Hugh - I hope you like these numbers.

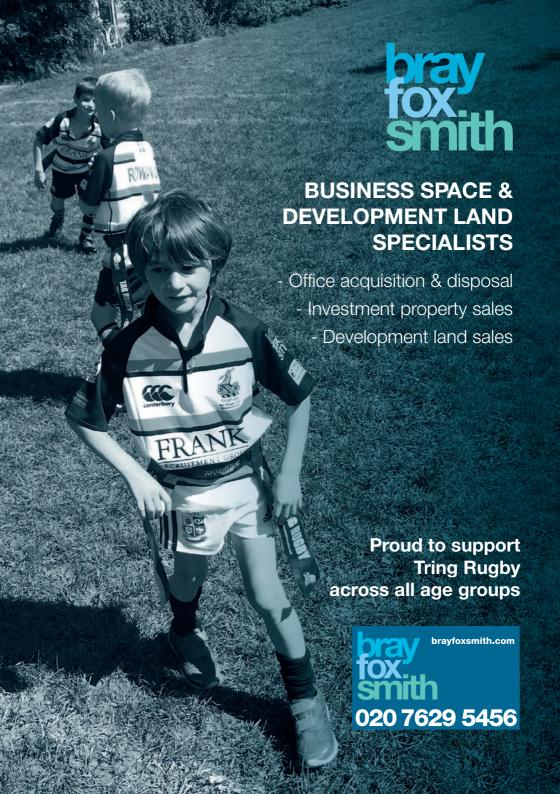
