MATCH REPORT: WESTFIELD 3 LEATHERHEAD 0



WESTFIELD CONTINUED THEIR CLIMB UP THE TABLE WITH A RESOUNDING 3-0 WIN OVER LEATHERHEAD AND IN DOING SO MOVED INTO THE ISTHMIAN SOUTH CENTRAL PLAYOFF PLACES.

ON A WINDY AND WET EVENING AT WOKING PARK A MAGICAL PERFORMANCE FROM IAN SELLEY'S MEN LIFTED THE GLOOM OVER WOKING IN FRONT OF A BUMPER NEW YEARS DAY CROWD OF NEARLY 300

AN EVEN START TO THE GAME SAW HALF CHANCES AT BOTH ENDS WITH SONNY WHEELER BEING TESTED TO KEEP OUT TYLER COX'S EFFORT.

JORDAN ALVES TWICE WENT CLOSE FOR WESTFIELD BEFORE COX MISSED A
GOLDEN CHANCE UP THE OTHER END BUT SLIPPED AND SENT THE BALL WIDE.
IT WAS INEVITABLE A GOAL WOULD SOON ARRIVE AND ARCHY TAYLOR
DELIVERED IN THE 17TH MINUTE RECEIVING TOBI ADAJE'S CROSS-FIELD PASS
AND DRIVING INTO THE BOX SLIPPING PAST ALLEN WITH HIS LEFT FOOT.
IN THE 34TH MINUTE THE LEAD WAS DOUBLED IN SPECTACULAR FASHION AS
MANNY GOGONAS FILLING IN AT LEFT WING BACK SENT OVER A CROSS THAT
JACOB BRECKON SPECTACULARLY VOLLEYED HOME FOR ONE OF THE BEST
GOALS SEEN AT WOKING PARK IN YEARS.







MATCH REPORT: WESTFIELD 3 LEATHERHEAD 0

A RATTLED LEATHERHEAD CHANGED BOTH FULLBACKS IN THE 38TH BUT IT

MADE LITTLE IMPACT BEFORE THE BREAK.


THE SECOND PERIOD SAW THE VISITORS HAVE THE POSSESSION BUT
THREATEN TO FASHION OUT ANYTHING CLEAR CUT. WHEN THEY DID LET FLY
FROM RANGE WHEELER WAS EQUAL TO THE TASK AND THE GAME WAS
WRAPPED UP IN THE 75TH MINUTE WITH ANOTHER STUNNING STRIKE. KEEPER
ALLEN WAY OUT OF GOAL TRIED TO FIND HIS WINGER BUT WITH ARCHY
TAYLOR READING AND INTERCEPTING THE BALL BROKE TO ANDY CROSSLEY ON
THE HALFWAY LINE AND THE BALL WAS CALMY LIFTED OVER THE KEEPER
AND COVERING DEFENDERS INTO THE NET.

THE TANNERS CONTINUED TO PUSH FORWARD BUT COULD FIND NO WAY PAST A DETERMINED HOME REAR GUARD AND THERE WERE NO FURTHER GOALS











LHARTLEY WINTNEY FOOTBALL CLUB WAS FOUNDED IN 1897, THE CLUB'S NICKNAME 'THE ROW' COMING FROM HARTLEY ROW. A FORMER HAMLET OF HARTLEY WINTNEY.

IN THE 1940S AND 50S, THE CLUB PLAYED AT CAUSEWAY FARM ADJACENT TO THE CRICKET CLUB, IN THE BASINGSTOKE LEAGUE. THE MINUTES OF MEETINGS COVERING 15 SEASONS FROM 1948, COMPILED BY THE CLUB'S OUTSTANDING SECRETARY FRED COOK, INCLUDES THE CHANGE OF CLUB COLOURS FROM BLUE SQUARES TO TANGERINE IN 1956.


THE CLUB MOVED TO THE MEMORIAL GROUND ON GREEN LANE IN 1953 AND LATER JOINED THE ALDERSHOT LEAGUE. IN 1973, GLYNN HOWELLS WAS APPOINTED AS MANAGER. IN HIS SIX-YEAR REIGN, THE TEAM WON THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR LEAGUE THREE TIMES IN SUCCESSION, AND THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR CUP.

A FOUNDER MEMBER OF THE COMBINED COUNTIES LEAGUE IN 1978, HARTLEY LATER APPOINTED IAN BEDFORD AS MANAGER. AN INFLUX OF SENIOR PLAYERS DURING THE 80S INCLUDED SEVERAL EX-PROS: MICK TRAVERS (EX-READING, PORTSMOUTH AND ALDERSHOT); RICHARD WALDEN (EX-ALDERSHOT, SHEFFIELD WEDNESDAY AND NEWPORT COUNTY) AND STEVE FINNIESTON (EX-CHELSEA, CARDIFF CITY AND SHEFFIELD UNITED).

UNDER BEDFORD'S MANAGEMENT, THE CLUB WON THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR CUP (1980/81), THE GEORGE ALLEN CUP (1981/82) AND THE COMBINED COUNTIES LEAGUE (1982/83). A NEW CLUBHOUSE WAS OPENED WITH DAVID WILLOUGHBY, SECRETARY AND TREASURER, AND BILL MITCHELL, CLUB CHAIRMAN, DEVOTING EXCEPTIONAL HOURS TO THIS VENTURE.

THE CLUB GAINED PROMOTION TO THE COMBINED COUNTIES PREMIER UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF MIKE SCOTT IN 2007/08, BUT THE FOLLOWING SEASON ENDED IN RELEGATION. THE TEAM RALLIED FOLLOWING THE APPOINTMENTS OF PETE GRAY AND JOHN CONDON IN 2009/10 AND LOUIS KING IN 2010/11.

NEVILLE ROACH THEN TOOK CHARGE FOR 2011/12, ASSISTED BY MICK WOLLEN AND SCOTT TARR, AND THE CLUB FINISHED 3RD IN CCL DIV. 1, WHICH WAS GOOD ENOUGH FOR A RETURN TO THE PREMIER DIVISION. BUT THE EUPHORIA OF PROMOTION WAS DAMPENED WHEN THE COACHING STAFF AND NEARLY THE ENTIRE SQUAD LEFT AT THE END OF THE SEASON.

EX-MILLWALL DEFENDER DAVE TUTTLE WAS GIVEN THE SUMMER TO PREPARE A SQUAD FOR 2012/13. HOWEVER, A STRING OF POOR RESULTS LED TO A SECOND CHANGE IN MANAGEMENT WITHIN FOUR MONTHS AND 24-YEAR-OLD EX-HARTLEY STRIKER BEN DILLON WAS GIVEN HIS FIRST MANAGERIAL ROLE.


ALONGSIDE JASON MINTON AND JOE LAWLER, DILLON SET ABOUT REBUILDING, WITH HARTLEY WELL ADRIFT AT THE BOTTOM OF THE TABLE. THE INTRODUCTION OF A TALENTED GROUP OF PLAYERS RESTORED THE SPIRIT AROUND THE CLUB AND, IN WHAT BECAME KNOWN AS THE CLUB'S 'GREAT ESCAPE', THE ROW'S PLACE IN THE CCL PREMIER WAS SECURED AGAINST ALL THE ODDS.

FINISHING 7TH IN CCL PREMIER IN 2013/14, THE FOOTBALLING HIGHLIGHT WAS THE RUN TO THE 4TH QUALIFYING ROUND OF THE FA CUP FOR THE FIRST EVER TIME, LOSING TO DAVENTRY TOWN IN FRONT OF A HOME CROWD OF OVER 1.000.

THE NEW CLUB CREST WAS COMMISSIONED DURING THE SEASON; DESIGNER
PHILIPPA BELL INCORPORATED ELEMENTS FROM THE 13TH CENTURY WHEN THE
VILLAGE OF HERTLEYE WYNTENEYE DREW ITS NAME FROM 'THE CLEARING IN THE
FOREST WHERE THE DEER GRAZE BY WINTA'S ISLAND', HENCE THE TREE AND STAG
MOTIFS.







THE 2014/15 SEASON SAW THE CLUB FINISH 9TH IN THE CCL PREMIER, AFTER WHICH DILLON STEPPED DOWN:

DAN BROWNLIE AND ANTHONY MILLERICK WERE APPOINTED AS JOINT MANAGERS,
WITH LUKE TUFFS AS FIRST TEAM COACH.

2015/16 WAS VERY EVENTFUL. AFTER A MEMORABLE FA CUP WIN AT MERTHYR TOWN, HARTLEY CAME BACK FROM TWO DOWN, ONLY TO CONCEDE AN INJURY TIME GOAL AT CONFERENCE SOUTH SIDE EASTBOURNE BOROUGH. IN THE FA VASE, A LONGSTANDING CLUB RECORD WAS BROKEN BY REACHING THE 5TH ROUND PROPER. IN FRONT OF A SELLOUT 1,300 AT GREEN LANE, EVENTUAL FINALISTS HEREFORD PROVED TOO STRONG, BUT THE ROW WENT ON TO CLAIM THE CCL PREMIER DIVISION TITLE: HOWEVER, PROMOTION WAS DENIED DUE TO GROUND GRADING.


THE 2016/17 SEASON UNDER BROWNLIE AND MILLERICK WAS EXTRAORDINARY.
PROPELLED BY THE GOALS OF STRIKE DUO SAM ARGENT AND ROSS COOK, THE ROW
TOPPED THE CCL PREMIER DIVISION FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON, REACHED THE SEMIFINAL OF THE HAMPSHIRE SENIOR CUP AND THE FINAL OF THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR
CUP. GUIDED BY CHAIRMAN LUKE MULLEN, THE CLUB SECURED THE REQUIRED
GROUND GRADING TO TAKE THEIR PLACE IN THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE AT STEP 4 FOR
THE FIRST TIME.

2017/18 WAS AS SUCCESSFUL AS THE PREVIOUS SEASON. THE CLUB EMBARKED ON THEIR FIRST FA TROPHY CAMPAIGN, GOING OUT IN THE 1ST ROUND PROPER TO EVENTUAL FINALISTS BROMLEY. IN SOUTHERN LEAGUE SOUTH (EAST DIVISION), THE ROW SAT WITHIN THE TOP FOUR FOR MUCH OF THE SEASON. A PLAY-OFF PLACE WAS SECURED, WITH THE ROW WINNING THEIR SEMI-FINAL AGAINST AFC DUNSTABLE. IN FRONT OF A CROWD OF OVER 700 AT GREEN LANE, A TENSE GAME AGAINST CAMBRIDGE CITY WAS DECIDED BY A NIC CIARDINI GOAL — WHO WAS ON THE END OF JACK BALL'S TOWERING HEADER - TO GAIN PROMOTION TO SOUTHERN PREMIER SOUTH AT STEP 3. THE SEASON'S CLOSING HIGHLIGHT WAS LIFTING THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR CUP.

WITH DAN TURKINGTON NOW ALONGSIDE MILLERICK IN THE DUGOUT, 2018/19
STARTED WELL AT STEP 3, WITH A LATE RUN SEEING HARTLEY FINISH 8TH. TO
REMAIN AT THAT LEVEL REQUIRED ANOTHER ROUND OF GROUND IMPROVEMENTS,
STRETCHING THE CLUB AND ITS VOLUNTEERS TO THE LIMIT.







THE 2019/20 CAMPAIGN CLICKED INTO GEAR FOR THE ROW SHORTLY BEFORE THE SEASON WAS ABANDONED DUE TO THE COVID PANDEMIC. THE RETURN OF FAMILIAR FACES TO THE SQUAD IN THE NEW YEAR HAD PROMISED AN EXCITING RUN-IN. INSTEAD, IT BECAME A BATTLE OFF THE PITCH FOR THE CLUB'S FINANCIAL SURVIVAL.

THIS BATTLE WAS TO CONTINUE WHEN 2020/21 WAS AGAIN CUT SHORT, THOUGH NOT BEFORE HARTLEY REACHED THE 4TH QUALIFYING ROUND OF THE FA CUP, GOING OUT AT NATIONAL LEAGUE SIDE DAGENHAM & REDBRIDGE BY A SOLITARY GOAL. IN THE HAMPSHIRE SENIOR INVITATIONAL CUP, A COMPETITION STAGED AS COVID RESTRICTIONS WERE EASED, HARTLEY LIFTED THE TROPHY IN THE FINAL AGAINST FOLLAND SPORTS.

THERE WAS DEEP SADNESS IN 2021 WHEN CLUB PRESIDENT BILL MITCHELL PASSED AWAY IN APRIL. HE HAD BEEN A HUGE INFLUENCE ON THE CLUB AND A TRUE GENTLEMAN WHO CONTINUED HIS FAMILY'S TRADITION OF BEING HARTLEY WINTNEY THROUGH AND THROUGH.

2021/22 PROVED TOUGH, WITH THE CLUB'S RESOURCES SEVERELY DEPLETED. THE HUGE TASK OF SURVIVING AT STEP 3 WAS ACHIEVED WITH ANOTHER GOOD RUN-IN, WHILE SILVERWARE ARRIVED BY WAY OF THE ALDERSHOT SENIOR CUP, WITH THE ROW BEATING FLEET TOWN IN THE FINAL. AFTER HIS HUGELY SUCCESSFUL SPELL AS MANAGER, 'MILLERS' STEPPED DOWN AT THE END OF THE SEASON, BECOMING THE CLUB'S DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL.

DEVELOPMENT TEAM MANAGER ROSS WEATHERSTONE AND FIRST TEAM COACH TY NEWTON WERE APPOINTED AS JOINT MANAGERS FOR 2022/23. PRE-SEASON RESULTS WERE ENCOURAGING, BUT THE TEAM STRUGGLED IN THE LEAGUE AND THE PAIR RESIGNED IN OCTOBER. EX-ARSENAL PRO IAN SELLEY AND HIS ASSISTANT, MICK BENNETT, TOOK CHARGE BUT, AFTER A REASONABLE START, RESULTS AGAIN FAILED TO MEET EXPECTATIONS.


WITH THE CLUB IN THE RELEGATION ZONE, THE ROW TURNED TO TWO FORMER PLAYERS, EX-PRO ROWAN VINE, AND

SHANE HOLLAMBY. THE PAIR STEADIED THE SHIP, RETURNED BELIEF TO THE FANS AND THE PLAYING GROUP, AND WORKED THE TEAM BACK TO BEING COMPETITIVE IN EVERY GAME. BUT THE LACK OF FINANCIAL HEADROOM FINALLY HIT HOME. WITHOUT THE CUTTING EDGE OF A PROVEN GOALSCORER TO TURN THE DRAWS AND NARROW LOSSES INTO WINS, THE ROW WERE RELEGATED.

AFTER SO MUCH RECENT SUCCESS, 2023/24 SEES HARTLEY WINTNEY FC IN TRANSITION AND LOOKING TO REBUILD AS THE CLUB TAKES ITS PLACE IN THE ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH CENTRAL DIVISION.
