GETTING STARTED

Firstly, you will need to join the club by registering through the club website https://www.berkohockeyclub.com

You will have been in contact with someone at the club, but if you are not sure which team you'll be playing for, sign up for a lower team and you will be moved by the club captain if that team isn't the best fit for you. You will also be allocated a club number which you need to have printed on to the back of your shirt when playing league matches.

In addition, England Hockey require all players to register with their Game Management System (GMS). GMS is a system that records hockey matches in England, it holds all club team and player records as well as game data entered by the team captains or managers.

Finally, we record all hockey related injuries using a digital platform, SportSmart.
The programme enables effective risk management and injury prevention for sport. When you register with the club we will add you to the platform.

Subs and match fees - what's the difference?

BHHHC charge subscription fees and match fees to cover the costs of playing hockey. Hockey subscription fees (subs) are due at the beginning of the winter season, and match fees at each game played. These fees enable the club to provide coaching, umpires, pitches, insurance, kit and league entries for members. Once you have registered as a member, subscription fees will automatically be requested and payment is straight forward via the website on pitchero. Weekly match fees are due on the day you play and again is straight forward using Pitchero. For full information of prices and concessions visit:

Please indicate before Monday evening your availability to play the following Saturday. If you are not sure please record yourself as a 'maybe', adding a little explanation if possible. This really helps the captains know who is available for selection.

You will get a message via Pitchero indicating which team you've been selected to play for. Please confirm that you are playing at that stage, so that the squad is sure you are coming.

Club policy is to create the best possible teams in order to win matches; we also need to ensure there is adequate cover for each of the teams, so it's possible you could be asked to play up or down from your usual squad.

All times and locations of matches are published on Pitchero. Times stated are actual push-back times, teams will normally meet $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before the match for warm up and team tactics. This is an important part of the preparation to play, so please do try to arrive on time.

It's very usual for teams to share lifts, particularly for away matches as its good fun and obviously better for the world. Let your captain know if you would like a lift. If you are U18, our safeguarding policy advises against travelling with just 1 other adult, so we always try to get you in a car with several others.

Players usually come in their kit ready to play; we do have changing facilities at the club but they are shared, so are accessible to all club members. It is standard to wear home kit even when away from home, unless there is a colour clash with the opposition. Captains will let the team know if there is a need to switch to the away strip. If you don't have a red 'away' top it often possible to borrow one, just ask.

Remember to bring water with you to matches.

Keeping safe

Having the right equipment helps to minimise risk of injury, take a few minutes to make sure you have that equipment for safer play.

It's mandatory for U18s to wear a properly fitting mouth guard, full length hockey shin pads, a (L) handed hard-shell glove plus a face guard if defending a short corner. It is highly recommended that all players also follow this guidance.

The club has worked with market leaders, Opro to create a bespoke Instant Custom-Fit mouthguard, which provides high quality mouth protection. For details on how to order, please check the club website. High-impact guards are always required for hockey.

Our supplier Chiltern Sports, has a range of sports equipment:

Hard shell protective gloves are available in a range of sizes. The Left hand is most vulnerable to impact, however protective gloves can be worn on both hands to reduce risk of injury. All Under U18s training and playing in adult teams must wear a glove on (L) hand as a minimum. If you regularly defend short corners a face guard must be a part of your protective gear. We have a few club faceguards which you may borrow if they are available on the day until you get your own equipment sorted

Hockey astro shoes provide stability and some foot protection from impact with the ball compared with other types of footwear. Hockey Astros are suitable for use on the astro surface, and will reduce the risk of slipping and ankle injury. Trainers do not provide these same benefits.

Goal Keepers obviously need full protection. If you don't have your own kit, the club does have kit to borrow. Ask either the Ladies or Men's Club Captain for specific help and advice.

Each team carries a first aid kit and we aim to have a first aider in every squad. If you or your child has a medical condition that might require a first aider to take action in an emergency or you carry medication with you that might need to be used, please let your captain or coach know. They will pass on the information to the first aiders in your team so they might be better prepared to help you if and when it's needed. If your medical condition changes, it's your responsibility to make sure you keep your captain/coach updated. All first aiders and captains are aware to treat all personal information sensitively.

Last minute changes and team chat

Any last minute changes will be communicated using messaging on Pitchero. Most teams also have a WhatsApp group for everyone over 16. You will be invited to join for general hockey chat. If you are Under 16 playing in an adult team, your parent or guardian can join the WhatsApp group on your behalf.

Obviously sometimes things change for you too, if you are running late or your availability changes last minute, please make sure your captain has got that message so they can plan the necessary changes.





Remember to thank the umpires as without them the games can't take place. We give '3 cheers' to the opposition, led by the captain and thank individual opposition players.

Its standard practice for the team to go back to the club house for post-match 'teas'. If you would like food please let the captain know by Thursday. If you don't want to eat, just come back for a drink and a chat. This is the time for teams to choose their player of the match, it's an easy way to get to know your team mates.

Monday Night All Club Training is held at Cow Roast, Tring, HP23 5RF Young players are welcome from 13 years upwards. Both men and women train together in energetic drills and match practice.

Performance Training takes place on Wednesday evenings. This session is for players in the 1s and 2s. If you are not in those squads yet but are aspiring to get in, you may be invited to join them.

All timings for these sessions are advertised on Pitchero, please check there for any changes to your slot and for additional opportunities to play.

Walking Hockey takes place in term time on Tuesdays at 1pm. It's mixed hockey at a gentler pace for all ages and abilities. Contact *walking@berkohockeyclub.com* for more information or check the website.
