# A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

We started last season, after a long period of inactivity, not really knowing what to expect, and it's fair to say that we were very pleasantly surprised by how all of our teams resumed playing with a great deal of style and a lot of success. A great credit to all of the coaching teams and the commitment of the players who kept the fitness and skill levels going throughout all of the lockdowns.

This time around things are a bit more 'normal' and we certainly know a bit more about what to expect for the Men's First team - as we step up to resume competition with many of the teams we battled with a few years ago. A much bigger challenge for sure, but one which the squad are eagerly anticipating.

Across our other senior Men's teams, the new season is harder to predict. One of the very few disappointments from last season was the much lower number of games that the 2s and the 3s had. This was largely through no fault of their own as we had fixtures agreed, and teams ready and very keen to play. But opposition cry-offs (and at times referee shortages), meant far too many games didn't happen, and as a result, very disjointed seasons for both teams. This underlying shortage of adult men now playing rugby regularly is a problem everywhere and is creating a major challenge for all clubs – both in maintaining playing standards and remaining financially viable. Let's hope the new season sees an improvement for everyone.

On the Ladies side, whilst playing numbers generally are on the increase, we now face our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team. This was always factored into our plans as part of the partnership with Tigers, and we now have a new second team entered into NC2 Midlands (West), but nevertheless (and for different reasons to the men) early season playing numbers may still be challenge.

There are always different challenges, but our focus remains on enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. Obviously, we are immensely proud of our playing successes, but our pride really comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players on view and the fact that most of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, the club is still extremely buoyant, and well-placed to continue our development - both on and off the field.

### **MATCH PREVIEW**

#### SPONSORS' DAY

Lichfield rugby club welcomes a number of our sponsors today - to lunch and to also enjoy all the other activities that occur on most Saturdays of the rugby season - especially when the men's 1st XV have a home league game. The club would like to register our sincere gratitude to all our sponsors for their ongoing support. It is your backing that is crucial in helping the club function as successfully as it does. Likewise, it is a pleasure to also see Bridgnorth RFC back at Cooke Fields for the first time since the 18/19 season, when our two matches ended with one victory apiece.

Bridgnorth come here with five victories from their seven games, which gives them fourth place with 24 points. Last week, they overcame Kenilworth by 31-28, coming back from being fourteen points in arrears in the second half – once again showing how reasonable leads can be easily whittled away with possession and pressure.

Our last two men's 1st XV games have been disappointing, for different reasons, apart the results. Against Oundle, we had led 28-24 at half time against the breeze, which then dropped after a short storm, and failed to convert the chances we created second half to be scoreless until very late on. Oundle kept working hard and they started to smell that maybe it was going to be their day and were rewarded with a slightly lucky try, followed by another immediately after.

Although Stoke were winless until last week, they played with confidence from the first minute, whilst our efforts were disjointed for large parts of the game. Our second try on the half hour mark brought us back to 17-15 down without us ever being anywhere near our "brilliant best". However, we didn't kick on from this position. A basic error gifted them, eventually, a penalty try right on half time and they put the game to bed with two soft tries soon after. Our potential is undoubtedly still there, but injuries are hurting us and hence confidence has not been high. Let's hope things change today, even if it's the football equivalent of a 1-0 win with the ball going in off a player's backside!

The mini/junior section continues to provide mascots for our first team matches and this week they are Arla Collins and Rory Beale, both from the U8s.

Next week, AWAY to Broad Street (KO 2:15), then 12th November at HOME to Bromsgrove (2:15).

The 2s won their latest league game a fortnight ago, right at the death against

Walsall 29–24. Aled John's boys scored four first half tries and then lost their way as they rotated the match squad but fought back positively from a red card to pinch their second victory out of four matches. Last week the 3rd XV were comfortable victors at Walsall (in their Staffordshire league), the score line of 52–29 might suggest that defensive duties were not top priority – most importantly, they enjoyed themselves. Today, the 2s are away at Birmingham Medics in their latest league fixture.

The women's first team (the Reds) lost their unbeaten record to a talented Buckingham Swans side last Sunday and now sit in second spot. They should have been at home to Cannock in a cup match tomorrow, but unfortunately their opposition have cried off. The Green team won convincingly at Stourbridge 66-0, which places them in fifth place in a congested top of the table. They are away at Winnington Park tomorrow – also in a cup match.

The colts have been inactive for a couple of weekends, but have another long journey tomorrow, visiting Hereford for the day. Let's see how the younger ones amongst them perform - 'fresh' from a tiring but challenging (& eventually successful) U17s tour in Spain this last week. In the morning, both the 16s and 14s are at home to Burton at 11:00. Support to all our many teams is most welcome.

It's now the time of the year when we like to promote our upcoming (and vital) social events. Importantly, let's start with the annual Bonfire Party on Friday 4 November, gates open at 6pm with two displays at 7:30 and 8:30pm. This year the Christmas lunch takes place on Saturday 3 December, starting at 12:00 with a three-course lunch, followed by what is our only home league game that month, against Dudley K. The mini/junior Christmas party is on Sunday 18 December. Full details of these events are also available on our website and our various social media platforms.


