I unfortunately missed the first game of the season away to SCR which was a narrow 1-0 defeat.

Before today's game we had a tricky away task to play against Perry Goughs new look Walton and Hershams side. Over the last month we've had injury problems with our forwards Nathan Thomas' knee, Harry Rapley' back and trying to manage Sheridan Campbell the best we can with him being on loan from neighbours Westfield and getting called back regularly.

- 1980** Woking & District League, League Cup Winners and Charity Cup Winners.
- 1981** Surrey County Intermediate League (Western) Division Three Champions.
- 2004** We moved into our present home of Redding Way, Knaphill.
- 2007** Surrey County Intermediate League (Western) Division One Champions.

- 2015** We had our best run in the FA Vase, reaching the 4<sup>th</sup> Round.
- 2017** The Knappers' reached the FA Cup 2<sup>nd</sup> Qualifying Round.

## SUTTON COMMON ROVERS

---

- 1978** Founded as Inrad FC and was later called Centre 21 FC.
- 2004** The club started in Saturday League Football.
- 2006** Finished 3rd in the Surrey South Eastern Combination League and had an application to join the Combined Counties League rejected.
- 2007** Joined the Middlesex County League Premier Division.
- 2008** Club renamed to Mole Valley SCR and made their FA Cup Debut losing 5-0 to Chertsey Town.
- 2012** The 2012–13 campaign saw the side put together a 20-game unbeaten run, which led to a 2nd-placed finish and promotion back to the Premier Division.
- 2013** The club retained its Premier Division status on the final day of the 2013/2014 season with a thrilling 4–4 with Horley Town.
- 2014** saw the club win an FA Cup tie for the first time in their history, winning 3–2 at Chichester City in the Extra Preliminary Round. A run of two wins in fifteen games in 2015 saw the side threatened with relegation. Two wins and a draw from their final four games saw them survive by one point.
- 2015** With the club returning to the London Borough of Sutton, the club changed its name to Sutton Common Rovers. The 2015/16 season saw the club exit the FA Cup in the Extra-Preliminary Round away at Croydon 5–1. The FA Vase saw the club reach the 4th Round Proper for the first time, after wins at Cobham 3–0 (2nd Qualifying Round); at Worthing Utd 1–0 (1st round Proper); at home to Beckenham Town 3–2 (2nd Rd) and at Eastbourne Town 3–2 (3rd Rd), before defeat at eventual semi-finalists Bowers & Pitsea 3–0 in the 4th Round.
- 2016** Prior to the start of the 2016/17 season the senior section was awarded full FA Charter Standard status. SCR finished the 2016/17 season mid-table in 12th. On 1 May 2017, SCR defeated Camberley Town 4–1 to win the club's first Southern Combination Challenge Cup.
- 2017** Saw the club introduce an U21 side into the newly formed Combined Counties League U21 division. The Reserves continue to play in the Surrey Elite League Reserve division. The senior side finished the season 3rd in the Combined Counties Premier Division, their most successful campaign for five seasons, narrowly missing out on promotion to the Isthmian League. They also reached the Challenge Cup semi-finals but were unable to defend their title.

As debuts go, you could not have got much better than Martin Smith's, our new recruit from Horley Town. He had a hand in two goals and wrapped up victory with the vital fourth.

Changes were made from Tuesdays League Cup win over Fleet Spurs with Holt in goal, a back four of Kellet-Smith, Collins, Rowley and Bower, four in midfield, Costello, Al Amrani, Frise and Leighton and up front, Smith and Campbell.

It only took 6 minutes for us to open the scoring as Smith made his first telling contribution, sweeping a 40 yard pass to Scott Costello who crossed and Jack Leighton timed his run to perfection to nip in front of the right back to place a shot past Russell despite him getting a hand on the effort. Eight minutes later Matt Kellet-Smith doubled our advantage with a thumping header from Jack Collins' flighted free kick. Knaphill were confident all over the pitch as Walton & Hersham looked shaky every time we attacked.

Two became three on 23 minutes when Smith fed Sheridan Campbell who fended off a challenge and raced into the box and planted a left footed effort low past Russell.

A dream start for Richard Keown's side and they didn't sit back, searching for a

fourth. At the other end Walton & Hersham started to put some pressure on and Osei-Obengo fluffed a great chance from 6 yards. Right on half time a ball into Knaphill's box was not cleared and following a couple of quick passes Pat Kirby fired home from 18 yards with Holt at full stretch but unable to keep it out.

The expected second half onslaught from the hosts did not materialise as Knaphill kept them at bay but also found it harder to break down a more resolute opposition. Walton & Hersham lost Liam Coates to a nasty looking injury and following lengthy treatment he had to be stretchered off.

With ten minutes remaining it was game on as Castanho threaded a lovely pass inside Matt Kellet-Smith for Tyreke Leslie and he was composed enough to lift the ball over the advancing Holt to make it 3-2. However, the joy was short lived a debut boy, Smith sealed victory with a well timed run to take a pass from George Frise and after rounding Russell he rolled the ball home to cap a fine performance.

The victory takes Knaphill up to 8th in what is a very tight division and any team that puts a little run together can certainly fly up the table.

Everyone at Knaphill FC passes their good wishes to Liam Coates and hope the injury isn't as serious as first feared.

On Saturday we took on Abbey Rangers at home in the quarter final of the Suburban Challenge Plate. Having beaten us 4-0 less than two weeks earlier in a poor performance we had the opportunity to make amends. With only three squad members having played in the previous Abbey Rangers match we knew that this would play out as a different game. Our squad included two new club signings of Kai Francis and Connor Blanchard who will be in and around the first team squad and had trained with them that week.

As always with a team that haven't played together before, the early stages of the game was spent getting to know each other's strengths and weaknesses. It soon became clear that Kai's strength, particularly in the air, and Connor's pace gave us a new dimension to our play. The first half was an even affair, with both teams having chances. We were not quite clinical enough in front of goal though and before the end of the half our defence, who had dealt with their largely aerial attack well, switched off and allowed an easy finish in our 6 yard area. Concentration has been an issue for us all season, something that we discussed at half time. Good work for 85 minutes of a game can easily be undone with a few minutes of lapses in concentration.

We came out for the second half knowing that we would continue to create chances. Connor's pace continued to frighten Abbey's defence and a direct run into their box saw him brought down. Unfortunately, the referee did not deem the challenge a foul which seemed a unique perspective. Our players were dismayed by the decision and Abbey did not argue that our player had gone down too easily. At that stage a converted penalty would of seen as at 1-1 with us on the ascendancy. As it was, we continued to attack but couldn't unlock their defence with any clear cut chances. Abbey were able to double their lead before the end but the game was much closer than the result suggested. This was another defeat for 2019, difficult to take but at least there were several positives from this game. We continue to include many U18s in the squad so as much as results have not been going our way the long term future still continues to take shape.

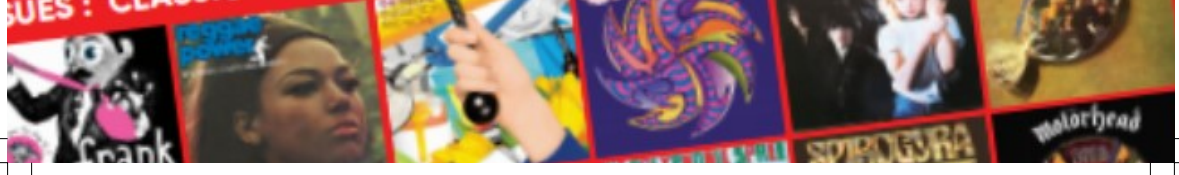
