## REPORTING BACK...

## Saturday 12th December 2015 Canterbury City 1 Knaphill 3 FA Vase 3rd Round

Match report taken from Kent Sports News



With both sides making their debut at this stage of the competition and having similar record in their respective leagues, a tight game was expected. Canterbury came into the game in 8th within the Southern Counties East Football League with 23 points from 16 games, whilst the Knappers had 26 points from 17 games in the Combined Counties Premier Division.

There were three changes from the City side who won 3-2 against Raynes Park Vale in their last game, Sam Staunton, Matthew Martin and Chevan Xavier took the places of Adam Woolcott, who fell to the bench, Ryan Philpott and Jordan Casey.

After a scrappy start with both sides looking to take control of the game it was the hosts who had the first real chance of the game after thirteen minutes. David Pilcher's free kick was dropped by Richard Shelley to the feet of Rob Lawrence who attempted to stab the ball in,



only for it to roll past the wrong side of the post from four yards out.

Knaphill soon worked their way into the game and they should have taken the lead less than ten minutes later. An impressive run from jack Mazzone gave the attacker space to put a low cross towards Charlie Postance, but he couldn't get a clean touch on the ball, meaning he couldn't simply stroke the ball into the open goal.

With time running out in the first half the visitors were able to take the lead, Josh Watkins saw Shannon Harris off his line and took a chance from 40 yards. Harris was able to claw the ball off the line, only for the ball to fall to the feet of Mazzone who was able to score with a simple tap in from

close range, meaning his side were able to go in to half time with a lead.



Looking for an equaliser, Canterbury started the second half in control. After ten minutes a well worked corner allowed Danny Lawrence a chance at the near post, but the midfielder was only able to hit the side netting. Only three minutes later they were able to find the elusive goal. Sam Staunton's pass forward came perfectly into the feet of David Pilcher who did well to turn past Matt Morris and fire a shot in at the near post. Knaphill looked to restore their lead and from the

first attack Robbie Kersley placed a shot wide after some impressive build up play, but it was their next attack which gave them their second goal. A long ball forward fell perfectly into the path of Danny Taylor, allowing the substitute to chip Shannon Harris, allowing Knaphill to reinforce their lead. However, with the hosts' time running out they were given a lifeline when the referee believed Matt Morris threw an elbow at David Pilcher during a battle for possession, leaving Knaphill with ten men for the remainder of the game.

This didn't worry the visitors however, as with only fourteen minutes remaining Danny Taylor scored his second of the afternoon from close range, securing the win for Knaphill as they looked certain to progress to the fourth round. They still weren't happy with a two goal lad theough, and after Arafat Kabuye came on as a substitute he had two fantastic chances to score. After beating the offside trap moments after coming on he looked to chip Shannon Harris, but the goalkeeper was able to hold the shot.





With the final attack of the game a counter attack was collected by Harris, only for Kabuye to dispossess him, but the substitute's effort was bravely cleared off the line by the head of Oliver Lee, meaning the game ended with a two goal margin.



I hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas.

Last Saturday the lads underperformed and came back to earth with a bump. The 5-2 defeat to Colliers Wood Utd was hard to swallow, but proved as a welcome wake up call for not only the players but the management too. In recent months, confidence has been high and we have been riding on a crest of a wave. Nicely positioned in the league with multiple games in hand, coupled with a County cup 3rd round and League cup 3rd round to look forward to, plus progress in to the last 32 of the FA Vase.

Having said that, the players and management are at fault for last weeks result, probably due to complacency thinking that all we needed to do was to turn up, play football, and the result would come. We scored two wonderfully worked goals but conceded five very sloppy ones caused by individual errors and slack defending as a whole team. Charlie Postance and Jack Mazzone were the only players that escaped with some credibility to their names!

Keith and I both take responsibility as tactically we got it wrong and should have also sensed the player's complacency.

On a good note, the Saturday previous was another milestone for the club by beating Canterbury City 3-1 in the 3rd Round of the Fa Vase to reach the last 32. The lads adapted well to the rather bumpy 3g surface and the blustery conditions and deservedly won through with Matt Morris' unfortunate dismissal the only disappointment. A very workman like performance was in truth the difference between the two teams and even when down to ten men, we looked fitter, hungrier and sharper. We look forward to Kidlington away in the next round, and will train and work hard and certainly do our homework on them as they will do on us. There are no poor teams in the last 32 and we must be on it and in good form if we have any desire to progress.

Our last home game we faced a very up and down team in Raynes Park Vale. Very windy conditions were not conducive to good flowing football and a very scrappy affair was won by the Knappers 3-2. A game like this last season would almost certainly have seen us lose, but we have definitely learnt to be patient and adapt to the conditions and the situation, and the players must take full credit for battling their way to victory.

On the injury front, midfielder Steve Brown is now back training after his broken leg and even got a surprising 90 minutes last week against Colliers Wood Utd. Jimmy Norman (ankle) made an appearance against Ashford in the Surrey Senior Cup but unfortunately has had a set back with his injury and is therefore side-lined for a little longer. Scott Costello (ankle) has also returned from injury but he is also still undergoing treatment and therefore is not yet fully fit. Yassa (knee) is now fully fit and will be pushing for that starting place. As for Dan Thorogood, a mild hamstring strain thought to be a 3-4 week lay off back in August, has turned into 3-4 months!! The boy is made of china!

All of these injuries came pretty much at the same time and although we struggled at times to fill the bench, the players rallied and continued getting the results under extremely testing circumstances

With nearly everyone fit, it will be very hard for Keith and I to not only select the best starting 11, but to select the best 16 players on match day. Inevitably three to four 1st team players will have to get game time with the reserves to keep them sharp and I know Simon and Keown will have them drilled and ready for when they are called back for 1st team duty. Unfortunately we are missing Matt Morris today and for the following two matches due to his Red card against Canterbury City. Big boots to fill but some young blood under the age of 30 should help. Connor Close is also serving out his suspension and is unavailable today.

Keith and I are happy with the quality of the 1st team but we would be foolish to settle with what we've got currently. Knaphill are emerging as a fantastic club to be at and we get daily calls from players wishing to join the team. We hope to improve the squad in the New Year and push to the next level and aim for that top 6 spot in the Premier division.

I hope you enjoy todays match against local rivals Westfield. I'm confident you will see some excellent football and two teams battling it out for bragging rights. Whatever the outcome, a Christmas beer will certainly be shared after the match.

## THE AWAY END...

The Club was formed in 1953 as Westfield Boys Club playing in the Woking and District League and also running a youth team. From the start the Club had success in the competitions entered. Among the trophy's won in the early years were the Surrey Youth Invitation Cup in 1953/54, the Surrey Junior Charity Cup in 1954/55 and 1955/56, the Surrey Junior Cup at the first attempt in 1955/56 and the Surrey Youth Cup in 1956/57.

Following several seasons in local league football the Club made the break into Surrey Intermediate Football using the present ground at Woking Park, Kingfield. Successes soon came and, after becoming League Champions and League Cup winners on several occasions in the subsequent seasons, the Club decided to apply for senior status.

The application was accepted in 1964 and after one season in the Parthenon League, Westfield met the necessary ground grading requirements and joined the Surrey Senior League.

Westfield's future success in senior football sprang from their ability to attract the best local youngsters and they were successful in winning the Surrey Youth Cup again in 1966/67 and 1969/70 and the Surrey Youth Shield in 1969/70 and 1970/71. This talent matured and there followed three tremendous seasons for the senior side when they won the Surrey Senior League Cup in 1971/72, followed by the League and Cup double in 1972/73 and the League Championship again in 1973/74.

The Surrey Senior League was disbanded and reformed as the Combined Counties Football League in 1978 and Westfield became founder members and retained membership to date. Success, however, has been more difficult to achieve and in recent times the closest the senior team has come to honours was in 1989/90 when they lost the final of the Combined Counties League Cup to Hartley Wintney in extra time.

Season 2000/01 saw the Club enter the Carlsberg FA Vase for the first time, performing beyond expectations before losing in the Fourth Round to Ryman League Arlesey Town, on the way beating Wantage Town, Lewes and Bowers United.

Westfield continued to compete at youth level and they won the Combined Counties Youth League Cup in 1991/92 as well as being runners-up in the League.

Following the installation of floodlights in 1998 the U18 team joined the Southern Youth Floodlight League as members of the Western Division. The Club also run an U16 team playing in the West Surrey Youth League.

### Saturday 19th December 2015 **Colliers Wood Utd 5 Knaphill 2 Combined Counties Premier Division**


