Who are we?

We are an ECB ClubMark approved club and welcome players of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds to play both social and competitive cricket. We offer a wide range of cricket on Saturdays, Sundays, and midweek.

Originally the club existed purely for Bank of England staff and pensioners, but over time this grew to include family members and ex staff. Small numbers of non-Bank affiliated individuals were eventually permitted, but it was not until 2020 that we became a fully open club. We continue to recognise our Bank heritage and affiliation by aiming to be the cricket club of choice for staff in the London area, whilst also being welcome to all in the local community.

Our junior section was founded in 1993 thanks to the hard work of Barry Brown, and what began with just a small number of young cricketers has since expanded into a thriving membership. Many of our young cricketers have gone on to represent the club at all levels, and we aim to continue developing our own talent for the future.

Where are we based?

We can be found in South-West London, making us accessible for both those within London and north-east Surrey.

Our home from 1908 was the Bank of England Sports Centre in Roehampton. However, in 2019 the Bank took the decision to lease out the site, so our new home ground since 2020 has been Oberon Playing Fields in Raynes Park.

Club History

There are historical records of a Bank of England Cricket Club (BOECC) dating back to 1867, but fixtures were infrequent and the club loosely formalised. The modern founding of the club occurred in 1908 with the formation of the Bank of England Sports Club in Roehampton, South-West London.

The club played friendly cricket from 1908 through to 1970, with the superb facilities attracting fine opposition from both near and far. Four Saturday teams and multiple Sunday sides were fielded, with club records being set that still stand to this day; B.A Smith's 145 wickets in 1942, Peter Feldwick's 10-46 in 1946, Ralph Smith's 193 not out in 1947, plus John Hopwood's 2055 runs in 1948.

Our league adventures began in 1971 with the formation of the Surrey Cricketers League (SCL). We did not win any silverware but were fundamental to the continued organisation of the league, with our own Barry Hoffmann eventually becoming its Chair. In 1987 the SCL merged with the Surrey Championship (originally formed in 1968), which is where we have played ever since.

Playing availability was excellent throughout this period, and for several years the club were able to field five Saturday teams. This helped the 1st XI to our first promotion from Division 2 in 1989, as we took a seat at the top table of Surrey cricket for the first time. The feat was repeated in 1993, this time unbeaten, eventually leading to our highest ever finish of 4th in Division 1 in 1999. At the time this made us the fourth best team in all of Surrey – not bad for a bunch of bankers! It also earned qualification for the first ever season of the newly formed Premier League in 2000.

This proved to be a short-lived experience as relegation swiftly followed, but in 2001 we bounced back for another crack at the Premier League in 2002. Immediate relegation again followed, and this remains our most recent season in the top division. A period of rebuilding followed as we yo-yoed between the divisions, mostly downwards, and by 2009 were in Division 3. The success of the junior section (formed in 1993) stabilised the club hereafter, and in 2015 we took a step back in the right direction with promotion into Division 2, where we have remained since.

At the end of the 2019 season our Roehampton ground was leased out, so since 2020 our new home ground has been Oberon Playing Fields in Raynes Park. This was the scene for the 1st XI's monumental run to the T20 Cup quarter finals in 2021.

Curiously, despite five promotion campaigns the club is yet to win a 1st XI league title. Fortunately, the same cannot be said for our other sides, with the 2nd XI winning Division 1 in 2002 (plus two other promotion seasons), and the 3rd XI also winning their respective Division 2 in 1990. The Midweek XI has found success by winning the London Banks Cup in 1990 and 1994, whilst in recent years the Public Services T20 Tournament has been claimed on seven different occasions, most recently in 2022.

As a club we are not all about winning, with a fine tradition of socialising on numerous club tours, including major trips abroad to Barbados (1982), Australia (1988), New Zealand (1993) and South Africa (2003). An annual tour to Sussex ran for almost 60 years between 1921-1979, and to this day we still arrange annual trips to Kent (since 1923) and Buckinghamshire (since 1986).

We have a packed schedule of matches, so please make yourself available as early as possible, for as many as possible. Keeping your schedule updated on Pitchero really will make captains lives much easier. Paying your annual memberships and match fees promptly is appreciated and easier than ever through the "[shop](#)" section of Pitchero, so no excuses!

The Club runs two regular tours, to Kent in June and Bucks in August, open to all. There is nothing quite like tour, and I have been on both trips more than 20 times. The centenary Kent tour is likely to be the last, so those curious to see these very attractive grounds and friendly opponents need to come this year. In addition, the 1st XI are making a preseason trip to Devon in April.

Prestige Presidents Day on 6 August is always a highlight, but our new social secretary Matt Bartlett has other social events in the planning stage, so please look out for more. These are always enjoyable, but also raise valuable funds to support club projects, so we rely on your support.

Members can help our fundraising in several ways, including by signing up to [Easyfundraising](#), as you can raise money for free simply by shopping online. We have raised almost £500 by this method, but it could be so much more with a few extra supporters! On the playing front, I'm quietly confident of a promising season on the pitch given how we are set up for success as a Club. The work that Kit, Ed and others have done on recruitment should bear fruit and we're extremely excited to have Tom Byrnes join us for the year and help with our push up the league. Across the rest of the Club, the 2s are in a new division this year and their injection of youth should give us fresh impetus on a promotion push, while our 3s have a great chance of success in their division.

Away from the league sides. For the 4s and occasional 5s, we have a great programme of fixtures in the diary and are looking to carry on our great record of giving youngsters and youngsters-at-heart a great experience of cricket at all levels. Our Junior sides will also be looking to get as many people playing cricket at all ages as possible and very excited to see our first ever Girls side take the field for more fixtures. It's great to see our junior numbers picking up again after the ground/pandemic disruption and to see the talent coming through to the higher senior sides-pushing the likes of me to the friendly sides where we belong.

As always, please remember to do the basics to make your long-suffering skipper's job as easy as possible. Pitchero has proven to be a wonder for getting sides out, but we do rely on everyone to do their bit. So please pay your fees on time, mark your availability and sign up to as much cricket as you can. I'll see you on the field very shortly.

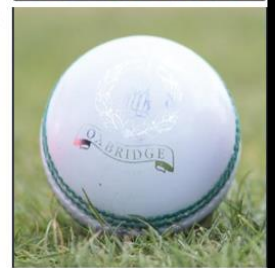

Junior Cricket Coordinator's Message

It is shaping up to be an exciting year of junior cricket at BOECC and numbers have been very promising at winter training. It will be brilliant to see how much players have developed when summer training and matches begin from 21st April. We have been busy with several individuals achieving further coaching qualifications, which shall be put to good use at **training on Friday nights (6.30pm – 8.30pm) at Barn Elms Sports Trust (BEST)**. This is led by ECB Advanced Level Coach Ian Hussain, and additional 1:1 coaching with our overseas player / coach Thomas Byrnes will also be available at other times, so please do watch out for further information about this.

The setting is very pleasant, and parents are encouraged to stay with a BYO glass or two, or to visit the nearby Red Lion pub. This year we have also secured access to the main pavilion building for parents to shelter in when it's cold / wet (or too hot!), but we of course encourage anyone who wants to take a closer look at the action to do so. Unfortunately there is no bar available in the pavilion, but there is seating, tables and wifi for you.

We are aiming to be a little bit more dynamic this year and to ensure players are being challenged by different activities each week. This will mean groups playing in different parts of the ground, which will sometimes involves nets, sometimes training matches, or various skill based activities. This will help players improve, but most importantly to have fun doing something different each and every week.

The vast majority of league matches in the Surrey Junior Cricket Championship take place on Sunday mornings, with details available on Pitchero. **Please do make sure that you regularly update your availability for both training and matches via Pitchero**, as it will make the lives of our organisers much easier.

All boys age groups in the u10 and above category play in cup competitions, some of which are held midweek. We are aiming to ensure that any cup home games are played on a Friday evening where possible (in lieu of training) at BEST, so the whole club can support the team as they bid for glory. This is easier for availability as Friday nights are "cricket night", but we do understand this means missing valuable training time. To

compensate, we will look to arrange additional net sessions at an alternative time, if there is demand.

It is an exciting time for girls cricket, as after our first ever female only fixture last year we are entering a girls u11 (Year 6) and below team into several Surrey Cricket Foundation festivals. This is a fantastic start in building towards a regular league team in the future.

For the first time we are also running the ECB All Stars programme at Oberon early on Wednesday evenings. This is aimed as a fun first introduction to cricket for 5 to 8 year olds, so please do sign up [here](#). We appreciate this is a different time / location to BEST, so please do contact me directly about playing on Fridays at BEST instead as we can make some alternative arrangements.

These players will feed into our youngest match playing team, the u9s (Year 4). The number of participants in match has decreased to 6 to allow each child to have more "meaningful moments", and we will ensure everyone gets the opportunity to participate over the course of the season.

The u10 (Year 5) age group sees the introduction of the hard cricket ball, with numbers increasing to 10 per team. The cup competitions also begin at this age group, so our young players can enjoy the added excitement of knock out play. The u11s (Year 6) continue their development with pairs cricket to ensure everyone continues to have the chance to participate in matches.

The u13s (Year 8) are combined with the u12s (Year 7), with proper "out when you're out" cricket and the full 11 players per side. I'd like to say this is the format that will serve them well for the rest of their cricketing careers, but who knows what inventions will be around the corner?!

The u15s (Year 10) are combined with our u14s (Year 9) age groups, and we begin to look at identifying individuals who are ready to also play senior cricket through our player pathway. It was fantastic to see so many making their senior debuts last year, with the Saturday 4th XI and Sunday XI both ideal starting points playing friendly cricket. This helps to ensure youngsters can adjust and learn about the game in a pressure free setting.

I would encourage all our players in the Academy (u16-u19) age groups to make themselves available for the senior adult teams. There is plenty of cricket to go around that suits all ages and abilities, and we are very keen to continue developing our own players.

We would like additional volunteers at all age groups to help with taking registers, umpiring, scoring, or even providing a lift to others for matches, it would be great if everyone could do their part. We have always been lucky to have so many supportive parents and I am sure this will continue long into the future.

Here's to a great summer that's (almost) as hot as last year!

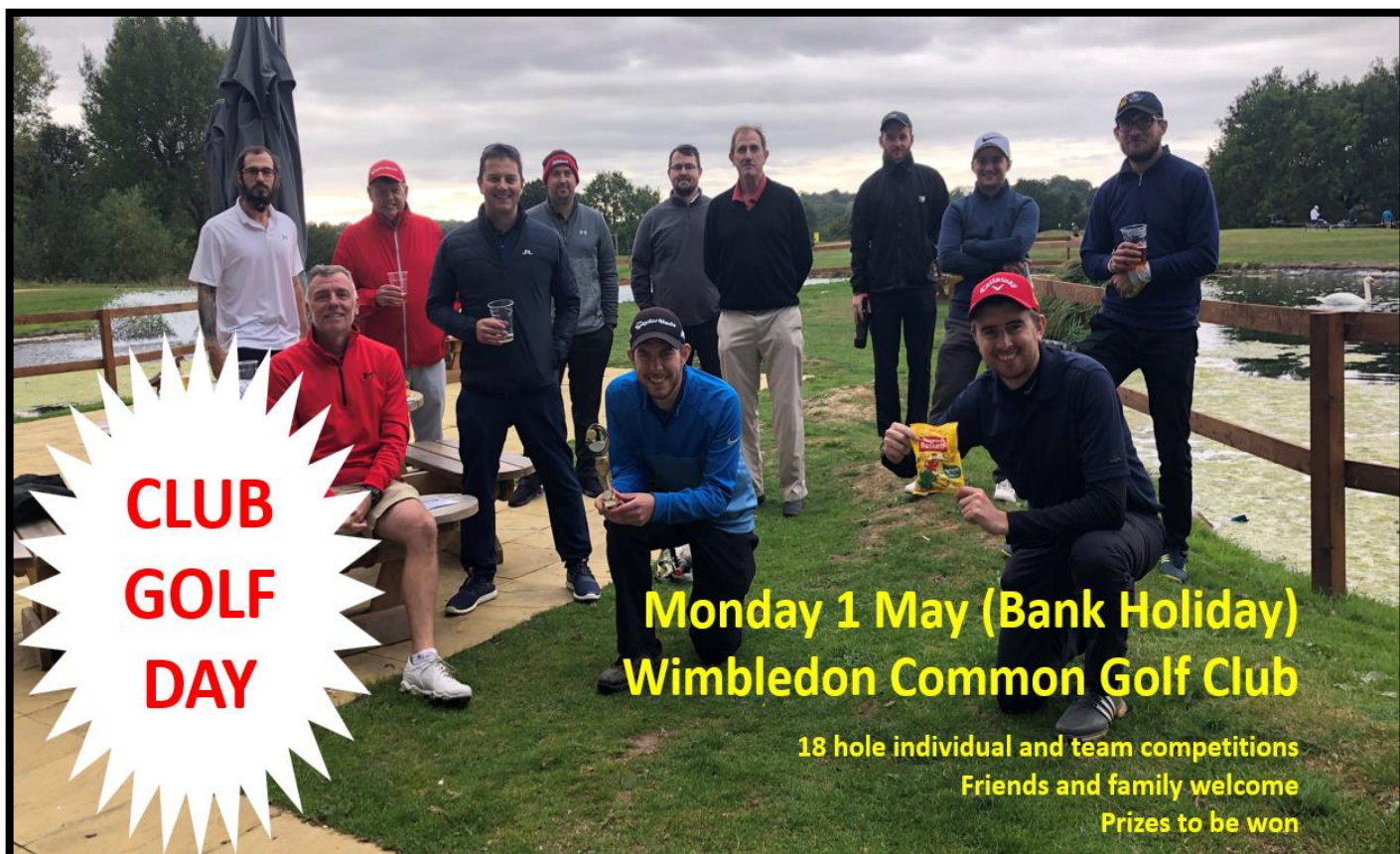
