MATCH REPORT: WESTFIELD 0-0 CHERTSEY TOWN

A feisty bank holiday Saturday match saw a point shared as little could separate Westfield and visiting Chertsey Town.

The Field dominated the opening thirty of this match, as plenty of chances fell their way but failures in the final third and poor decision-making in some instances stopped them from dispatching of Chertsey early on.

Chertsey looked rejuvenated after the break as they dominated most of the ball and the decent chances with one long range effort, which rattled the crossbar, being the best chance of the game. Wheeler had a phenomenal game, pulling off game-defying saves worthy of the MOTM award. Chertsey also had two waved away penalties which was deemed controversial by the travelling fans.

Ultimately, both sides shared a hard-earned point and saw the Field gain their first point on the board.



MATCH REPORT: LEATHERHEAD

0-0 WESTFIELD

It was a quick turnaround for the Field as soon after their derby day clash at home to Chertsey, they had to contend against another local rival in the form of high-flying, league favorites Leatherhead.

The Field traveled to Fetcham Grove having only played their once before in the 2022/23 season, in which they dispatched of the Tanners 4-0 on the opening day of the league season. However, this fixture was different as Leatherhead had a 100% record start to the season whilst the Field were yet to record a league win.

The fixture started positively for the Field as they seemed to compete well with Leatherhead, fashioning some great chances but were still lacking that cutting edge. Leatherhead, however, were no Chertsey, as they attempted to put the Field to the sword, but a strong defensive performance proved hard for the Leatherhead attack to penetrate.

Sonny Wheeler once again proved to be a formidable opponent for Leatherhead attackers as his strong hands saw the Field saved from danger on more than one occasion.

Another contentious moment occurred in this game however, as Junior Da Cruz was brought down by the Leatherhead 'keeper whilst one-on-one and through on goal. Ultimately the keeper somehow avoided an early bath in this fixture and was allowed to play on and the final 15 or so saw little to divide the two sides, leading to a second successive stalemate for the Field.

MATCH REPORT: ASCOT UNITED

1-0 WESTFIELD

The Field turned their attentions away from league action last Saturday to focus on the FA Cup, in which they had been drawn against fellow Isthmian League South Central Division side Ascot United.

The Yellas have a good record in FA competitions, having won the FA Vase last season, beating out Welsh side Newport Pagnell Town 1-0 in the final. However, they had never made it further than the First Qualifying Round, unlike the Field, who had made it there only once before in the 2022/23 season.

The fixture started with the Field on top, fashioning out many great chances, with Didi Ndombe running the show. He ultimately had the best chance of the game that didn't result in a goal, with his effort somehow making contact with the post and ricocheting away from any danger.

However, it was a moment of brilliance from Ascot that ultimately secured their progress into the next round, as a out-swinging corner found McCoy on the edge of the box, who rifled it home in the 90th minute – a true screamer!

WELCOME LITTLEHAMPTON TOWN



Littlehampton Town Football Club was officially founded in 1896, but evidence suggests football was played in the town as early as 1891 and the club started in 1893. In the early years games were played at Selborne Road but in the early 1900s sport moved to The Sportsfield on St Flora's Road where matches continue to be played today.

Back then the team's colours were dark green and the club were known as the 'Greenbacks.' The colours were changed in 1911 to blue and then in 1931 to white. In 1923 Tottenham Hotspur came to town for a friendly and won 7-1.

Littlehampton Town joined the Sussex County Football League in 1928 and the club stayed in Division 1 for 67 years. The first match in the new league was against Haywards Heath and the team won 5-1. In 1949 they won the Royal Ulster Rifles (RUR) Charity Cup and the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup.

The team changed to a gold strip in 1953 and the first reference to their nickname 'The Marigolds' was in the Littlehampton Gazette on 13th November 1953.

Under the guidance of Terry Gill the team were successful in the late 1960s and they won the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup again in 1970. Littlehampton Town were Division 1 runners-up eight times until they finally won the title in 1991. That year will never be forgotten.

A draw at Peacehaven & Telscombe in front of 1,400 fans meant Golds won the title on goal difference. The same year the club won through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. The highlight was a home match against Northampton Town, staged at The Sportsfield in front of 4,000 fans.

The Golds also reached the semi final of the FA Vase, losing to Gresley Rovers over two legs. That year the team played more cup matches than league games and won the Sussex League Challenge Cup and reached the final of the Sussex Senior Cup too.

Littlehampton Town dropped to Division 2 in 1995 and Carl Stabler came back as manager and took them back up in 1997, where they were again runners-up in the division.

In 2003 they were relegated once more, but made a swift return with a Division 2 league and cup double success. They fell out of the top flight again in 2008 and spent six years in Division 2.

Mark Bennett, a former player from the 1991 season joined as manager and oversaw the Division 2 title in 2013, where they only lost four league games all season and were finalists in the John O'Hara Cup. In 2015 they recaptured the Division 1 title - for the first time in 23 years - on the final day and the last year of the Sussex County Football League.

With Mark Bennett's departure, player George Gaskin took over management of the club and guided the team to a mid-table finish. A year later the team dropped out of the top flight and into Division 1. In 2018, Littlehampton Town welcomed back both Mark Bennett as manager and George Gaskin as striker to help rebuild the club and return them to former glories.

The next two seasons were unfortunately curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020, the Marigolds were unbeaten in the league, but no promotion was allowed. After a repeat performance in 2021, we did secure promotion on points-per-game. With George Gaskin joined at the managerial helm by Mitchell Hand, the first year back in the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division was arguably the best in the team's 126-year history to date. The Marigolds won the title, again on the final day of the season in front of 1,000 fans.

But it was also in the cups that brought them so much glory. As winners of both the League Cup and the RUR Charity Cup, a historic treble was nearly a quadruple as the team reached Wembley to play in the FA Vase final. As the first non-league team from Sussex to reach Wembley, it was an extraordinary achievement.

And despite losing 3-0 in the end to Newport Pagnell Town, the amazing home crowds in the quarter and semi finals — of over 3,000 — ensured the entire town was behind the team in an incredible season. The club finished a respectable 12th in their first-ever season at Step 4 in the Pitching In Isthmian Football League South East Division last year.

TODAY'S OPPOSITION



JAMES BINFIELD - Nicknamed 'Bins' the Golds man between the sticks is one of the friendliest guys in the changing room. Formerly at Pagham, the 28-year-old goalkeeper is extremely reliable.

LIAM HENDY - After a decade playing for Sussex rivals Lancing, the 28-year-old defender signed for the Golds at the start of last season and quickly became a key part of the squad.

FINTAN WALSH - Was awarded by Mitch Hand as his manager's player of the year last season, 23-year-old Walsh has played in defence for Whitehawk, Lewes, East Grinstead and Haywards Heath.

JORDAN LAYTON - As part of the team's triple-crown season, Layton has grown in maturity in the past couple of seasons. Can play either right or left wing back, the 25-year-old is always on the attack.

MARSHALL BALL - After spending time studying in America, the former Worthing and Wick man returns for another campaign in a Gold shirt. The central defender turns 25 later this year.

MATT ASTLE - Another new signing for this season, 21-year-old Astle has formerly played for Saltdean, Tunbridge Wells and East Grinstead. A flying fullback that can play as a winger.

LEON TURNER - Having signed this season from Hassocks, this pacy winger is very difficult to defend against. The 24-year-old can play on either side of the park and will be a key player this season.

SCOTT KIRKWOOD - Now into his second full season with the Golds, midfielder Kirkwood, 38, has played at the highest level of anyone in the squad including time at Brighton, Crawley and Bognor.

JOE SUMMERBELL - Box-to-box midfielder who has signed this year from Bexhill and has previously played for Eastbourne. The 28-year-old scored on his first pre-season friendly for the Golds.

JOSH GOULD - With a great left foot, Gould joins us this year from Newhaven. Can play inside right or left, the 22-year-old has also experience playing for both Lancing and Worthing.

DAVID HERBERT - With three Sussex County league titles to his name and a number of league cup medals, Herbert, 31, is one of the stalwarts of the team and very dependable in midfield.

SCOTT PACKER - Another versatile player who has been with the Golds for many years and plays with confidence anywhere on the park. The 33-year-old has also played for Shoreham.

DION JARVIS - Fast, direct and a goal scorer. Playing on the left, Jarvis is growing in confidence every year he plays in a Golds shirt. The 25-year-old midfield is the club captain this season.

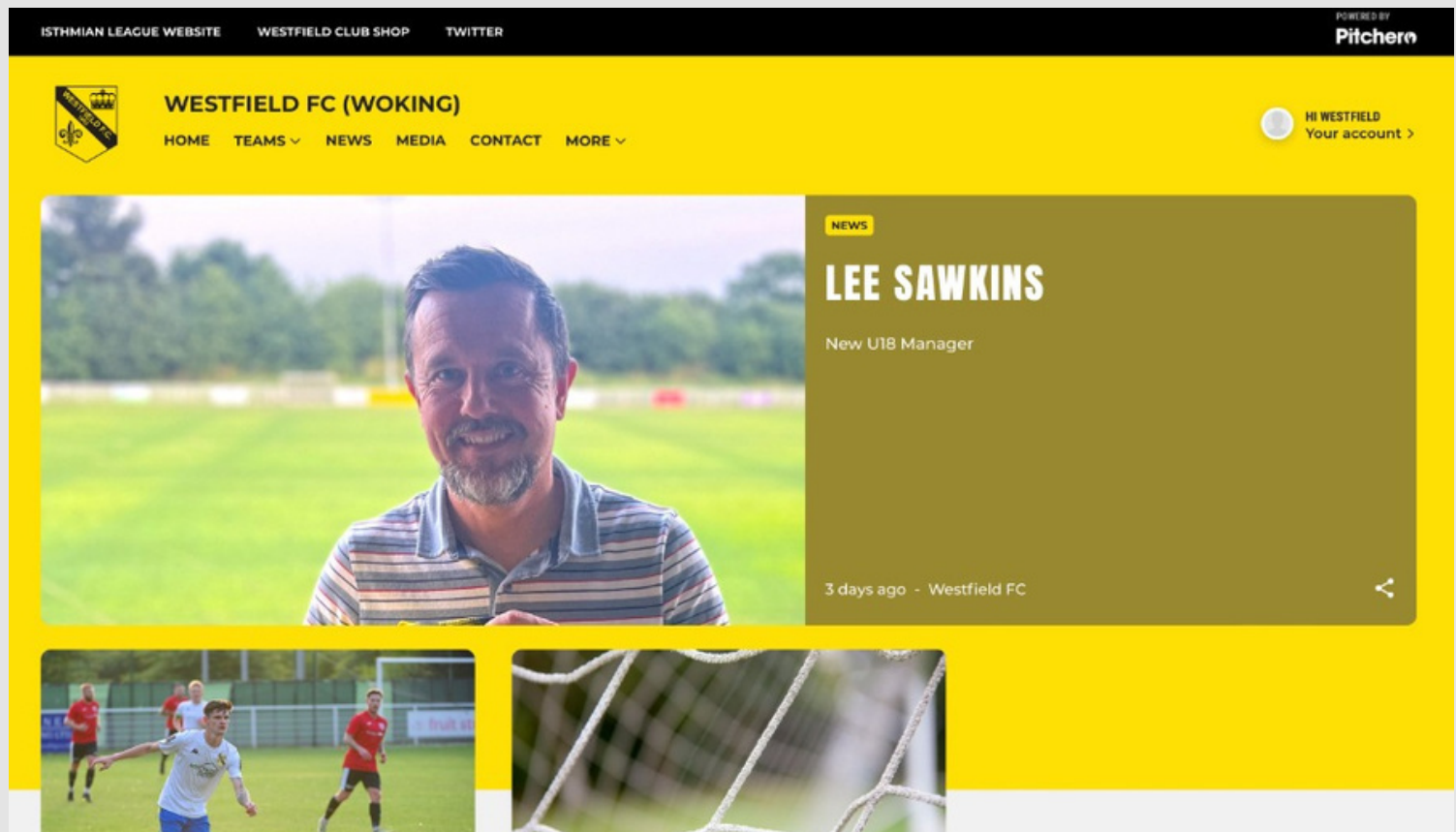
ARRON HOPKINSON - Highly-regarded centre forward who has played at a higher level for clubs including Brighton, Bath City and Eastbourne. The 31-year-old is an exciting signing for the Golds this year.

JOSH SHORT - With his pace and fitness, Short scored a number of goals for the team last season and is looking sharper than ever. The 23-year-old has played for Hassocks and Burgess Hill in the past.

GEORGE GASKIN - Having first played for the Golds in 2007, the 32-year-old forward shares his responsibilities in managing the squad along with Mitch Hand as well as his prolific striking in front of goal.

JOE BENN - After an amazing season in which Benn scored over 60 goals, helping the team win the title and head to Wembley, he sadly missed most of last season due to injury.
