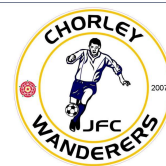

I have read and understand the guidance documents issued by the club and agree to play their part to fully comply with them. As such I understand the risks associated with participation in relation to COVID-19 and agree waiver of liability and indemnity, holding the club harmless towards and liability associated with COVID-19 except for those arising out of willful misconduct or gross negligence.

The health and safety of our members, families and volunteers remains the top priority of Chorley Wanderers.

A copy of the clubs risk assessment and pictogram guidance documents has been supplied to every member and by signing this form you are confirming that you have read and understood the activities now being offered by the club, the control measures the club are taking and the role you and your child play in these to manage risks in relation to COVID 19 and current government guidance.

A screening form is also to be signed and dated. Pre screening prior to every session **MUST** be completed by the parent prior to the child attending, do not attend and follow government guidelines if any symptoms are present.

Current first Aid guidelines are such that no coach can intervene to assist unless a life threatening or limb threatening injury and even then will be expected to wear full PPE per current guidance notes should this situation arise.

Intervention for minor first aid matters and support to the young person can only be provided by persons from their own support bubble. It is the clubs preferred stance therefore that a parent should be present at every session / match to ensure this is possible when a coach requests it.

However the club recognizes that a child of 14 and above may be mature and competent enough to self administer basic first aid or deal with minor injuries themselves when guided at a safe distance by the coach.

By signing this form you also confirm that you deem your child sufficiently competent to do so and are happy that the coach will only offer guidance from a safe distance should you not be in attendance.

You also confirm that if you are not in attendance that you will be contactable at all times on the mobile phone number provided on this form and that you or somebody from the child's support bubble will be able to attend the venue within 15 minutes of being contacted by the coach.

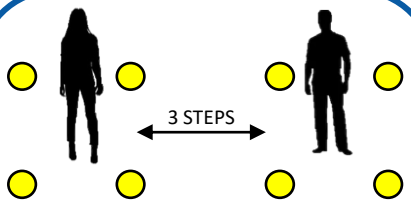

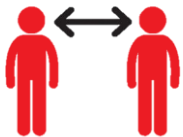

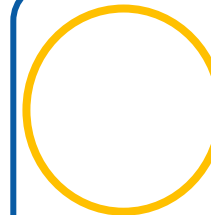

PREPARATION AT HOME



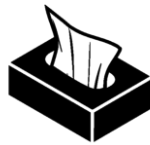
WEAR CLEAN COACHING KIT.

REMAIN 3 STEPS APART FROM ANYONE ELSE THROUGHOUT.

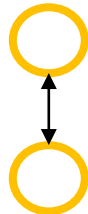
ARRIVAL AT TRAINING



ASSESS THE AREA FOR POTENTIAL DANGERS, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE PREPARED RISK ASSESSMENT.



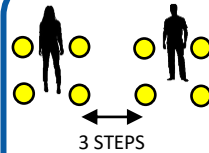
APPLY GLOVES AND BEGIN TO DISINFECT ALL EQUIPMENT TO BE USED PRIOR TO THE SESSION.



SET-UP PLAYER 'SAFE ZONES' USING HOOPS ENSURE THEY ARE 2 METRES APART.



ORGANISE A CLEAR 'FIRST AID AREA'.



ORGANISE A CLEAR 'PARENTS AREA'



SET-UP AND ORGANISE THE SESSION.

Match tips for parents

Please maintain social distance and sanitise your hands on arrival. Ensure your child takes their own water bottle and their own hand sanitiser, both clearly marked with their name. They must not share these with anyone else.

Please maintain social distancing whilst watching the match from behind the ropes on your teams side of the pitch.

Please retrieve any stray balls with your feet and avoid touching any equipment.





Managers First Aid Grab Bag

For EVERY match you must have a grab bag close at hand containing;
Gloves, Apron, Fluid resistant coverall, Fabric mask, Fluid resistant Surgical face mask, Filtering Face Piece Respirator mask, Goggles and full face visor.

*** Reusable equipment appropriately decontaminated to PHE standards that can be reused¹³.
