MATCH REPORT: WESTFIELD 2-1 BALHAM




WHILST NOT THE PRETTIEST OF GAMES, THE FIELD MANAGED TO SEE OFF A WELL-ORGANISED AND DEFENSIVELY RESILIENT BALHAM SIDE TO BOOK THEIR PLACE IN THE QUARTER-FINALS OF THE SOUTHERN COMBINATION CUP.

THE GAME STARED OFF PROMISING FOR THE FIELD, AS THE GULF IN QUALITY BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES WAS CLEARLY EVIDENT, WITH THE HOME SIDE SEEING THE GREATER SHARE OF POSSESSION AND CHANCES, WITH MANY GOING JUST WIDE OF THE MARK. DESPITE SOME DECENT DEFENDING FROM BALHAM, WHO APPEARED TO BE SOAKING UP THE PRESSURE WELL, THEY COULD NEVER REALLY GET OUT OF THEIR OWN HALF IN THAT FIRST HALF.

THE DOMINANCE FOR THE FIELD SHOWED AS, JUST 3 MINUTES FROM TIME, A GOOD MOVE SAW ADAJE MUSCLE OFF A DEFENDER DOWN THE LEFT AND PUT IN A FANTASTIC CROSS, WHICH MET THE HEAD OF FARNBOROUGH LOANEE CONOR CULLEN (PICTURED), WHO HEADED IT INTO THE TOP CORNER AND PUTTING THE FIELD 1-0 UP GOING INTO HALF-TIME.







MATCH REPORT: WESTFIELD 2-1 BALHAM


THE SECOND HALF APPEARED TO BE A MORE COMPETITIVE AFFAIR, WITH BALHAM PILING ON THE PRESSURE IN SEARCH OF THE EQUALISER, WHICH THEY ALMOST GOT AS A BALL PLAYED ACROSS THE FIELD DEFENCE FOUND JAMES ADEBAYO IN A LOAD OF SPACE, BUT THE ANGLE PROVED TOO TIGHT AND IT WAS SAVED WELL BY HEBDITCH.

COINCIDENTALLY IT WAS BALHAM, MUCH LIKE THE FIELD IN THE FIRST-HALF, WHO CAME TO RUE MISSED OPPORTUNITIES AS THEIR DETERMINED EFFORTS TO FIND AN EQUALISER WERE ONLY PUBLISHED BY SUBSTITUTE JACOB BRECKON WHO CHALLENGED THE BALHAM KEEPER HAYDN READ WELL FOR THE BALL AND HEADED IT INTO THE NET FOR THE SECOND OF THE NIGHT, DESPITE THE PROTESTATIONS OF THE TRAVELLING BALHAM CONTINGENT.

BALHAM WERE ABLE TO PULL ONE BACK THROUGH NATHAN OSAJI DEEP INTO INJURY TIME FOLLOWING A DEFENSIVE MIX-UP BUT IT PROVED TOO LITTLE TOO LATE AS THE FIELD CAME OUT 2-1 WINNERS AND ENSURED A QUARTER-FINAL TIE AT HOME AGAINST CAMBERLEY TOWN.
