

Parent/Guardian Guide to the Game

This guide has been produced to help Parents/ Guardians to understand how Rugby games and training sessions are organised and delivered, and what is expected from them, their players and the clubs coaching staff.

All the coaches who take organised training sessions and matches within the club are suitably qualified and have had CRB checks undertaken.

The Game

In England, our game is governed by the Rugby Football Union (RFU) who determine how, when and where the game is played. In mini (U8s to U12s), junior (U13s to U16s) and colts (U16s to U19s) rugby, the Laws of the Game are amended to suite the various age groups. For minis these amendments are called the Rugby Continuum and determine the Laws by which the games is played within a specific age group, the number of players, the duration of game and size of pitch. These Laws change through the age groups so the more advanced the age, the nearer to the true game the Laws become. More information is available on the RFU website.


The Season

The season officially commences the first weekend in September and usually runs to the first weekend in May each year. For the minis no matches are normally played in September or January of each year because of safety rules set out by the RFU.

During the season, all matches take place on Sunday. Generally they all start with a short training session/warm-up in advance of the game. Minis & juniors games usually kick off at 11.00 am, with Junior Colts (U178) 12:30pm and Senior Colts (U198) 2:00pm. Matches are played both home and away.

Kit

Players will be responsible for providing, maintaining and looking after their kit, during and after training sessions and games. Kits can be purchased from the club shop, see your coach for details. Any protective equipment purchased – such as head guards and shoulder pads must be approved by the International Rugby Board (IRB) or have a BS kite mark. Players are not allowed to play in non approved equipment. Boot studs must either be molded rubber or BS kite mark rugby studs. Players are discouraged from wearing football boots with blades and strongly encouraged to wear mouth guards.

Training Sessions

One training session will be held mid week for the Under 13's and above. Starting times may vary so check with your respective coaches for details. If for any reason a session is cancelled, your coach will advise you of this giving as much notice as possible.

Young players will need to come fully prepared for the training session with the appropriate kit and equipment, weatherproof clothing as required. Your player will also need their own water bottle. We always recommend a change of clothing for the homeward journey.

Once a training session starts, the players are under the instruction and control of the coaches. They will deal with any issues during the session including any injuries. We would respectfully ask parents not to enter the training area or distract the coach or players during sessions. There will be plenty of opportunity to speak to the coach at the end of the session if you need to.

Training sessions are aimed at developing the player's skills, knowledge, ability and positional understanding of the games of rugby union. As the player develops, the training will become more defined toward their individual role within the team, i.e. forward and back play.

We do not have time to focus on individual player's fitness. Some collective fitness work will be done, but we expect players to be fit to play rugby, and then to increase their fitness as the season progresses. Parents are expected to ensure their players take on additional fitness training programs if required and the coach is available to offer advice as required. If you have any conerns or queries about your player's development, please do not hesitate to talk to your coach.


Matches

All matches are played on Sundays on a home and away basis. Until the U13 age group, all matches are deemed as friendlies and match fixtures are published in your fixture list at the beginning of the season. Some fixtures may change during the course of the season, but your coach will advise you of any changes in advance.

Please ensure your player shows up on time with their full kit, water bottle and boots. Mini and junior home matches will require the players on the field by 10:15am for training/ warm up prior to an 11:00am kick off. For away matches, the coach will confirm meeting arrangements prior to match day.

Rugby is a game of discipline and during matches, as with training, once your player enters the field of play, they are under control and instruction of the coach. Please do not enter the playing area unless requested to do so. Please do not speak to the referee or officials unless requested to do so. Please do offer as much encouragement to your players as possible whilst respecting the opposing team and their officials. We should celebrate our success and be gallant in defeat.

Bury RUFC has a proud tradition as a sporting club and we all have a responsibility to uphold this tradition. Please familiarize yourself with and abide by the club's code of conduct at all times.

After the game there will always be a short de-brief with the coach followed by a warm down session after which the players return to your care. We would strongly recommend all players have showers after the match and players MUST be in clean clothing to enter the clubhouse.

A free meal will always be provided, either home or away, and players are encouraged to take part in this tradition. Rugby is a social game and we want to encourage players to take part in this tradition, to build team morale and friendship with other team mates. It is also an opportunity for parents to relax after the rigors of the game!!!

Attendance

It is really important that your child is fit and able to participate fully in training sessions or matches for their safety and that of the team. If your child has picked up an injury, please have a word with the coach BEFORE the training session commences.

If your child is not going to be available to train or play because of a holiday etc, please let the coaches know in advance.

If they not going to be available through sickness, again, please let the coach know as soon as possible.

Awards

A player of the match award will be given to the player that has tried their utmost during the game and displayed skills and knowledge developed from previous training sessions.

At the end of the season, each player will receive a trophy for their efforts during the year in an end season presentation, when parents and friends are invited to celebrate the clubs achievements during the season. In addition to this, players who have performed particularly well during the year will also receive individual awards to recognize and celebrate their achievements.

Other Events – Tournaments

In addition to normal matches, players may also take part in a number of tournaments during the season. This is where we play a series of matches during the course of a day, in shorter durations, usually in a league knock-out basis. These tournaments can last for several hours dependant on the success of the team. During the matches, your player will be under the coach's control. In between games, they will be your responsibility. Please ensure your player is fit to play and on time for each game. You are advised to bring the appropriate clothing and supplies for these events.

Please ask the coach for more details if required.
