1 Introduction

3 Outstanding matters from 2019 meeting

a) Pitch update

JM explained that everything is in place and we are ready to begin the work on the pitch, but this is COVID19 dependent.

The plan is to begin work in July/August and will take 6 weeks so should be finished for September. If the work is delayed then we will have to use an alternative pitch for 6 weeks, most likely Mangotsfield.

The new pitch can be split into 4 quarters with 3 new nets so more flexibility for training, new bigger dugouts, spectators section behind the fence, recycling bins should be installed, colour of the pitch TBC green with blue outside, improved drainage, logo on goals and dugouts, shed to be built and installed when we are allowed back onto site.

4 Committee reports

a) Club survey responses – Jessica Murray

Jessica Murray presented the findings of the club survey which included the following:

therefore we will continue to make all announcements across all 3 platforms and by email

- We received mostly positive feedback about the club fees & fee payment structure, teas and coaching, communication, selection, events, direction of the club
- Less positive responses about the facilities at Wellsway and feedback has been passed on to the school
- Feedback about training the extra half an hour "fairly successful" there is a proposal to come later about changing training times
- Timeslots for training responses varied and there was no one preference for female/male members

Along with summer league we had visits from 3 different hockey heroes over the summer. The academy had a masterclass from Crista Cullen and the wider club had a masterclass with Zoe Shipperly and Sophie Trigg. Thank you to Emma and Lou who organised these.

Towards the end of the summer Keynsham Hockey Club got involved with the Flyerz movement with England Hockey. We hosted our very own disability inclusive session. Thanks again to everybody who helped run this session. INTERNATIONAL MATCH.

We finished the summer season off with our usual memorial tournament. The sun was shining as lots of us came together for a fun filled day. Again, a massive thank you to Louisa for her efforts in making this day happen.

The season itself has gone really well. We know the men have struggled for players, I appreciate it can be very frustrating playing weekly with the bare minimum but thank you for your good spirits and commitment. We did a recruitment drive at the start of the season and saw quite a few new faces. It is something I am intending to continue to work on. A big welcome to all of our new members I hope you have enjoyed your first season of hockey with us. We have also ran a men's indoor team this season so well done to those who took part in that.

The ladies' section has also gained quite a few new members meaning that with large numbers some people have had to be rested. Thank you to everyone for being so flexible and to those who have offered to rest on weeks we have had too many. It really is a great thing for the club to have so many members and to be continually expanding. It was definitely reflected in the results of all three teams this season.

On that note I would like to say a huge thank you to our captains, vice captains and chair's of selection. We know it can be very difficult and time-consuming organising and leading the teams each week even until the morning of the match. On this note a huge thank you Andrea for her efforts throughout the season as fixtures secretary. It can't have been easy re-arranging all those matches. You have done a brilliant job.

Our academy sessions have continued to thrive this season. It really is incredible to see so many little ones running around on a Wednesday and Friday evening in KHC tops. I'm not sure of the exact numbers this season but I know last year we went from around 50 to over 100 academy members and there still seems to be so many! This season our academy has taken part in various festivals and tournaments and have loved it. I won't give too much away as I'm sure Rich will cover in in the academy report. The academy is the basis for the club and I'm sure in years to come we will see many of them come through to the adult section. Thank you to Andy and Scott for coaching these sessions. For anyone who has helped with an academy session you will appreciate how much patience is needed and keep that many children involved so thank you.

Thank you also too Rich for all your hard work in running the academy this season. I would not have been able to do it without you. Big thank you to our academy helpers such as Lou, Olly, Rachel, Katy, Syd and anyone else who gives up their time to support it.

Along with our standard academy this season we have been working with England Hockey and have started to run two lots of Hockey Heroes sessions this season. We were one of the few clubs in the country chosen to pilot this new movement. For anyone who isn't aware these are 6-week sessions for 1 hour every Sunday for 5-8 year old's. It's been very exciting and very successful. Katherine has worked extremely hard to lead this and provide material each week. I have managed to support with a few, and it was fantastic seeing them having so much fun. Thank you so much Katherine. And thank you to Tim, Jess, Tom and anybody else who helped with this. From this a few of our Hockey Heroes have gone on to join the

primary academy which is amazing. Coronavirus has unfortunately put our second block on hold, but we hope to continue this next season.

Along with the on-pitch excitement we have had lots of socials. I'm sure a lot of you will be familiar with a KHC headache, we are particularly good at celebrating off of the pitch. Thank you to our fabulous event's organiser Louisa. Your efforts do not go unnoticed you have done an amazing job. Thank you to anyone who has helped with events this season too. The money raised helps us discount other events so thank you to those who continue to support the club off of the pitch. Unfortunately, Coronavirus has delayed our end of season plans but we still plan to have our awards evening early in next season.

Behind the scenes this season the committee have been working closely with England Hockey to try and get ClubMark Accreditation. This included providing several bits of evidence for 18 different sections to show how we meet the criteria for clubmark and that we have good practices in place to enable us to provide good quality hockey in a sustainable and vibrant environment. We have produced several documents such as a five-year club development plan, coach development plan, safeguarding guidance, risk assessment forms and various other documents that will be available to members on the website. As of yesterday, we received our official sign off and are now a ClubMark Accredited club. It is such a great achievement to be recognised as a high-quality club.

This leads me on to thank my amazing committee for all your support and hard work this season. These people really do give up so much time behind the scenes and the club would not run without them. A special mention to Charlotte, membership is a big task and you have really supported me this season. Thank you Jess for being my secretary and doing basically anything I ask you to do. c) Treasurer's report – Richard May

Richard May presented a series of slides which showed figures for the accounts 19/20

- Club cash assets as of April 2019 = £11.8k
- In 19/20 the club spent ~£38k and took in ~£33k resulting in a net loss ~£4.7k, following adjustments resulted in a profit loss of £13.05
- Cash assets April 2020 = £6559
- We estimate a reduced revenue of ~£11,283, we estimate a reduce expenditure of ~£15,505 will save ~£4220 and have identified areas we are going to make savings in
- Initially we looked at increasing fees due to pitch fees are going up but we have worked hard to look at ways to save money and this has been possible by reducing

pitch hire on a Wednesday by 30 mins, reduced price of teas, no indoor team next season. Unfortunately, fees will likely need to increase in the future, but we will work to keep them the same for as long as we can.

- Lots of purchases last year means we have a reduced expend this year away kit,
 academy goalkeeping kits
- Half of the club's loss of income is due to no summer league


6 Updates/matters to discuss

- a) Membership fees JM

 - > If anyone can't make the new date but has paid you will be refunded


7 Proposals

c) Ladies Summer league – tier league system

- Proposal by Katherine Sears
- This year it was decided to run Summer League in a two-tier league system. The reasoning behind this was to not play all Summer, allowing players a break between winter leagues and allowing clubs to run selection matches prior to the Winter season starting in September. It was previously voted to alternate mixed teams with selected teams each year but with this new structure I propose that we enter three teams selected on playing levels as this would suit the league they were in. This, of course, would not be set in stone and as with previous years people can move around depending on availability etc. It would mean teams are playing against opposition of similar level and would be a good preparation for the season. This whole restructure is a trial and I will be getting feedback from clubs after. If it is decided to revert back to the old structure then of course we would revert back to mixing the teams one year and selecting the next, starting with mixed team
- ➤ Mandy Haskins queried whether there would be the opportunity for progression during the summer league KS replied of course and like previous years players can play fluidly for each team as they will be a good opportunity to trial players in different teams
- ➤ Louise Bale I agree this is good idea to give us time for proper selection matches and that it will help with selection for winter league
- ➤ Mandy Haskins queried about whether we could still play hockey over summer if lockdown ended but not enough time for summer league JM replied we'll be looking to put hockey on as soon as we can, may need to play at Mangotsfield if Wellsway pitch is being relaid
- A vote was taken using strawpoll and there was a majority vote in favour of agreeing to the proposed changes. *The motion was carried.*
