

JUNIOR MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

St Chad's Broomfield Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its junior members.

This Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents, carers or guardians associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with the Club Safeguarding Officer.

As a member of St Chad's Broomfield Cricket Club, you are expected to abide by the following Junior Member Code of Conduct:

- 1. All junior members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions. Dissent towards officials will invite sanction from the Club's disciplinary officers.
- 2. All junior members and parents must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion. Do not make derogatory comments or gestures towards colleagues or opponents and do not attempt to intimidate the opposition by threats or excessive triumphalism.
- 3. Junior members should keep to the agreed timings for training and matches or inform their coach or team manager if they cannot play or are going to be late.
- 4. Junior members must wear suitable kit. Cricket whites and suitable trainers or cricket shoes should be worn for matches, but tracksuits are permitted for training sessions.
- 5. All players under the age of 18 years must wear helmets when batting and when standing up to the stumps when wicket-keeping.
- 6. Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind, or smoke or vape on the Club premises or whilst representing the Club.
