 - Filmed many of the games so the coaches could do a full analysis of the games and players
 - Integrated the Senior Colts into the senior set up
 - Tim Martin and his team organised and hosted:

- 2. Coming of Age Game
- Mandy and the team helped raise our profile in the local press
- Sean and the Bowdon Mole raising our profile on social media
- Built a supporters Whatsapp Group to let supporters know what was going on and create interest in the Club.
- Focused on being exceptional hosts to visiting sides on a Saturday, with most of the home games being sponsored
- What were the results:
 - 1st XV promoted, now in Level 6
 - 2nd XV promoted
 - 1st XV getting to the Quarter Finals of the RFU Intermediate Cup
 - Fielded a 3rd XV every week, with great numbers
 - Thanks to Jo Sellick, fulfilled a few VETs fixtures during the season
 - **Record numbers at training**. Pre season was a joy to watch, which helped us go into the season with great momentum.

Questions

A member from the M & J's stated that there was a very poor attendance from the M & J's given how many boys playing, we need to publicise the meeting as no documents of the AGM were received. It should have been disseminated though the club managers. This will be facilitated for next year. Both Junior Section and Senior Section will be moving towards GMS. This will generate just one email which will be sent to all the members of the Club.

Honorary Treasurer's Report

Presenting the Accounts the Honorary Treasurer reported that:-

- Summary of Club Accounts for the year end. Done pretty well again this year.
- Income for the year is £485,000.00 (up 10% on previous year) against that are costs have gone up slightly for example utilities bills. More money spent on food and payment of coaches. In Summary we have a surplus of £20,000 which compares to £48,000 last year, down slightly but we are forecasting an increase of £28,000.00 in next year's budget. We have settled our loan principle payments of £22,000.00 and we have spent £38,000.00 out of our working capital to fund the flood lights.
- Details figures are with the packs. (Attached Club Accounts for the year end 31 March 2019)
- Banking arrangements struggling with RBS and we are going to now bank with Santandar which will solve all problems.

Questions

Member questioned that has been a massive increase of bar turnover and a massive reduction of marquee room sales, Chris stated that there had been some misallocations due to the till systems being changed but the overall figures were correct.

Member questioned how many bank accounts do Bowdon have, Chris answered the question, Bowdon have 4 separate RBS Accounts (Seniors, M & J's, Marquee and Head Office) HSBC for Bowdon 200 Mole Club, 1 Handles Bank for the loan via their current account and Barclays Accounts which will be closed. RBS have not been very professional we do not have online access, so now we are moving to Santandar which is well under way.

Member questioned about the expenditure of the Flood Lights, Chris stated it was a capital item so not in the expenditure as it was an asset. Big increase of senior player's expenses. We have no paid

players we pay expenses and big increase for food provision for training and weekend. One paying player coach and £2000 filming games, One player paid for travel expenses, Food costs £3000.00.

Member questioned about being now in Level 6 a big step up are we spending more money? Tom stated that he has challenged the coaches and the budget is not to increase for this year. Coaches being paid the same, the players have been asked to find their own sponsor. We have sponsors for the first team kit and trying to match costs with the expenditure and the investment.

Member questioned about Physio's for next season and there will be physio's for the first and second team. Tom stated that we are negotiating with a third party firm for a physio on Tuesday and Thursday and two physio's on a Saturday.

Tom thanked Chris for all his efforts.
