First up on Tuesday night was Sandhurst, we went into the game with the aim to reach the semi finals. By the way we started you would have thought we were playing an exhibition match. We were second to everything and didn't look up for the fight. Credit to Sandhurst who came out strong looking to put us on the back foot, which they did.

Defensively we were making too many errors and we weren't winning our second balls in mid field. Sandhurst deserved to be leading at half time but it was us who found ourselves 1-0 up at the break. Against the run of play Matt Kellet Smith popped up again from a corner to put us ahead just before the break. We went out into the second half with more about us, we moved the ball quicker and we cut out the silly mistakes at the back. We scored a cracking second goal and got the job done. Colliers Wood huffed and puffed but it was us who came in 1-0 up at half time. We talked at half time about our game plan working. We spoke about getting the second goal and killing them off.

We started the second half where we left off on top and it wasn't long before the second goal came. We robbed Colliers Wood of possession in mid field and caught them on the break again with Scott Costello squaring Martin Smith in the box to score his third goal in 4 games. Smithy has been here a month and is doing exactly what I expect from him, Goals.

2-0 up and we should have seen the game out. As usual we like to make it hard for ourselves. Slow reactions and poor marking led to their 1st goal. Colliers Wood were back in it at 2-1 with 20 minutes to play. SOUTHALL



Southall Football Club was founded in 1871, the first recorded game being a 1-0 defeat against Uxbridge played at Southall Park on October 21st 1871. The FA Cup was first entered in the 1873-74 season, with their first victory in the competition coming the following season when they beat Leyton 5-0 after a 0-0 draw at Southall Park. The next 20 years were spent playing friendly matches against teams in London and the Home Counties together with one season in the West London League in 1892-93. The First piece of Silverware was won in 1887 when Southall won the West Middlesex Cup overcoming Uxbridge Crescents 1-0 in the final.

Southall were accepted into the Southern League for the 1896-97 season and remained there for nine seasons. The club achieved little success but at this time competed on equal terms with the likes of Watford, Fulham, Brighton and Thames Iron-Works, now known as West Ham. The Club turned professional for their final season in the Southern League and this venture cost the club dear. Faced with mounting debts Southall withdrew from all competition for the following season. The club was reformed as a junior club through local club Southall Athletic and moved into a new enclosed ground at western Road. After reinstatement of senior status the Great Western Suburban League was entered in September 1907 and the club remained there until the outbreak of the First World War. During this period the league title was won in the 1912-13 season and both the Middlesex senior and charity cups were won for the first time.

Southall were then elected into the Athenian League in September 1919 and the next ten years was the most successful period in the history of the club. The Athenian League Championship was won in the 1926-27 season, the Middlesex senior cup was won four times and the Middlesex Charity Cup three times. On a national level Southall reached the final of the Amateur Cup in the 1924-25 season only to be defeated 2-1 by Clapton in front of 25230 spectators at the ground of Millwall FC. Two seasons later Southall reached the semi final of the same competition, but were beaten in a replay by Leyton. The first round proper of the FA CUP was reached three times with no success. The 1935-36 season was an extraordinary one in the history of the club.



Progress in cup matches was so extensive that by the start of February Southall had played 22 consecutive cup-ties. Southall became the first amateur side to battle all the way from the extra preliminary round of the FA CUP and reach the third round proper. It was a superb run that saw them defeat Division Three South side Swindon Town 3-1 in the first round and then trounce fellow non leaguers Newport (low) by 8-0 to earn a third round game against Watford. This time in front of a record home crowd of 19094 Southall were defeated 4-1. Southall actually won nothing that season and as a result of their cup exploits they played 23 matches in 32 days to complete the Athenian League commitments including two matches on the same day on two occasions. It was not until the 1952-53 season that Southall again hit the headlines. The team battled past Saltash, Bishop Auckland, Wealdstone and Romford to reach the semi final of the Amateur Cup. Here Southall met the renown Universities side Pegasus. The game took place at Highbury and the game ended in a hard fought 1-1 draw in front of 29982 spectators. Southall lost the replay 2-1 the following week at Craven cottage.

The 1960's was a quiet period in the history of the club and in 1973 Southall were elected into the newly formed second division of the Isthmian League. In their second season in that competition Southall achieved promotion for the first time in their history when they finished as runners up to Staines Town. Three seasons in the top flight followed, the highest position achieved being 14th in 1976-77. It was this same season that future England midfielder Alan Devonshire joined West Ham United for £5000 then a record for a player leaving an Isthmian League Club. Consecutive relegations followed into the bottom tier of the Isthmian League and in the 1985-86 season, Southall again gained national recognition when they reached the FA Vase Final. Southall, with future England International Les Ferdinand in the side, lost 3-0 to Halesowen Town. Southall suffered a major body blow in 1992 when they were forced to vacate their Western Road ground and since that time Southall has ground shared at several venues.




The new year has continued with two disappointing results in the Suburban Shield, drawn in the group against Abbey Rangers and Flackwell Heath. On Monday we travelled to Abbey Rangers with a squad containing a handful of first team players needing minutes. With an onlooking first team manager in the crowd the early signs were positive as we pressed Rangers relentlessly and created several chances. However we were not clinical in front of goal and a misjudgement at the back allowed their attacker to control a ball on our by-line and put across our six yard box for his team mate an easy finish. Our pressing game ebbed away and we gave Abbey Rangers the confidence to complete a 4-0 victory, something that seemed impossible based on our good early start.

On Saturday we hosted Flackwell Heath in the next group game. This time we put out a very young squad. I had watched our U18 team defeat Guildford City 2-1 on Wednesday, this followed their impressive victory in the cup against Carshalton Athletic two days earlier. Matt Cronan and his team have been leading the boys well this season and I am pleased that Matt and I have been able to promote many of his players into the development team. There were six players in the development squad on Saturday that had played for the U18s earlier in the week. This included Mac Howieson who made his debut at half time in midfield and did not look out of place.

The development team are clearly suffering from a lack of confidence and this allowed Flackwell Heath much of the ball as we struggled to get out of our half. 3-0 down at half time and with few chances created we changed our shape at half time. A penalty early in the second half extended Flackwell's lead however what followed showed a lot of character on our behalf. The players suddenly showed the confidence and ability seen in previous games and in the last 20 mins grabbed two goals, including an excellent curled finish from the edge of the area by Elz Cibwabwa. We could and should of scored more and Flackwell Heath clearly felt relieved by the final whistle.

It has been a frustrating start to 2019 for the development team. We have a chance next Saturday to right some wrongs when we play Abbey Rangers at home in the next round of the Suburban Challenge Plate.

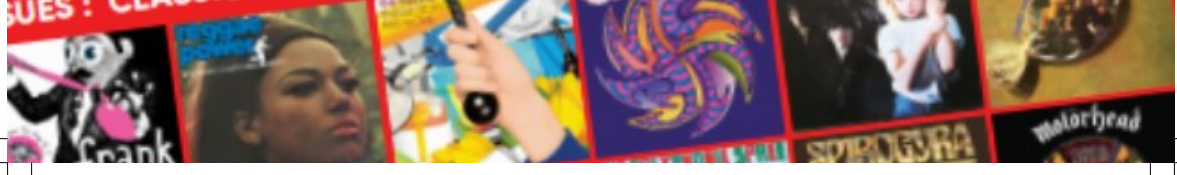
