 through to Veterans and look forward to the future with excitement and determination as we strive for further success across all our teams.

LAST SEASON HERE

Remember the football song 'Football's Coming Home'? Well, football certainly did at Redding Way the last time the two sides met here when Knaphill returned to their home ground for the first time in 11 weeks, and marked the 'homecoming' with a convincing win. Following a goalless first forty five minutes, four goals in the second half, completed a league double over visitors Warlingham this season.

A bit of a frustrating first half for Knaphill, who created a number of chances, several of which were thwarted, not only in the first, but second period too, by goalkeeper Daniel Eaton. First scoring opportunity for the home side came in the fourth minute when Craig Parrington's 25 yard effort was tipped over by the keeper. Then three minutes later, Matt Baker's free kick was spilled by Eaton, who quickly retrieved the ball to deny the striker.

The opening spell produced some fast pace football from both sides. Tom Davis fired in a Knaphill effort from 18 yards, which was well covered by the keeper. Although Knaphill were creating some good openings and opportunities, Warlingham also produced a few anxious moments for the home defence as the half wore on. Nick Darnell's header for Knaphill, was gathered just short of dipping under the bar, before Ricky Hogsden saw his blistering shot parried away after 25 minutes.



In the 27th minute, Warlingham were reduced to ten men when James Ang was sent off for a foul on home defender Nathan Miles. Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley was well tested by the visitors after 34 minutes, having to tip away a goalbound effort. Knaphill, who continued to press for an opening goal, were still unable to find a way past the visitors keeper as the first half ended goalless.

The deadlock was broken in the 58th minute when Daniel Cox threaded the perfect pass through to Darnell who took his chance well to fire into the far corner of goal to give Knaphill the lead. Following another effort on goal from Davis, Knaphill increased their lead as Baker worked his way into space, and from the edge of the 18 yard box drilled home to make it 2-0.

Two minutes later, Parrington's seering drive from 25 yards was pushed over by Eaton as Knaphill entered the last twenty minutes, their play flowing well. But despite Knaphill looking comfortable with their two goal lead, a couple of good chances were spurned by Warlingham, as the visitors were looking to pull a goal back.

But extended pressure paid off for Knaphill, and near the end of the game, two goals came in time added on, when Baker's shot was partially saved by Eaton, leaving Hogsden to glide the ball home from close range, then Parrington finished off the scoring with a well flighted lobbed effort that beat the keeper from 35 yards to seal the win for Knaphill, in only their second league game in the space of six weeks.

MATCH REPORT

Friday April 15th 2011 Hartley Wintney 2 Knaphill 1 Combined Counties Division One



All Good Things Have To Come To An End...Sometime!

Knaphill's sixteen match unbeaten run came to an end with a 2-1 defeat by Hartley Wintney at the Memorial Ground on Friday night. The excellent run, which had included 13 wins and 3 draws, reaped forty two points from a possible forty eight. It was Knaphill's first defeat since the end of November last year.

Knaphill had to battle back from going a goal down after only six minutes when Jermaine Hamilton's shot from across the 18 yard box, nestled into the far corner of goal, as the home side made early attacks on the visitors goal. But Knaphill, who lost Chris Fox with a hamstring injury after sixteen minutes, started to force their way back, and went close to scoring in the 18th minute when Matt Baker's shot was saved low down at the keeper's near post and away for a corner.

Two minutes later, Nick Darnell slipped the ball through to Joe Turner who, from 18 yards, found a gap in defence to drive the ball into the corner of goal for the equaliser. It certainly gave the visitors a lift, and Ricky Hogsden had a chance blocked with the follow up by Darnell fired over the bar as Knaphill livened up.

Substitute James Wills saw his effort fly over the bar, and in the 29th minute, Baker's free kick failed to dip enough, also going over. Both sides were in attacking mode and creating chances for the remainder of the half, and Hartley Wintney went close after 36 minutes with a free kick that zipped past the far post.

Neither side were able to provide too much danger in the opening minutes of the second half, but Knaphill soon began to dominate with some good football and commitment, creating numerous chances. Ed Cardona's shot in the 59th minute veered past the post, but the striker missed a sitter when from just a few yards out and an open goal, ballooned over after 68 minutes.

Whilst defending well, Knaphill continued to press home their attacking quality, but it was the end product that proved their misfortune. It was a quick break from the home side in the 77th minute that saw Hamilton burst down the middle with defender Gavin Brainch on his heels, but as Shelley advanced, the striker side stepped round him to slot home his and Hartley Wintney's second goal.

Six minutes later, Shelley made a fine save to deny Williams free kick, whilst in the final five minutes of the game, Knaphill pushed everyone forward to press hard for an equaliser, but despite their efforts, Knaphill's unbeaten run had been halted by the Hampshire side. Knaphill now face Warlingham at home next Tuesday in their penultimate home league game of the season.

Since joining Knaphill in season 2009/10, Chris Fox has featured in the majority of matches over the past two seasons, which has seen him make thirty seven appearances for the first team and scoring fifteen goals in season 2009/10, whilst to date this season, has made thirty appearances with seven goals.

Chris, a Carpenter by trade, was born in Frimley on 1st June 1985, and like a few other Knaphill players, started playing football at a very early age. In Chris's case, it was seven years old, when he joined one of the top local Junior clubs Meadow Sports, a club that he stayed with right through to the under 15s. During that time, Chris was involved with various age groups that had won four League titles, League Cup and County Cup. Chris started his playing position at right back on joining Meadow Sports, but in future clubs he moved into midfield from his first season with Ockham, and has been a midfield player ever since.

After his nine years with Meadow Sports, Chris missed one season of football before joining Ockham who were playing in the Surrey Intermediate League, and was there for two years from 2004.

Staying with local clubs, the next move saw Chris staying with Surrey Intermediate League football by moving onto to play for Woking and Horsell joining them in the 2006/07 season for two years, one of those seasons saw the team win the League Cup. Stepping up another level, Chris joined Farnborough Town for one season in 2008/09.

Chris has been enjoying his football at Knaphill over the past two seasons, the first of which saw the team finish in third place last season. When asked what he thought went wrong in the first part of this season up to the end of November with the team form and results, he thought the players were feeling under pressure from Assistant manager Simon Bates, and Manager Bob Pritchard was possibly losing interest in the way the results had been going.

But since David Freeman and Adie Wilson had taken over the Managerial reins, together with coach Neil Woodyer, it's been more relaxed with everyone enjoying their football again throughout the team. That has certainly shown with the results the team have produced since the beginning of this year, going sixteen matches unbeaten, before they suffered their first defeat since the end of November 2010, losing 2-1 at Hartley Wintney last Friday.

Outside football, Chris has other sporting interests with some Golf and Sailing, whilst back on the football front here at Knaphill, Chris says the team are going in the right direction, and enhanced by the installation of the floodlights, they can be looking forward to being a strong force to be challenging for a promotion place in the 2011/12 season, which he hopes the current squad can all look forward to.




