# A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

We started last season, after a long period of inactivity, not really knowing what to expect, and it's fair to say that we were very pleasantly surprised by how all of our teams resumed playing with a great deal of style and a lot of success. A great credit to all of the coaching teams and the commitment of the players who kept the fitness and skill levels going throughout all of the lockdowns.

This time around things are a bit more 'normal' and we certainly know a bit more about what to expect for the Men's First team - as we step up to resume competition with many of the teams we battled with a few years ago. A much bigger challenge for sure, but one which the squad are eagerly anticipating.

Across our other senior Men's teams, the new season is harder to predict. One of the very few disappointments from last season was the much lower number of games that the 2s and the 3s had. This was largely through no fault of their own as we had fixtures agreed, and teams ready and very keen to play. But opposition cry-offs (and at times referee shortages), meant far too many games didn't happen, and as a result, very disjointed seasons for both teams. This underlying shortage of adult men now playing rugby regularly is a problem everywhere and is creating a major challenge for all clubs – both in maintaining playing standards and remaining financially viable. Let's hope the new season sees an improvement for everyone.

On the Ladies side, whilst playing numbers generally are on the increase, we now face our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team. This was always factored into our plans as part of the partnership with Tigers, and we now have a new second team entered into NC2 Midlands (West), but nevertheless (and for different reasons to the men) early season playing numbers may still be challenge.

There are always different challenges, but our focus remains on enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. Obviously, we are immensely proud of our playing successes, but our pride really comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players on view and the fact that most of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, the club is still extremely buoyant, and well-placed to continue our development - both on and off the field.

### **MATCH PREVIEW**

The 22/23 season effectively starts today with this fixture against Derby, who, like us, Kenilworth (here in 2 weeks' time) and Stoke have been promoted back to Level 5 league status. The whole league structure has been revamped this season and the changes include clubs being able to put their lower sides into the league programme - although we have adopted a different approach (see below).

We are very much as we were the last campaign with the same coaching team, Charlie Milner remains as captain (although he has been one of the walking wounded as of late – heat and hard grounds have affected many players throughout the country apparently) – and we have the men's 2s and 3s ready to go into local reserve team merit tables. The colts remain in the North Midlands Colts Division 1 (playing on Sundays) with a fair amount of travelling involved. All fixtures are now on the website, including for the mini/juniors. Their season officially starts tomorrow but they are having a "Family Fun Day" here today – consisting of both rugby and non-rugby events pre and post-match. For the record, the 2s are off to Sutton today for their first competitive game.

The women's Red and Green teams have dropped down one and two levels respectively - to reflect the movement of players to Leicester Tigers under our new partnership agreement, which is intended to provide a proven pathway for player development for women and girls at youth level. The women's league games start on 25 September. Touch Rugby (mixed and for all ages) is back on Monday evenings.

There is a risk that the 1st XV may be slightly undercooked for today's match having played no warm up games, after Wilmslow cried off following a raft of injuries from their previous outing. It may be that owing to the summer we've had, clubs have had to concentrate more on fitness than individual/collective skills. But we are all in the same boat if that is the case. It is definitely pleasing to note that last year's successful colts side have already started to make good inroads in the senior game. Something that the RFU are trying to encourage throughout the country, with player numbers down following the covid break.

Derby finished last season in 3rd position in the equivalent East Midlands league as the one we won, and were at one stage being lined up to join a league with plenty of sides in Yorkshire and even Northumberland. However, West Bridgford eventually drew the short straw on that one. They have managed a couple of warm up victories over the past 3 weeks and after very similar experiences to ours in recent seasons are hopeful of being competitive in this league.

Next week, we travel to Dudley K (Swindon Rd, Kinver DY6 0AW), a side who found this level testing in 21/2, but showed improvement throughout the campaign. In two weeks, we HOST Kenilworth, all games start at 15:00 hrs until the end of October. The long-awaited Ladies' Day takes place alongside this Kenilworth fixture and, whilst it is already a sell-out, all of us can help by supporting the chosen charity for the day (Motor Neurone Disease Association), a disease which sadly is starting to be linked more and more with rugby players. Once again, the Is will wear a shirt especially designed for the day and these will be auctioned in the marquee after the game. The Sportsman's dinner this coming Friday will also be supporting this worthy cause. We have a third home game in September with the visit of Syston on 24th.

Well done to Dave Lote for his charity exploits last weekend, run completed and £s target achieved.

All the experimental laws we witnessed last season have now been ratified as adopted laws, including the 50/22 kicks and the changes around goal line dropouts, rather than 5 metre scrums. There continues to be more & more scrutiny of high tackles and head injuries of any sort – rightly so.

We hope that everyone visiting Cooke Fields today enjoys their various experiences and will find time throughout the season to return to watch and support our many teams and the club in general.
