### A FEW WORDS FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Welcome to Cooke Fields – the home of Lichfield Rugby Club. I really hope you enjoy the game and get to see some exciting and entertaining rugby.

As we turn the year and enter the second half of the season, it's an appropriate time to take stock of where the club is at.

A very brief summary is that we're in a good place in pretty much all aspects of our activity – except possibly the adults men's rugby – where playing numbers and to some extent results are not where we would like them to be.

Moving back up to Level 5 for the Men's 1s was always going to be a tough step, and indeed that has proven to be the case – although not so much in being able to match the necessary standard in terms of fitness and skill levels, but to be able to field teams strong enough to do so consistently. Here's hoping that post-Christmas we can get a lot of the 'walking wounded' back in action and put together a string of positive performances.

But what's more worrying than current playing results though is the ever reducing numbers of fixtures and players for the Men's second and third teams. Generally there seems to be less and less people wanting to play adult men's rugby. This is not a new problem and certainly not unique to us, but the worrying trends from previous seasons have certainly continued into this one. We are always on the look-out for creative ways to address this issue (and the RFU are supposed to be helping too  $\square$ ) but if you know anyone who may be looking to 'dust off' their boots (however infrequently), please point them in our direction.

Much more encouragingly, across both the Mini-Junior and the Ladies sections, playing numbers this season are generally on the increase, and results too continue to be very positive.

In our first season after 'losing' a significant number of our more senior female players to the newly founded Leicester Tigers Women's team, results for both of our teams have been very good. The coaching support and the development pathway that the partnership with Tigers was intended to provide certainly seems to be delivering the goods. Long may this continue.

There are of course always different challenges to be faced - on and off the field - but our primary focus will always remain on attracting and enabling as many players as possible to participate and enjoy the game. We are immensely proud of all our playing successes, but our real pride comes from seeing the numbers and the skills of the players and the fact that the vast majority of them have developed those skills through the junior sections of our club. And then very importantly that we proudly remain a community amateur club, and that players are playing here because they enjoy the challenge, the camaraderie and the resources and experiences that we can provide. And not because of any financial incentives they have been offered or could enjoy elsewhere. The role for myself and the others involved in the management of the club is 'simply' to provide the facilities and the environment to attract and support the players and coaches and in doing so, also provide an asset to the local community that many other people can enjoy. I'm also glad to report that after a very challenging few years for us all, and ever increasing external pressure from the wider economy, the club is still in a good place and aiming to continue our development - both on and off the field.

So, in conclusion, many thanks to those of you who help us do this. In particular to our generous sponsors who support us in providing and developing these facilities, and our members and volunteers who all contribute to make our club such a success.

### **MATCH PREVIEW**

After a five week break – not ideal for clubs or participation in the sport of rugby – we return to league action (Round 15) and we hope to have a very busy day at Cooke Fields. All three senior men's sides are due to be at home today in their varying leagues. As well as the 1st XV return fixture, the 2s are also facing Nuneaton, whilst the 3rd XV has a real local derby against Whittington. In addition, the colts have a friendly game at Stoke in preparation for next week's cup game (see below). There are no women's fixtures this weekend, however, the 15s have a home cup match against Telford at 11:00 tomorrow and the 14s are also at home at the same hour.

So, as we start 2023 let's have a brief catch up of where the various sides are. The Is game (lead fixture) is a meeting of the bottom two sides, with both teams now needing to put together a run of wins (and gaining bonus points), whenever and wherever possible. The original game on a beautiful sunny day at the start of October was a try and point fest, from which we gained a valuable 50-39 victory. On the same day, at the same venue, the 2s lost to Nuns 2s, so Aled John's boys will be looking for "revenge". This probably also applies to the 3s, who previously lost 13-7 to Whittington. Both the 2s and 3s are mid-table in their respective leagues.

The women's Red team, who restart next Sunday at home (14:15) to Shelford, lie in 2nd place in their level 3 league and the Green team are also 2nd in a very tight top five covered by just three points. They go to Handsworth (who are the only side to defeat them so far) next Sunday. As was announced before Christmas, the Tigers women's side, with a nucleus of Lichfield players in their ranks, have had their application to join the Premiership next season accepted. This provides an even better target for our players to develop and, along with our proven coaching set up, will (we trust) help us to attract players of all ages, abilities and ambition.

The colts, who are proving to be competitive in their league and strangely are in 4th spot (with more points than two of the sides above them!?), are at home next Sunday against Old Laurentians in a last 16 National Colts Cup tie (14:00). We reached the same stage last season, before losing out to Kettering. Dave Butler and his coaching team are hoping for even better this time around. Worth noting that we have fielded five – three regularly – players in the 1st XV this season, who were playing in senior colts rugby a year ago, so this season's contingent need as much support as possible next weekend. They are our future!

Next Saturday the 1st XV league game is at Oundle, our first ever visit there, their

ground is in Occupation Road PE8 4RU (14:15) and the following week, we are HOME to Stoke. The Friary Past Players are having their annual reunion lunch that day and there are still a few places available – contact Barry Broad.

The two games postponed last month owing to the weather have been rearranged for: Kenilworth (A) on 4 February and Syston (A) on 25 February. The last league game is due to be played on 11 March, which will then be followed by the Papa Johns Community Cup. Our women's sides have already started playing in their respective competitions (sides are graded based on their league positions and abilities).

Ed Slater has unfortunately become the most recent rugby "MND Warrior" (Rob Burrow's words), joining the battle to raise awareness and funds for MNDA and in December at Welford Road it was the club's privilege to be able to present him with a cheque for £7,500 from our efforts, mainly on Ladies' Day and at the Sportsmen's dinner (see front page photo). We are continue to be committed to supporting this worthy cause and it is certainly worth listening to the inspiring words of Kevin Sinfield and Doddie Weir's eldest son at the BBC SPOTY awards.

Finally, a date for your diaries is the Past Players' Day on 4 March – home to Burton (KO 15:00). In the meantime, your support to all our many sides is much appreciated, especially on these colder winter days.




