Saturday 1st December Kick Off 3.00pm Vale Farm Combined Counties League Division One

It was certainly not the best of afternoons for quality entertaining football – far from it. Apart from the five goal defeat Knaphill suffered, the scoreline of which flattered the home side, the visitors found themselves trailing by two early goals, had a player sent off after twenty minutes, whilst the Referee produced a number of questionable decisions throughout the match in general, which didn't help the overall flow of the game.

Forced to field another changed line-up, the visitors conceded two goals initiated by some slack defending in the first seven minutes, giving themselves an early battle in trying to make their mark on the game. Sandwiched in between those goals, Knaphill went close to reducing the arrears when Charlie Postance shot hit the post and Phil Ruggles latched onto the rebound to fire past the keeper, but was ruled offside.

A few minutes later Sam Dennison saw his effort in the 11th minute fly over the bar, and James Felgate appeared to have an ideal opportunity to score, but with space between post and keeper, drove the ball straight at the latter. Dennison's afternoon was over after just 19 minutes when he was sent off for dissent, leaving Knaphill with an even bigger uphill struggle to get back into the game with ten men for the rest of the match. Opportunities were wasted by both sides during the rest of the half as the hosts held onto their two goal advantage.

South Kilburn increased their lead with a third goal after 68 minutes, and made it 4-0 in the 75th minute, an effort which looked suspiciously offside. The home side rounded off the scoring with a fifth goal in the last few minutes, and a win that put them back on top of Division One.

For Knaphill, the early goals, playing three quarters of the game with ten men, and with the need of cutting edge to their game, they must now be concerned of the current form which is need of much improvement if they are to lift themselves out of the bottom three where they now have gained just ten points from 16 league matches.

Next Saturday sees the halfway stage of their League programme when they play hosts to third placeWestfield, in a tough and challenging local derby at Redding Way.

Knaphill's hopes of progressing to the semi-final stage of this competition were dashed in Tuesday night's Cup tie against Feltham. After a bit of a shaky start, they had taken a 2-1 lead just before the half hour mark, which they held onto well into the second half. But with Matt Edwards being sent off after 65 minutes, the face of the game changed and swung back in Feltham's favour as the home side went onto take the initiative away from their visitors, and in the end, secure a semi-final place.

In a similar way to Knaphill's start of their match at South Kilburn on Saturday, this Cup tie saw the visitors concede an early soft goal when Feltham's Ben Payne was allowed space to make it 1-0 after just five minutes. Knaphill settled into their stride, after gaining an equaliser after twelve minutes. It came when a Charlie Postance shot was partially saved by the keeper, and appearing to have crossed the line, but he only managed to clear the ball as far as the oncoming Phil Ruggles who slotted home from close range.


After twenty minutes Postance had a fierce drive parried away for a corner, and just a minute earlier Edwards had a goalbound effort ruled out for offside. But by now Knaphill were showing more urgency in their play and in the 27th minute, Ruggles was fouled in the 18 yard box and from the resultant penalty the striker gave Knaphill a 2-1 lead. Having recovered from that early Feltham goal, Knaphill's game pattern continued to improve with more confidence, which saw out the remainder of the first half and continue into the second period.

Ruggles had a great chance to increase his sides lead but his weak effort wassaved by the home keeper. Just after the hour mark, Paul Johnson had a shot just wide, but after Edwards was shown the red card after 65 minutes and Knaphill were down to ten men, the game changed as the visitors lost some of their momentum, and Feltham began to battle their way back into the game and put pressure on the Knaphill defence, with Jamal Gohil equalising to make it 2-2 after 72 minutes.

Knaphill spurned a couple of chances to forge into the lead, but with more pressure on their defence, it was Feltham who scored two more goals, one a penalty, before a late push from the visitors secured Knaphill's third from Charlie Postance in the 89th minute. But with just a few minutes of stoppage time added, a final challenge by the visitors failed to take the game into extra time, the damage had been done, and Knaphill were out of the Challenge Cup.

Good afternoon everyone and a warm welcome to Westfield, their players, officials and supporters for this local derby encounter, the second one between the two teams at Redding Way this season. Welcome also to the three match officials, Andy Brathwaite, Roger Inions, and Paul Sanders.

Formwise, Westfield are way ahead of Knaphill in that area, with today's meeting virtually a bottom three club versus a top three club. Last time the two teams met was at the beginning of October when goals from Craig Knowles and Charlie Postance gave Knaphill a 2-1 win after extra time to go through to the 3rd round of the Division One Challenge Cup. Since then, Knaphill's disappointing statistics shows they have lost five league games, been knocked out of four Cup competitions, and won just two league games.

Up until last weekend, Westfield had a spell at the top of Division One, but after last Saturday's results, dropped to third place following the 2-2 draw at home to Mole Valley, and have gained 37 points from 16 games. But it's currently tight at the top of the table with Frimley Green, the on having games in hand over Westfield and new leaders South Kilburn. Frimley are on 37 points from 14 games after their 2-1 win at Cobham at the weekend. Knaphill contributed to South Kilburn taking top spot following Knappers 5-0 away defeat on Saturday. Down at the other end of Division One, Farleigh 10pts from 12 games, Knaphill 10pts from 16, and CB Hounslow 3pts from 16 games. Three days after the League defeat by South Kilburn, Knaphill were at Feltham on Tuesday night in the 3rd round of the Division One Challenge Cup, but made their exit from the competition losing 4-3. After trailing to an early Feltham goal, Knaphill began to step up a gear and after an equaliser from Phil Ruggles, they forged ahead to take a deserved 2-1 lead from a penalty in the first half. But after Matt Edwards was sent off after 65 minutes, it was Feltham who began to step up the pace and made it 2-2. They netted two more for a 4-2 lead before Charlie Postance scored Knaphill's third near the end. But after losing some momentum after Edwards sending off, it was not enough to save Knaphill from their Cup exit.

Our last home game at Redding Way was three weeks ago with a 2-0 defeat by Cobham. Prior to that, was the home game against Feltham, and I remember it well – Knaphill won! Two goals from Phil Ruggles gave us maximum points, but in the two games played since then, no goals no points. The scheduled away game against Epsom Athletic two weeks ago, was called off due to a waterlogged pitch. That brought us up to the beginning of December and last weekend's visit to play South Kilburn. A tough one to approach, and against a team who have only lost one league game from 17 played this season, and have the second best defence conceding 14 goals in that period. NTRODUCING WESTFIELD FC



The Club was formed in 1953 as Westfield Boys Club playing in the Woking and District League and also running a youth team. From the start the Club had success in the competitions entered. Among the trophy's won in the early years were the Surrey Youth Invitation Cup in 1953/54, the Surrey Junior Charity Cup in 1954/55 and 1955/56, the Surrey Junior Cup at the first attempt in 1955/56 and the Surrey Youth Cup in 1956/57.

Following several seasons in local league football the Club made the break into Surrey Intermediate Football using the present ground at Woking Park, Kingfield. Successes soon came and, after becoming League Champions and League Cup winners on several occasions in the subsequent seasons, the Club decided to apply for senior status. The application was accepted in 1964 and after one season in the Parthenon League, Westfield met the necessary ground grading requirements and joined the Surrey Senior League.

Westfield's future success in senior football sprang from their ability to attract the best local youngsters and they were successful in winning the Surrey Youth Cup again in 1966/67 and 1969/70 and the Surrey Youth Shield in 1969/70 and 1970/71. This talent matured and there followed three tremendous seasons for the senior side when they won the Surrey Senior League Cup in 1971/72, followed by the League and Cup double in 1972/73 and the League Championship again in 1973/74.

The Surrey Senior League was disbanded and reformed as the Combined Counties Football League in 1978 and Westfield became founder members and retained membership to date. Success, however, has been more difficult to achieve and in recent times the closest the senior team has come to honours was in 1989/90 when they lost the final of the Combined Counties League Cup to Hartley Wintney in extra time.

Season 2000/01 saw the Club enter the Carlsberg FA Vase for the first time, performing beyond expectations before losing in the Fourth Round to Ryman League Arlesey Town, on the way beating Wantage Town, Lewes and Bowers United.

Westfield continued to compete at youth level and they won the Combined Counties Youth League Cup in 1991/92 as well as being runners-up in the League. Following the installation of floodlights in 1998 the U18 team joined the Southern Youth Floodlight League as members of the Western Division. The Club also run an U16 team playing in the West Surrey Youth League.

WE'VE GOT YOUTH ON OUR SIDE

With the weather taking care of the U18's recent games, let's look back on the season so far...

The year started with only three players returning from last year's campaign with goalkeeper Crag Taylor, left-back Josh Dawber and this season's captain, Jonny Coats. This meant a very different squad starting their first game in the Southern Youth League in late August at Godalming Town and how pleasing was it to see a fine 2-1 victory for the Knappers with young striker Mekhail McLaughlin getting both goals. This proved to be a false dawn however as trips to Farnham Town and Guildford City both ended in heavy defeats 2-4 & 1-4 respectively; the Knaphill goals from Stevie Kemp, Hamid Senousaoui & Jamal Rodney. The only consistency was that Jonny Coats came away with two 'Man Of the Match' awards (given by the opposition) and three bookings.

That next match saw a long trip down to Cranleigh and a morale boosting 1-1 draw in a very tight game, played at 100mph and in a great spirit. Matt Willard made his debut in goal and helped keep the Knappers in the game whilst Jonny picked up his third MoM in 4 games. The fifth consecutive away game, due to issues with the use of the floodlights at Redding Way, saw a visit to Sandhurst Town and the fastest goals of the season so far as Jamal Rodney nipped in to score after just 21 seconds. A second goal from Jamal and a powerful Jakub Kurdziel header from the big defender saw a comfortable 3-0 lead at half-time. However Sandhurst came storming back in the second half and with ten minutes left had the score at 3-2, again a big defensive effort held the home side at bay and the Knappers recorded their second league win of the season.

The league cup started with a Knaphill speciality, a 5 goal away win; recorded twice last season, with a trip to Cove ending with a 5-1 win against 10 men as the Cove keeper was sent-off for throwing the ball at a Knaphill player. Goals from Stevie Kemp (2), Niall McInerney (2) and Robert Litchfield saw the Knappers safely home for a tie away to South Park. The first home league game of the season saw visitors, Ash United going ahead early in the game. Strikes from Charlie Felicien and Niall McInerney got Knaphill going with a deserved 2-1 win. Jonny picking up his 6th MoM in 7 games and no more yellows either! Back to Cove to face them in the league and it saw a very different match in some respects from the recent cup game; a 1-0 win was ground out after a poor 1st half display and a MoM winning performance from Matt Willard in goal; the wining goal coming late on from Mekhail after Cove had another player sent off, this time for persistent fouling.

Despite having a -1 goal difference, the Knappers moved to the top of the table. Their next trip was to Fleet Spurs where one player failed to arrive, a second Jack Lewis was injured in the warm-up, and with Robert Litchfield stepping into the breach for his first start of the campaign and only two fit players on the bench it was all hands to the pump. Fleet scored first and it looked as if it could have been a long night. However goals from Conor Davison (2) on his seasonal debut, Charlie Felicien with his first touch after coming on as a sub and a tap-in from Jamal resulted in a 4-2 victory and a return to the top of the table. The Grant-McLellan Cup 1st round tie against Windsor which was played at Molesey FC's Walton Road ground and ended in a heart rendering 6-5 defeat on penalties after a hard fought 3-3 draw. With Knaphill 3-1 down after 23 minutes it didn't look good, but a superb team effort turned the tie around with a last gasp (90+2 mins) free-kick from Turkay Suleyman to draw the tie level. Extra-time came and went and after scoring their first five penalties, the Windsor keeper saved kicks 6 & 7 to close out a Windsor win. So for the first time in 2 seasons, there will be no Grant-McLellan Cup Final to look forward to.

Another trip to Molesey to play the hosts in a County Cup tie saw a physical home side take a 3-0 halftime lead. The Knappers however are never down and scored twice in the second half as they eventually lost 4-2. The last two games away at South Park (League Cup) and Hartley Wintney (League) both fell foul of the weather. The South Park game has been rescheduled for Thursday 13th December and the last game of the year will be on Tuesday 20th December against Fleet Spurs, both games KO 7.30pm.

Special mention to Jonny Coats who is now a regular for the 1st team and to Josh Dawber (scoring twice against Westfield reserves), Ben Landi, Conor Davison, Ahmed Abdali and Louis Herbert who all make regular appearances for the Reserves. This shows how well our youngster are progressing and that they are making their mark in adult football and we hope they will eventually follow in the footsteps of Joe Turner & Jack Ball who have made the grade at higher levels after service with the Knappers.
