New Salamis Football Club History

New Salamis FC were formed in 1971 by fans of Cypriot club Nea Salamis Famagusta, with the Cypriot based club acting as a parent club to their fans in the UK. Playing in the KOPA (Cypriot Football League) a British League set-up for Cypriots in London, the club won countless honours and left the league in season 2017/18 as the leagues most successful team, winning 12 League Titles. The club also won a record 7 London County Cups.

In the 2015/16 season the club won the FA Sunday Cup, following a 1-1 draw with Barnes at Selhurst Park and winning on penalties. In 2016/17 the club lost to Hardwick Social Club on penalties again following a 1-1 draw, at Brammall Lane. Many of the players still play for the team today.

In 2018/19 we moved into the Herts County Senior League, playing our matches at Enfield Town FC. In our first season we won the presitgous Aubrey Cup Final, and also acheived promotion to the Spartan South Midlands League, after finishing runners up.

Season 2019/20 saw us participate in the Spartan South Midlands League Division One at Step 6, our ambition to achieve promotion to Step 5.

In March 2020 when the Covid-19 pandemic hit, we sat top of the certain of a top four finish and promotion. We also were the top scorers in all top 10 Divisions as the season was null and voided.

Last season saw the team reach the first round of the FA Cup, in our first season, and when the season was curtailed in November, we had managed to amas enough points to be promoted to the Premier Division on points per game over two season, this season sees a new chapter.

Ipswich Wanderers Football Club History

The club formed as an under 14's boys team in 1980 and two years later entered the lowest division of the Ipswich Sunday League.

After several successful years the Club joined the newly formed Eastern Counties Division One in 1987 as one of the founder members that was at the time sponsored by Jewsons.

At the time, whilst still playing at our present ground at Humber Doucy Lane the Club was known as Loadwell Ipswich but that soon changed as the highly influential chairman Jimmy Barker negotiated a name change first to 'Lancaster Ipswich FC' and then onto 'Ipswich Wanderers FC'. Jimmy played a massive role in developing the club and was present to see our first match under floodlights against Ipswich Town in September 1994. Jimmy sadly died just a couple of months later and is sorely missed. Jimmy played a vital part in the foundations of this football club and we will be forever grateful.

We saw further great ground improvements in the early years under the direction of Roger Woshalo (Development Officer) and Tim Davey (Ground Manager).

In 1996/97 we got our first taste of the squad really developing, reaching the Suffolk Senior Cup final only to lose 4-1 to Haverhill Rovers. It wasn't long before success arrived though, with the club achieving Premier status the following season under the Chairmanship of Alan Haste. This is where we stayed for a number of seasons with a nice blend of youth and experience and we really became established as a Premier team. However, on the last day of the 2002/03 season heartbreak for the Club with a defeat at Wisbech meant relegation to Division 1.

The following season saw Jason Dozzell join the club with the assistance of Kevin Cunningham and Glynn Hague. In the first season in Division 1 the Club finished a respectable midtable position as the squad was rebuilt but the foundations of that season enables the Club to sweep to the 1st Division title the following season. In the season 2005/06 we finished a very respectable 7th place with the league second best defence and with crowds on average exceeding 100.

Jason Dozzell and Chairman David Bugg both left the club at the end of that season with Ed Nicholls becoming the new Chairman of the Club and him appointing John Clarkson as manager. John guided the Club to the final of the Ridgeons League Cup, the 5th round of the FA Vase and a Suffolk Premier Cup Semi Final against Ipswich Town.

At the end of the season John left the Club which was the catalyst for an exodus of players, leaving the Club to appoint ex player Louis Newman as Manager and with a task of rebuilding the squad. The squad was young and inexperienced and was a really tough time with a poor start and some heavy defeats. Louis was replaced by another former ex player Steve Buckle who was brought in to rebuild further and try and save the Clubs Premier status. Steve was unable to do this and the Clubs only consolation that season was the Reserves winning the Chell Trophy defeating Wroxham. The club were unable to push for promotion in the next few seasons and Steve along with his Assistant Paul Grainger parted company with the Club.

New Chairman Terry Fenwick appointed Glenn Read who brought in a number of players from his former club Stowmarket Town along with their former boss Steve Jay who became Assistant Manager. Early signs were good with the rebuilding of the squad. A narrow miss on promotion in 2012 /13 along with a penalty defeat in the semi final in the First Division Cup was just the beginning for Glenn and his boys. However the season ended in great joy as it saw the Club clinch its first Suffolk Senior Cup trophy defeating local rivals Whitton United in the final, coming back from 3-0 down in a penalty shoot out. The following year Whitton got revenge in a repeat of the Suffolk Senior Cup with a narrow win but the Club were not prevented from enjoying a fine season with promotion mainly due to two long unbeaten runs including a club record win of 12-1 over Downham Town. 2014/15 was a mixed season with us adapting well on the pitch and finishing 9th in our first season back in the Premier but off the field we lost one of its driving forces Roger Wosahlo mid-season. In 2015-16 we defeated Canvey Island in the FA Cup and enjoyed our best FA Vase run but with a heavy backlog of fixtures, relegation fears were only ended just before the end of the season.

Glenn stepped down at the end of the season and Shane Wardley was appointed as Player / Manager. Shane had a great first season, achieving one of our highest ever positions the Club has seen. However the following season after a poor start Shane resigned and following a disastrous spell under Mark Benterman, club legend Mark Goldfinch took over with James Buckle. They were unable to avoid relegation but the following season we saw some consolidation and were unlucky to lose in the Suffolk Senior Cup semi-final to Cornard.

In 2019-20 Stephen Boyle took over as Chairman and we saw further rebuilding after a sticky spell in October. We had good momentum towards the end of the season but it was abruptly ended with a 'null and void' whilst in 8th position. We also reached the semi-final of the Suffolk Senior Cup which subsequently got completed in the 2020-21 season. Wanderers went on the win the trophy for the second time in our history with a narrow 1-0 win against Coplestonians.

The Club saw Tony Falucci join and added a lot off the field in the improvements of ground along with a renewed emphasis on Youth Development.

The 2020-21 season was near perfect with nine wins and one draw & with four scheduled for promotion it was only really a matter of which of the promotion places we would take. However for the second season in a row the season was cut short with a 'curtailed' season. Following the Step 3-6 league restructure with the controversial use of the combination of results over the past two seasons Wanderers crawly missed out on promotion. To make matters worse a poor performance in the semi-final of the Suffolk Senior Cup saw us lose 2-0 to Bildeston.

Despite the frustration of the way the season ended the Club has remained focused on and off the field with further improvements to the ground and surrounding area along with a number of great additions to add to a strong squad to support us with the quest of conquering Thurlow Nunn South and a number of unknown teams.
