A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

We started last season, after a long period of inactivity, not really knowing what to expect, and it's fair to say that we were very pleasantly surprised by how all of our teams resumed playing with a great deal of style and a lot of success. A great credit to all of the coaching teams and the commitment of the players who kept the fitness and skill levels going throughout all of the lockdowns.

This time around things are a bit more 'normal' and we certainly know a bit more about what to expect for the Men's First team - as we step up to resume competition with many of the teams we battled with a few years ago. A much bigger challenge for sure, but one which the squad are eagerly anticipating.

Across our other senior Men's teams, the new season is harder to predict. One of the very few disappointments from last season was the much lower number of games that the 2s and the 3s had. This was largely through no fault of their own as we had fixtures agreed, and teams ready and very keen to play. But opposition cry-offs (and at times referee shortages), meant far too many games didn't happen, and as a result, very disjointed seasons for both teams. This underlying shortage of adult men now playing rugby regularly is a problem everywhere and is creating a major challenge for all clubs – both in maintaining playing standards and remaining financially viable. Let's hope the new season sees an improvement for everyone.

On the Ladies side, whilst playing numbers generally are on the increase, we now face our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team. This was always factored into our plans as part of the partnership with Tigers, and we now have a new second team entered into NC2 Midlands (West), but nevertheless (and for different reasons to the men) early season playing numbers may still be challenge.

There are always different challenges, but our focus remains on enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. Obviously, we are immensely proud of our playing successes, but our pride really comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players on view and the fact that most of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, the club is still extremely buoyant, and well-placed to continue our development - both on and off the field.

MATCH PREVIEW LADIES' DAY

It is one of our 'special' Saturdays today, when we welcome all our lady members and their guests to Cooke Fields for what is always a memorable occasion (even if it is at times raucous, yet exciting!) But why not! As also happened last year, we are taking this ideal opportunity to raise funds for charity, and this time we have opted for Motor Neurone Disease Association (MNDA). Recently this disease seems to be afflicting more and more rugby players (Doddie Weir, Rob Burrow and, most recently, Ed Slater, to name but three high profile examples). Even though there is no medical evidence to verify any such connection, it is a truly horrible disease afflicting people in our sport, and we ask everyone to try and contribute in some way across the day. Specifically, we are again auctioning the specially designed 1st XV shirts after the game in the marquee. Please join us and enter a bid.

There is also some rugby taking place - with the visit of Kenilworth (who are most welcome) for the third round of league games. It is also hoped that the 3s can make a start to their season with Tamworth 2s making the short journey here; our 2s are scrambling to find a friendly somewhere. Tomorrow, the Colts are at home to Ledbury at 14:00 hrs, there is a full programme of junior games, and the minis are back into training. The opening round of women's league matches commence next Sunday and based on their friendlies to date, there are positive signs for our two sides. In a rearrangement, both of our ladies' teams are now playing at home on Sunday 2 October in a 'double header' in their respective leagues against Birmingham Moseley.

As ever, support to all our teams is much appreciated by the players. However, there are already worrying signs of playing numbers dropping off further around most clubs. In one of the main Midlands leagues last Saturday, four of the six games were awarded by walk overs. On the other side of the coin, Worcester RFC, who suffered at the hands of both Kenilworth and us in 21/22, have started in a very positive and healthy fashion with two wins from two – one good news rugby story in the city of Worcester.

Life back at level 5 is not proving to be easy. No excuses, we need to deal with the issues that we are confronted with and battle our way through - a real contrast to the relative comforts we enjoyed last season. We played well enough against Derby for an hour, but our lack of pre-season game time caught up with us and we finally went down 26-32 (earning 2 bonus points). Last week at Dudley K, we had to cope with six changes in the starting pack and inevitably our systems and processes were south of the necessary levels. Dudley, with a strong back line, took their chances well to beat us 38-14 (no

bonus points). Full match reports are on the website and on our social media outlets. David Mott and Sam Benson lead the way with 2 tries each.

Along with Stoke, Kenilworth were promoted with us to this newly formed league and have so far registered a narrow victory over Dudley K and last week lost by one point at home to Syston (15-16). Syston are possible favourites to win this league and they used their know how and nous to squeeze through an obviously tight match. After two rounds, Burton, Derby & Syston have perfect records, whilst like us, Nuneaton and Stoke are yet to win.

Next week, we are at home again against Syston. The 2s also play at home against the same opposition.

The 2s travelled to Dudley last week with the senior side and, after a dominant opening 40 minutes, eventually won 47-22. Sutton C, after crying off on week 1, have now withdrawn "their labour" from the 2s league - not good news. The colts, with two promising friendly victories in the pocket, travelled to Luctonians last Sunday and came close to an opening league success, just losing 13-5. In the juniors, the 14s through to 16s age groups all beat Wolverhampton, but the 13s lost in a one-sided affair.

So, everyone please enjoy our special day with us and if you can 'survive' today, we hope to see you next weekend - for a more traditional Saturday afternoon.


