Too say the last few weeks have been tough for everyone involved at the club is a massive understatement however, my view there is always someone worse off then you so sometimes you just have to get on with things in life and our current situation is one of them.



all the latest news from redding way

Good afternoon everyone. Today we welcome Warlingham, their players and officials, for this second visit to Redding Way this season having played us in the Division One Challenge Cup only 11 days ago, which they won 3-0. The League encounter this afternoon makes it another crucial game in an attempt kick start our season again and break the disappointing sequence of results.

Last weekend's results involving both of today's teams, saw Warlingham lose 3-2 to Staines Lammas in the Premier Challenge Cup, whilst Knaphill suffered a 6-0 defeat by Cobham. Earlier this week, Knaphill team manager Adie Wilson resigned his position at the Club.

It's not nice to look at statistics, but the Cobham game was the ninth successive loss in League and Cup games between 10th September and 15th October with 40 goals conceded during that spell, our worst ever sequence over a five week period. Player wise, just two of the team that played in the last meeting with Cobham back in February, were in Saturday's starting line-up. The match saw some woeful defending by Knaphill as they found themselves trailing 4-0 after 28 minutes, with two more scored in the second half.

The Club are currently in their lowest League position since joining the Combined Counties League in 2007. Unfortunately some players have left, there's been an influx of new players over a period, and what's needed from the current squad, is to obtain an injection of more urgency, endeavour and skill into their game. Overall this is a good Club which has brought us good recognition on the pitch in the past and we would like to rekindle that high standard.

With a third of the league programme now past – another 22 games remaining. there's only one way the team should be heading, and that's onwards and upwards. Let's prove just that on the pitch. Knaphill have just one Cup competition remaining this season, the Surrey Premier Cup in November. But at this stage that's not so important as our League programme and is by far the most urgent to focus on.

Brighter news from our Youth U18s who on Monday cruised to a comfortable 4-0 win over Horley Town Youth U18s in the Midweek Floodlit Cup, with goals from Harry Maynard, Lloyd Pearman, Harrison Deacon, and Josh Hughes. Knaphill will be away to Walton and Hersham in the next round.

The team were in action again on Wednesday night, this time in the 1st round of the Grant McLellan Youth Cup. Another good performance in an entertaining game with Knaphill having a 6-3 win over Guildford City Youth U18s. Trailing 1-0 after 15 minutes, Knaphill battled back and equalised through Liam Welch after 32 minutes, and on the stroke of halftime, Welch added a second. Dominating a vast amount of the second half, Knaphill stormed to a 6-1 lead with goals from Harrison Deacon, Jonny Philips and two from Josh Hughes in a 17 minute spell. Guildford City reduced the arrears with two goals, but the night belonged to Knaphill ending up 6-3 winners.

Today is the last home fixture at Redding Way until we play Bookham on Tuesday 22nd November. Next Saturday(29th) Knaphill are away to League newcomers South Kilburn. Looking ahead, there are five away fixtures in November: Horley Town Res. (Tues. 2 Nov.) Spelthorne Sports(Sat.5 Nov.) Bedfont Sports (Sat.12 Nov.) CB Hounslow(Sat.19 Nov.) and Sheerwater(Sat.26 Nov).

The home game against Guernsey which was scheduled for Saturday 10 December, has now been brought forward to the Friday night, 9th December kick-off 7.30pm.

Well that's it for now......Enjoy the game......

saturday october 15 2011 **Knaphill 0 Cobham 6**Combined Counties League Division One



What a difference the last time these two teams met back in February, when Knaphill, in the middle of a 16 match unbeaten run, were comfortable 3-1 winners. But at Redding Way on Saturday, it was Knaphill that contributed to make it a comfortable win for their opponents as the home defence gave Cobham an easy passage to waltz through, the visitors scoring four goals in the first twenty eight minutes of the first half. Two more goals completed the rout in the second half. From that previous meeting eight months ago, Ricky Hogsden and Chris Fox were the only Knaphill players to feature in this game.

Cobham took a two goal lead within the first 11 minutes, Pat Kirby given plenty of space to score from 20 yards in the ninth minute, then Jake Baxter made it 2-0 from just outside the 18 yard box two minutes later. Kirby was the provider for Baxter to net the third goal in the 18th minute, and got his hat trick from the edge of the six yard box into the far corner to make it 4-0 after 28 minutes.

Knaphill were finding it difficult to recover from this early blitz, which was making it difficult to battle back into the game with limited chances up front. Paul Wetherall had two late in the half, one that went wide of the far post and the other over the bar.

Again in the second half, Knaphill had limited chances to reduce the arrears, whilst Cobham, with further goals in the 57th minute from Baxter scoring his fourth, and Scott Day rounding off the scoring with the sixth after 70 minutes.

Not a good afternoon in any way shape or form for Knaphill, and with a third of the League programme behind them, now face a crucial few weeks of the need to recover from their recent string of results and start turning their season around, having gone nine league and cup games without a win. An unusual scenario for Knaphill during the time since they joined the Combined Counties League back in 2007.

Warlingham F.C - A Brief History

Warlingham F.C was founded in 1896 and is affiliated to the Surrey F.A. The clubs base is at Church Lane, Warlingham where they moved in the early twenties. At this time they amalgamated with Warlingham C.C to form Warlingham Sports Club.

In the early years the team played at various local venues including Blanchman's field (now a nature reserve), the School field just past the green, and what are now allotments off Hillbury Road. The current Church Lane site was left to the people of Warlingham for the pursuit of sport and is now used to support our 13 junior teams and our "A", "B", and 2 Veterans teams.

For the coming season 2011-2012 we have again entered into a ground sharing agreement with Ryman South team Whyteleafe having spent an enjoyable year there last season. This allows us to retain our position in the Combined Counties league and pursue promotion to the CCL premier division. We will continue to look for alternative local sites to build our own facility to meet the ever increasing demands of the Football Association.

Our reserve team and new "C" team will play at Verdayne (Hamsey Green Playing Field), which was leased, from Tandridge District Council in March 2004 specifically to allow us to gain promotion to the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties league.

In our long history we have gained virtually every honour available in Intermediate football and also achieved success at the next level having won the Combined Counties Div 1 title in season 05/06 and the Reserve section in both 04/05 and 06/07. Last season we entered the FA Vase for the first time and embarked on another exciting chapter in our history, reaching the 2^{nd} round proper and finally losing 1-0 to Reading Town F.C. This year we will make history again with our first entry into the FA Cup.

In September 2008 we completed work on a new floodlit Astro training facility which has improved what we can offer our members in both our adult and colts sections.

Season 10/11 was a disappointing year for our adult teams with them all closing the year in strong positions in their respective leagues and then falling away in the New Year.

Our Colts section continues to go from strength to strength and we are beginning to see the very real benefit of players coming through into the senior teams. Last year we ran 13 Colts teams and the U11's B won the Tandridge South Division. The U12's A won the Tandridge League Cup. The U13's won the Epsom Premier Division and the U14's won the Epsom League Division 1 with the U15's gaining promotion to the Epsom League Division 1. Our Soccer School has also proved successful and has already created new teams in Mini Soccer for the Colts section.

We ran 6 senior teams during season 2010-11 and will add another team for 2011-2012. With our Colts section running 13 teams we will start the season bigger than we have ever been in our history – again!

Warlingham F.C. is a "community" club providing football for local people from age 4 through to Veterans and look forward to the future with excitement and determination as we strive for further success across all our teams.

This season we will be working hard to achieve the FA's Charter Standard accreditation.


