Crosfields ARLFC – In My View: Phil Hodgson



HOW important are goal-kicks?

Very important, obviously. Successful conversions and penalties can, clearly, win games.

But there are occasions in matches when missed opportunities, while not appearing to be vital at the time, turn out to be vital.

There were a couple of examples in last week's televised Betfred Super League matches.

One, clearly, was in the St Helens v Leeds Rhinos game, when Rohan Smith's men pooped the World Champions' party. The late field goal by Blake Austin that earned victory for the visitors would not have meant anything if Tommy Makinson had been successful with, by his standards, an eminently kickable penalty late in the second period (although it has to be said that quite a few other incidents impacted on the result, not least Makinson's failure to ground the ball when chasing a kick-through shortly afterwards. And let's not go too much into Chris Kendall's decision to penalise, and sin bin, the Saints' Jack Welsby, rather than Sam Walters, after the Leeds man had appeared to shoulder charge an opponent. Kendall, in the apparent view of many home fans somewhat controversially, later carded St Helens' Konrad Hurrell for what looked like something not entirely similar.)

Saints' supporters were angry, but everything would surely have been academic had Makinson been on target with that simple shot at goal (even though nothing that happened afterwards would have occurred as play would, of course, have restarted in a different way).

Twenty-four hours earlier, Salford Red Devils were in almost exactly the same position at Warrington. Paul Rowley's charges had, like St Helens, the chance to go 14 points clear when a kickable penalty was awarded. Rowley instructed Marc Sneyd to go for goal rather than, as the players seemed to prefer, run the ball against beleaguered opponents.

Hindsight is a wonderful thing, but it turned out to be the wrong option. Sneyd missed – uncharacteristically – and the Wolves made the most of the opportunity to not only work their way back into the contest but to finish, ultimately, as comfortable winners.

It's impossible, of course, to assert with any degree of certainty that Salford and St Helens would have won if those particular shots at goal had been on target. No one will ever know. But the abiding feeling was that both Warrington and Leeds were "gone" at that stage.

It certainly looked that way. To both teams' credit, though, they had the capacity and resolve to take control of, and make the most of, the situation.

The question now is, how will St Helens and Salford Red Devils respond? Both (particularly the Saints) went into last week's games on something of a high. Could bubbles now burst? Time will tell on that one, but for me the strong character and resolve endemic in both outfits is such that I expect them to recover in style.

18th February 2023 – Burtonwood Bridge 10 Crosfields 31

BRAD Stanway scored half of the points as Crosfields A claimed The Stuart Middleton Foundation Warrington Alliance Cup on Saturday with a 31-18 victory over Burtonwood Bridge at Victoria Park Stadium.

The Soap scrum-half crossed for the first of five Crosfields tries, kicked five goals and a drop goal in a man-of-the-match display.

Burtonwood opened the scoring after 15 minutes with a try from stand-off Craig Stanton that was goaled by scrum-half Jos Woods, but Soap replied when livewire Stanway jinked his way over and converted.

Jack Roper used his strength to score wide out and Stanway's conversion, along with a penalty shortly afterwards, gave his side a 14-6 interval lead.

Four minutes into the second half Crosfields hooker Jack Williams reacted quickest to touch down following a chip into the in-goal area. Stanway converted and Bridge were temporarily reduced to 12 men when Stanton was sin binned for dissent.

Soap took advantage of the extra man when prop forward Jordan Williams collected a lovely inside ball from Stanway to crash over at the side of the posts, with the added conversion putting Soap in command at 26-6.

Either side of the hour mark Bridge claimed two quick scores through Craig Holcroft and Tom Robinson to reduce the gap to eight points.

As the game entered the final few minutes Stanway slotted over a drop goal to calm the Crosfields nerves and then with the last play of the game Ash Catherall crossed in the corner.

Westgate Common were quickly out of the traps and very enthusiastic in the opening 10 minutes. Forcing Crosfields into uncharacteristic mistakes and then taking full advantage to get over the whitewash.

Converted tries after 5 and 7 minutes had Crosfields on the back foot, then even when the visitors moved into attack, the home side intercepted and raced 90m for a third try of the day and a 16-nil lead.

Minutes later Westgate were over again for a converted try. A fifth try immediately before the break, also converted, had Crosfields trailing at half time 28-nil.

Crosfields rallied after the break. Matt Barber made good ground, to set up Elliott Liku to crash over from close range. 28-4.

Westgate consolidated their position with a penalty. 30-4, before Billy Myers intercepted racing 90m for a try out wide. 30-8.

Crosfields were looking better in the second half and Jack Fox looked to have clawed another four points back, but the try was disallowed.

Ten minutes later however, Mitch McJay bobbed, weaved and swerved, before stretching out to score. Myers converted 30-14.

With 10 minutes to go, Tom Brown, Tom Millington and Liku made inroads and a wide ball from Myers was brilliantly caught by Kane Ditchfield, who crossed in the corner. 30-18.

Westgate weathered the storm and finally crossed for the final try of the game. The conversion was the last play and the home side won 36-18.
