Risk -The likelihood of harm or injury occurring due to that hazard

Appendix 1: Summary of Risk Reduction Actions for Adults and U18s Playing Adult Hockey

PPE

The use of the following personal protective equipment is recommended for all, but is mandatory for all under 18s (U18s) playing with adults, during training and competitions:-

- 1. Hi-Impact mouthguard
- 2. Full length shin pads
- 3. Protective hard-shell glove minimum (L) hand glove.
- 4. Face guard, if defending short corners full caged face guards are preferable.

The responsibility to ensure U18 PPE is available at every session and maintained rests with U18s' parents/guardians.

Defence of short corners

No U12 will defend a short corner. Over 12s can be coached to defend short corners.

No one will be expected to defend short corners if they are unwilling.

Captains and players can jointly decide when U18s are suitably confident and competent to defend short corners, with face protection, in adult league games.

Reporting Injuries

If any player sustains an injury that results in them being removed from the field of play, the incident will be recorded by the captain or their delegate using the Podium App.

All players need to consent to use of personal data with Podium and parents/guardians will need to provide consent on behalf of any U18s.

It is good practice to communication any U18 injury to their parent/guardian and in addition follow up as to the young person's well-being.

In the event of a head injury players/parents/guardians should be signposted to https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-injury-and-concussion/

Consideration needs to be given to suitability of returning to play after injury, particularly following head injury.

Pre-existing Medical Conditions

All those with a pre-existing medical condition that might require a first aider to take action in an emergency or who routinely carry medication with them for emergency use are asked to inform their captain, who may pass that information to the first aiders. It is the responsibility of the player or their parent/guardian to update the captain in case of any changes. Parents/guardians are responsible for ensuring any such medication is available at every session and that captains/first aiders know where it is stored.
