	Social distancing of at least 2m between individuals of different households. The only exception is athletes undertaking physical activity whereby they must adhere to NGB guidelines.	
	Toilets will be available for use. Athletes and coaches can only use the designated toilets available. Hand sanitization is encouraged upon leaving the toilet area to prevent transmission from regularly touched areas; door handles, latches, taps etc	
	Players to use designated area for storing personal belongings. Contain clothing/drinks bottles or any other item which may spread the virus in a safe and secure place away from other users.	
	Athletes to bring water bottles which are not to be shared. Water fountains will not be in use for athletes to refill their bottles from.	
	Where possible, disinfect items being brought into the venue. If anything is shared, they should be disinfected between different users or every 15 minutes when used in a group training environment.	
	Ensure items being touched are disinfected before and after use,	

		e.g. balls, cones, pads, spots etc.	
		Bibs or equipment that is made	
		from fabric must not be shared	
		between users. At the end of the	
		session, bibs must be double	
		bagged and washed on a hot	
		wash at 65 degree or higher.	
		Fixed items like posts should be
