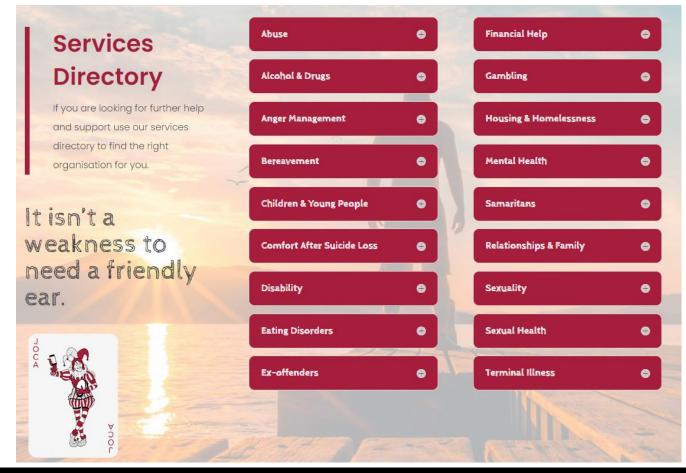

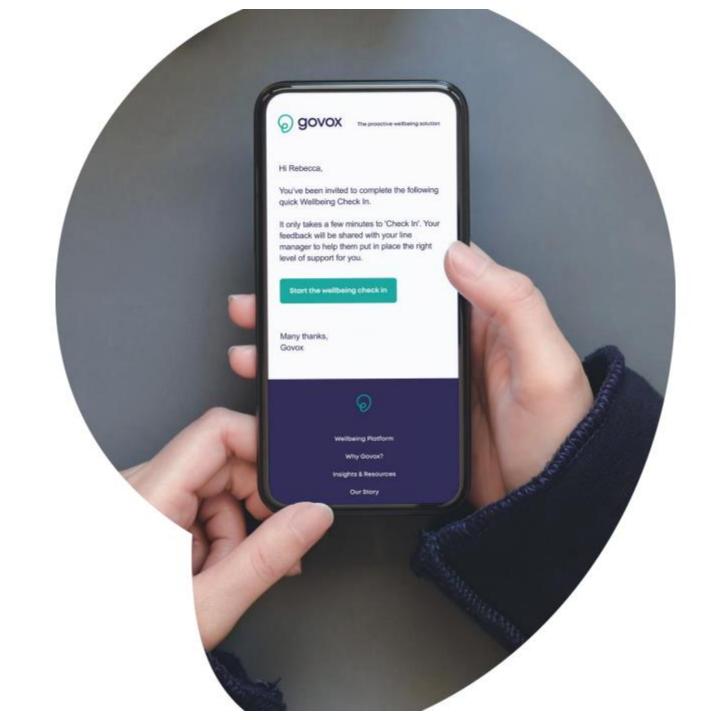
Connect - Proactive

Users are regularly invited to check in on their digital device and answer a series of short, non-intrusive questions.

This takes less than two minutes and the Check In can be tailored to your team for increased engagement.

You have the option to allow users to choose, each time they Check In, if they want to remain anonymous or if they are happy for their responses to be visible to the nominated support in your organisation.

Less than 1% of Govox users choose to remain anonymous!



Identify - visible

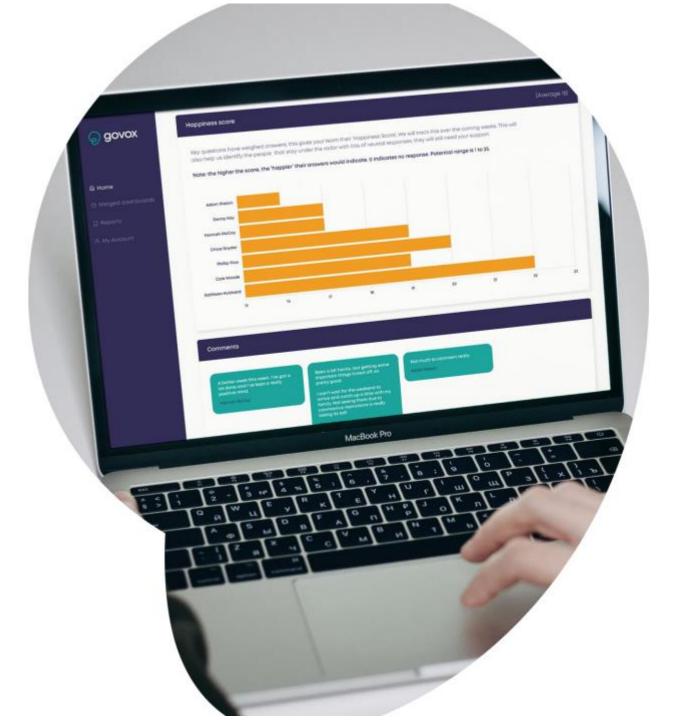
Check-in results on your online wellbeing dashboard instantly highlight at-risk individuals and who would benefit most from support.

This transparent approach is unique to our platform, enabling employers to prioritise support and resources – and begin the conversations that matter.

If users choose to remain anonymous (this time) they simply don't feature on the dashboard

Alert feature (optional). An email alert will notify you of any person identified as needing specific support (because they've triggered an agreed criteria).

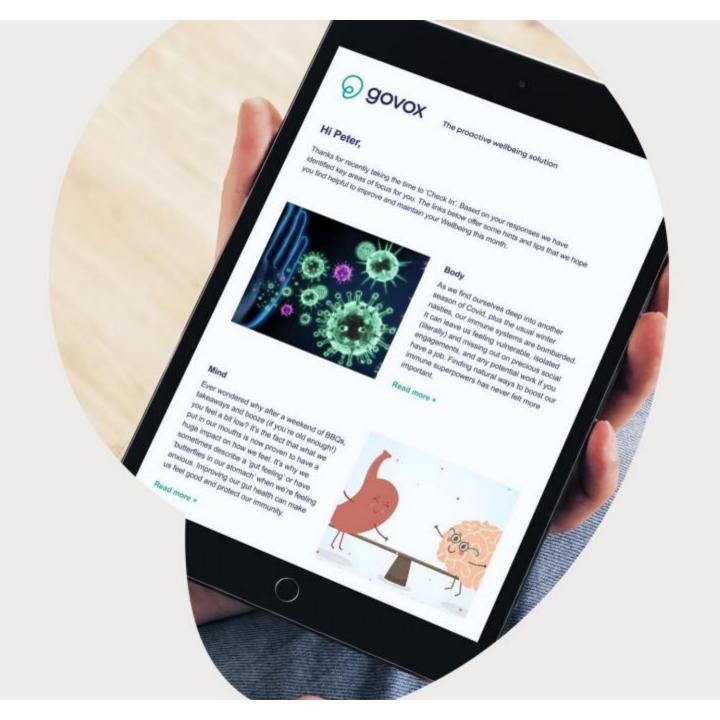

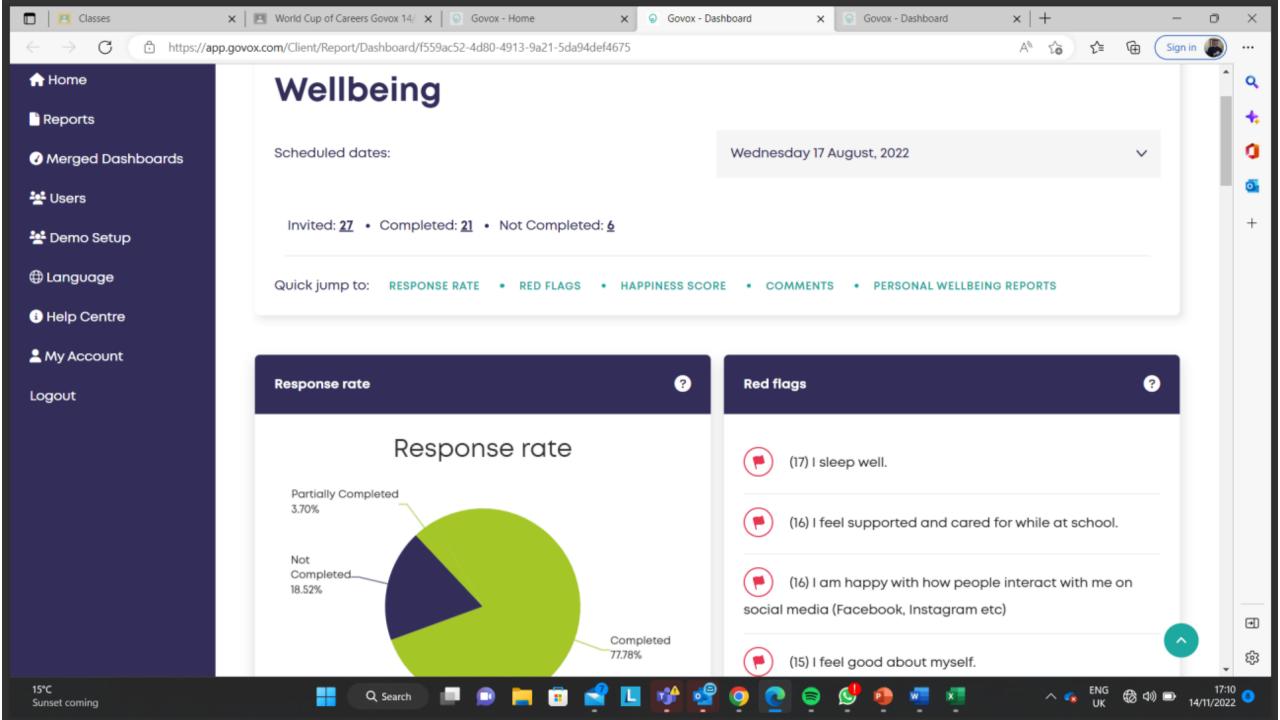
After each check in, a user will receive their own personal wellbeing report. Its contents are based entirely on the individual's given responses and offers proven wellbeing techniques.
