### A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

We started last season, after a long period of inactivity, not really knowing what to expect, and it's fair to say that we were very pleasantly surprised by how all of our teams resumed playing with a great deal of style and a lot of success. A great credit to all of the coaching teams and the commitment of the players who kept the fitness and skill levels going throughout all of the lockdowns.

This time around things are a bit more 'normal' and we certainly know a bit more about what to expect for the Men's First team - as we step up to resume competition with many of the teams we battled with a few years ago. A much bigger challenge for sure, but one which the squad are eagerly anticipating.

Across our other senior Men's teams, the new season is harder to predict. One of the very few disappointments from last season was the much lower number of games that the 2s and the 3s had. This was largely through no fault of their own as we had fixtures agreed, and teams ready and very keen to play. But opposition cry-offs (and at times referee shortages), meant far too many games didn't happen, and as a result, very disjointed seasons for both teams. This underlying shortage of adult men now playing rugby regularly is a problem everywhere and is creating a major challenge for all clubs – both in maintaining playing standards and remaining financially viable. Let's hope the new season sees an improvement for everyone.

On the Ladies side, whilst playing numbers generally are on the increase, we now face our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team. This was always factored into our plans as part of the partnership with Tigers, and we now have a new second team entered into NC2 Midlands (West), but nevertheless (and for different reasons to the men) early season playing numbers may still be challenge.

There are always different challenges, but our focus remains on enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. Obviously, we are immensely proud of our playing successes, but our pride really comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players on view and the fact that most of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, the club is still extremely buoyant, and well-placed to continue our development - both on and off the field.

### **MATCH PREVIEW**

Today's round 10 game involves the visit of Bromsgrove and we welcome all their officials, players and supporters to Cooke Fields. In addition, the 2s are playing Bournville at home in their league merit table match – second v our third position in the table.

Results in this league are becoming harder to predict, it seems, based on the last couple of weeks. Since week 1, Dudley K are the only side showing real consistency, however, they were beaten at home two weeks ago by today's visitors (16-11) and Bromsgrove then defeated Kenilworth 31-19 last Saturday to move up to fifth position. They now have a won 5, lost 4 record; they share with Burton the lead for the most bonus points, having earned a losing bonus point on all four occasions they have lost.

There have been definite improvements in our last two outings. Last week's game at Broad Street was not for the purist, but we dug deep to win with the last play when Joe Bourne scored his second try to break the deadlock at 17 each (four point win). Ben Ashmore also took his tally to two tries in hist first two games for our senior side. Good for the confidence levels, we hope. Despite conceding 50 points to Bridgnorth, who then lost to bottom side Nuneaton last week, we have played worse this season. The Shropshire side grabbed most of the opportunities, which came their way, and the ball did seem to bounce their way rather than ours – you make your own luck, they do say. No excuses, however. The U9s provide the mascots and they are Fred Nichols, Ted Burton, Gethin Smith & Isaac Wilkins – enjoy it lads.

No men's games next week, we visit Burton in a fortnight, their new ground is at Branston Road, Tattenhill, DE14 3EZ.

The men's 2s have w3, I3 record. A fortnight ago, we narrowly lost at Birmingham Medics in a very early kick off and last Saturday we had a walk over against Stafford. They did manage a game of sorts, which the RFU are encouraging (see their quarterly online video magazine, The Clubhouse, on YouTube), where the teams can amend the rules to make the game fit the numbers and ability of the players. The 3s are struggling to get going this season, to date any postponed fixtures are being rearranged to make the merit league table have meaning.

The women continue to see the benefits of the amalgamation with Leicester Tigers, who remain unbeaten. Both the Red and Green Lichfield sides lie in second spot in their respective leagues with one defeat each. In the cup competition two weeks ago, the Red team had a walk over versus Cannock,

whilst the Green team went to Winnington Park in Cheshire and won 66-0. They also "nilled" Bournville in last week's league match. The Red team are at Sutton tomorrow and are home to Hitchin next week, whilst the Green team are at Telford tomorrow.

The colts have had nine of their squad selected for the county colts training group, which is a wonderful achievement – plus one in the Warwickshire side. Well done to Dave Butler and his coaching staff. They have a league game at home tomorrow against Newport at 2pm and then next Sunday they face Stourbridge in the 3rd round of the national cup. They have already beaten "Stour" in the league, but by one point. All support would be welcome. The results from our junior sides remain successful overall.


