Key Responsibilities:

- Deliver coaching to Bangor RFC Teams and Players, and support the volunteer network of coaches working with the Club.
- Work with Bangor RFC to support volunteers and assist them with on field development.
- Visit Primary & Secondary schools with the aim of promoting and the game of rugby union, Bangor RFC and Bangor Grammar in a positive, safe & healthy manner.
- Deliver rugby participation programmes within community based settings and encourage linkages back to Bangor RFC.
- Support curriculum & extracurricular based rugby modules in Primary & Secondary schools within catchment area.
- Engage with Ulster Rugby Development Staff to support their rugby development activity, and integrate Club/School activities where appropriate.
- Completion of regular & ad hoc reports in a timely, accurate & competent manner as requested by the the Club/School, designated Club Contact & the Rugby Development Manager. Submission of these fully completed reports within agreed timescales.
- Maintain effective relationships with those detailed in Key Relationships.
- Portray a competent & professional image of the Bangor RFC/Bangor GS at all times.
- Maintain accurate and up to date records on all aspects of work.
- Fulfil all coaching & development obligations throughout the term of the contract.

The duties and responsibilities outlined above are not exhaustive and the post holder may be required to undertake additional duties to meet the needs of the organisation.
