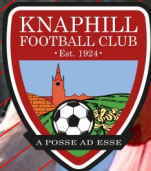

We need to stick together and go again . This seasons league table is all over the shop . It's even so tight down the bottom and we aim to get back to gaining points and looking up rather than down .

I'd also like to mention our under 23s manager Dan Parsons in my notes who has a really tough task being in suburban premier but is doing a wonderful job mixing and matching players from youth and first team squad .

Christmas came early for Southall FC on Saturday when they comprehensively defeated Knaphill by six goals to nil.

As much as the hosts were clinical and dominant, Knaphill were very poor. Richard Keown, Knaphill's boss was not expecting this performance as they came in to the game on the back of three victories and a draw plus there was only one change to the line up from the previous two games with Jordan Hector-Smith replacing Josh Barry who was ill.

It only took two minutes for the deadlock to be broken when Jack Bennett capitalised on an unfortunate slip by Hector-Smith to shoot across Aaron Holt in to the bottom corner. Knaphill were not coping well with Southall's quick passing and moving. Bennett was causing havoc and another surge in to the box saw him cross to Darreon Mark but his effort was blocked.

Ryan Hope was dominating midfield and on 22 minutes he struck the crossbar from 25 yards. Three minutes later the same player was again afforded too much room on the edge of the box and this time his effort was too good for Holt and nestled in the bottom corner. It was soon 3-0 when Rowan Vine made the most of a through ball, rounding Holt

and slotting home from a tight angle.

Goal number four came just before halftime when Hector-Smith took one touch too many in the box enabling Mark to nick the ball off him and beat Holt with a calm finish.

Holt made some good saves during the game but was ultimately let down by the 10 men in front of him. Two changes were made at halftime for Knaphill and the tide was stemmed somewhat as with game won Southall didn't have the same intensity. A brief spell of pressure from the visitors saw Rapley and Campbell have shots on target well saved by Kieron Vickers.

Southall took control again and Darreon Mark, who impressed throughout got his second and Southall's fifth on 68 minutes with a crisp finish giving Holt no chance and 10 minutes later he completed his hat trick with yet another well worked goal.

To complete a miserable day for Knaphill, Campbell had a late penalty saved by Vickers. It was harsh on Campbell as he had put in a hard working performance.

Congratulations to Southall on an eye catching performance and for Knaphill it is hopefully back to business next time out when Hanworth Villa will be the visitors.

In the three weeks since my last update the development team have experienced a spectrum of performances and results.

We have been lucky enough to have three games at home that started with the visit of Bromley. Lower down the table but with games in hand we expected a close game at least. What followed was a 7-0 defeat with very few positives to take from a poor day all round.

Good preparation is key to any successful team and that day ours had been hampered by the late arrival of several players. It was clear that our poor lead up to the game transferred on to the pitch and we never really got going until the game was effectively lost. Some honest words were said at both half time and after the game about how we could not allow a repeat of that day again.

The following Saturday we entertained Sutton Utd. Top of the league with a 100% win rate we knew we would have to be at our best to get something from the game. With a more experienced back four we looked solid and held our shape when out of possession really well. A rare loss of composure in midfield allowed Sutton to break and a mistimed last ditch tackle brought about a penalty that they dispatched.

Although 1-0 down at half time the team knew they had put in a good 45 minutes. With a few improvements to our play in possession we knew we could create more chances and get something from the game. We came out for the second half brightly, having more of the ball in Sutton's half. A moment of real quality from Harri Chambers, putting in his best performance of the season so far, who squeezed through two defenders with the ball on the edge of the box and fired across goal into the back of the net. A fully deserved equaliser and when Sutton managed to take the lead again following a set piece late on we could have easily felt it was a step too far to come back again.

Yet we showed real character to keep on attacking the same way we had all half and Chambers was able to set up Ramone Leitch for a tidy finish and conclude the game as the first team to take a point from Sutton this season.

Last Saturday saw the visit of Cray Valley in a Suburban Challenge Plate tie. We wanted to keep up the momentum from the good result a week earlier. I also challenged the team to now try and keep a clean sheet, something we have not been able to achieve this season. Cray created questions of our defence at times but we looked in control for large portions of the game.

We were 2-0 up at half time, thanks to a speculative effort from Tom White that their keeper was unable to deal with and an excellent free kick from Jack Leighton who had a superb game at centre back. We came out in the second half with even more of an attacking threat and Tom was able to complete his hat trick with 2 well taken finishes. An unfortunate, for us, free kick into the far corner of our goal area managed to find its way into the back of the net and meant we were not quite able to get that first clean sheet. This was after a fantastic save from a penalty by Jake Tayler low down to his right. Nathan Pooley added a fifth from close range to finish the game at 5-1. The team had put in a spirited performance in difficult weather conditions and fully deserved to go through to the next round.

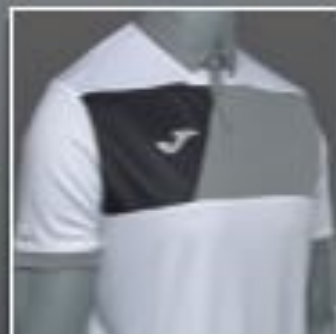
