A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

As we turn the year and enter the second half of the season, it's an appropriate time to take stock of where the club is at.

A very brief summary is that we're in a good place in pretty much all aspects of our activity – except possibly the adults men's rugby – where playing numbers and to some extent results are not where we would like them to be.

Moving back up to Level 5 for the Men's 1s was always going to be a tough step, and indeed that has proven to be the case – although not so much in being able to match the necessary standard in terms of fitness and skill levels, but to be able to field teams strong enough to do so consistently. Here's hoping that post-Christmas we can get a lot of the 'walking wounded' back in action and put together a string of positive performances.

But what's more worrying than current playing results though is the ever reducing numbers of fixtures and players for the Men's second and third teams. Generally there seems to be less and less people wanting to play adult men's rugby. This is not a new problem and certainly not unique to us, but the worrying trends from previous seasons have certainly continued into this one. We are always on the look-out for creative ways to address this issue (and the RFU are supposed to be helping too \boxtimes) but if you know anyone who may be looking to 'dust off' their boots (however infrequently), please point them in our direction.

Much more encouragingly, across both the Mini-Junior and the Ladies sections, playing numbers this season are generally on the increase, and results too continue to be very positive.

In our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior female players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team, results for both of our teams have been very good. The coaching support and the development pathway that the partnership with Tigers was intended to provide certainly seems to be delivering the goods. Long may this continue.

There are of course always different challenges to be faced - on and off the field - but our primary focus will always remain on attracting and enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. We are immensely proud of all our playing successes, but our real pride comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players and the fact that the vast majority of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm also glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, and ever increasing external pressure from the wider economy, the club is still in a good place and aiming to continue our development - both on and off the field.

So, in conclusion, many thanks to those of you who help us do this. In particular to our generous sponsors who support us in providing and developing these facilities, and our members and volunteers who all contribute to make our club such a success.

MATCH PREVIEW

Today's round 19 match brings Coventry side, Broad Street, to Cooke Fields. Originally, the 2s and 3s were also due to be at home in their respective leagues against Birmingham Medics and Shrewsbury 2s, but one of these has been postponed and the other one relocated. A sign of the recent times when it comes to men's rugby! But let's stay positive – it's still President's Day and we are expecting a really good turnout of VPs and other guests for this occasion. To all of you, as well as to Broad Street players and spectators, "welcome".

First team men's action has been a bit 'stop/start' this year and this trend certainly continued last Saturday at Kenilworth. The warm up for this (already once postponed) match was in progress when the referee – the only one on site – was called home for a family emergency. So the players shook hands at 1:45pm, and will now try again on 1st April. The league season was due to finish on 11 March – to allow time for the new Papa Johns Community Cup to then take place. But with two league games already rescheduled beyond that date we are now not sure what will happen?

Broad Street did not fare much better, conceding 90 points at home to Syston – no doubt affected by players having arranged other things, including going to Twickenham, on this "spare" Saturday, as indeed was the case with us. Both sides will be stronger today. Our first meeting ended with us scoring a last minute try to win 22-17, on a cold, dreary day in CV3.

Two weeks ago, we found ourselves up against a very committed Bridgnorth team, who were clinically good with the ball in their hands and were not afraid to put their bodies on the line to defend their end of the pitch. Our previous home game, the week before that, against Stoke was frozen off and will now be played on 18 March.

Since Christmas our 2nd XV have won their last three outings and now find themselves top of the table, admittedly having played more games than all the other sides. The 3s have also had two morale inducing wins in the last fortnight and we hope both of these outfits can keep up their form lines today.

Last Sunday, the women's Red and Green teams won through in their respective national cup ties, the former beating Sutton Coldfield 35-0 and the 2nd string Stamford 20-5. They are both in league action tomorrow, and are both situated in 2nd place in their respective leagues. The Red team are at home against Sutton (again) – KO at 2:00pm, and the Green team are visiting Bournville.

The colts are at home tomorrow afternoon as well, for a league match against Shrewsbury (2:00pm). Additionally, it is certainly worth mentioning that the 16

group are in their county final at Cannock RFC at 11:00am. They play Longton, who have been consistently strong in this age group throughout the years, but this year we have certainly been closing the gap! They would love your support if you have a free morning.

And let's give Joe Woodward a paragraph of his own. Having come through our mini/junior system, Joe is currently plying his trade at Leicester Tigers and, after being England 18 group captain, he made his debut last weekend for the national U20s side, which just beat Scotland. He certainly didn't let the side down.

Then finally whilst speaking of Mini-Juniors; today's mascots Theo and Jack are from the U7 age group and the gate attendants are all from the Under 14s. Thank you to everyone involved.

Next week, the men's 1st XV go to Bromsgrove, currently second, their ground is on Finstall Road (B60 3DH) and the following week we visit Syston, whose ground is on Barkby Road, Queniborough (LE7 3FE). Both start at 2:15pm.

The Past Players Day is on 4 March (when we will be at home to Burton - 3:00pm). If you are interested in attending this popular event, or you know someone who would be, please contact Barry Broad, who is assembling the attendees. Meet time will be around 1:00pm.

Finally, both 6 Nations internationals will be shown on the various TVs in the clubhouse, but if possible please support all our teams today...and tomorrow.


