

## YOUTH RUGBY TOUR PREPARATION GUIDELINES

- 1. Discuss **why** you want to tour, where you want to go, how many tourists, what you want to achieve, costs, fund-raising, logistics etc

- 3. Apply to Hampshire RFU for initial approval for the tour...
- 4. Inform your Club Safeguarding Officer of your intention to tour (if players under 18 years)
- 5. Decide and organise appropriate insurance RFU or independent? This must cover:
  - Playing rugby and any other specified activities
  - Public liability
  - Civil liability
  - Personal liability
  - Travel (baggage, money, curtailment/cancellation esp. if overseas)
  - Repatriation (especially if overseas)
  - Medical and emergency (EHIC/GHIC if in EEC/Switzerland)
- 6. Organise permission to play rugby in host country. Your Tour Operator may get this for you, or your Host Club, or you may have to apply for it yourself either way, you will need written confirmation (e-mail is fine). Check age grade regulations/variations in host country/region.
- 7. Ensure **all adults** with responsibility for supervising players under 18 years have **current RFU DBS** clearance.
- 8. For an overseas outgoing or incoming tour, fill in and send to **Hampshire RFU** appropriate Tour Application Form and accompanying paperwork **at least 6 weeks** before you are due to go. **DO NOT** send directly to the RFU. For any other tours, send at least 3 weeks before you intend going.
- 9. Organise accommodation, activities, matches, risk assessment, fund-raising, etc.
- 10. Before you go, YOU must have: -
  - confirmation of authorisation to tour from Hampshire RFU
  - all consent/medical forms signed (take with you on tour and leave a copy with the DBS cleared home contact). If you go abroad, make sure you have the consent forms with you at all times —often doctors will not treat an injured player until they have seen the signed parental consent form (and the EHIC/GHIC card if in the EEC)
  - signed CSO Tour checklist (for players under 18 years)
- 11. Go on tour. Have a great time!
