Match tips for parents

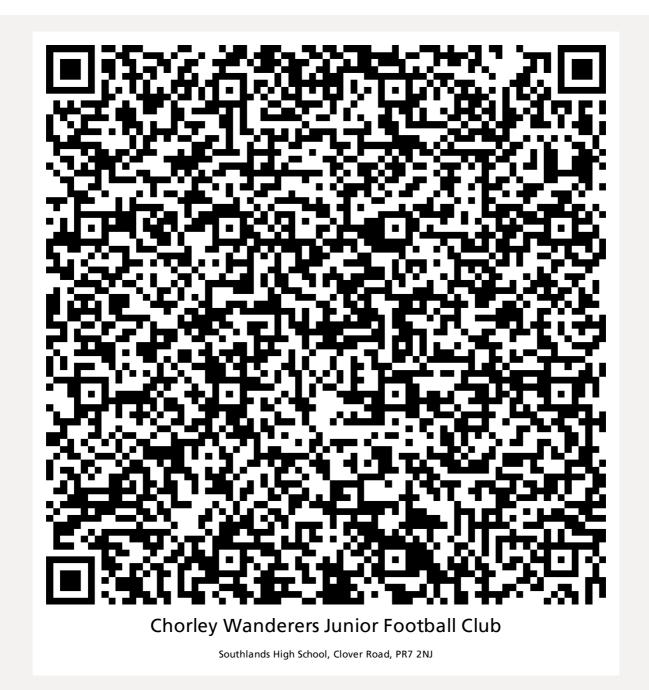
