

We've done some great things, we have unearthed some gems and we have continued to work tirelessly to give the club a great platform from which to build on.



At the recent Bury St Edmunds match a local young lady, Daisy Cole, organised a raffle and collection in




order to assist with the cost (£3,000) to attend the World Scouting Jamboree in South Korea next year. She raised £560 and thanked everyone who took part in the raffle.

LAST TIME AT HOME

CLIFTON 31 - 31 WORTHING RAIDERS

Both these teams accepted before kick off that their promotion chances are now very slight and would depend upon both Esher and Redruth slipping up in the run in. This third versus fourth place fixture had more than pride at stake.

Head coaches Matt Salter at Clifton and Worthing's Jordan Turner-Hall with mutual respect for each other and in favour of high tempo rugby will reflect on narrow defeats during the season and approached this game with thorough preparation and desire to win..

Ultimately the spoils were shared with five tries and three conversions for each team leaving both coaches with degrees of frustration. Salter was disappointed with his team's mistakes particularly in the opening quarter when loose passing and missed tackles allowed Worthing to open up a nineteen point lead. Turner-Hall because his boys did not build on their lead.

Clifton emerged from a stern half time team talk and had much more determination to see themselves in the lead in the closing stages only for Worthing to snatch the draw as the final whistle was imminent.

Worthing prop Dan Sargent had a fine game in the loose and completed his hat trick of tries which included his team's opening score after three minutes and their final try in the closing moments.



Poor Clifton defence let in fly half Kieran Leeming before a run by winger Curtis Barnes found Sargent on hand. Matt Mclean added three conversions

The power of the Clifton pack started to click with number eight Brad Talbot and the strength of prop Alex Giltrow leading to tries to narrow the gap. Luke Cozens converted both efforts.





Second row Liam Perkins put the Sussex men further ahead but Clifton were now making fewer errors and flanker Dan Broady latched on to a catch and drive to score and again narrow the gap.

Wales Under 20 fly half Jac Lloyd joined the fray and a charged down kick bounced well for Alex Howman to run in with Lloyd converting to bring the scores level.

Excitement for the crowd with some feisty exchanges on the pitch with Clifton holding more territorial advantage but Worthing broke away for Sargent to score yet again and open up a five point lead.

Clifton were not done and centre Zak Hamid proudly wearing the 13 shirt once worn by his father was at the end of strong play to bring the scores level with the gusting wind blowing the conversion off course.

LAST TIME ON THE ROAD

ROCHFORD 14 - 84 CLIFTON

Flanker Max Woodward led the Clifton try procession with a hat trick to give their hosts a real trouncing on an afternoon ideally suited to running rugby

The visitors showed no ill reactions to their long trek to Essex and holiday road traffic to come out of their traps and display their creative best in spreading the ball to dominate from the outset

Starting with three players from the Bristol Bears camp Jac Lloyd, Harry Ascherl and Tomas Gwilliam Clifton chose

to rest some key players. Lloyd at fly half initiated attacks at every opportunity and contributed ten conversions

It was soon apparent that the gap between the teams at the top of the table and those languishing towards the bottom is considerable

Fin Sharp, the league's second highest try scorer, followed Woodward's first try before Woodward added two more. Winger Alex Kilbane completed their first half scoring.

Rochford came to life and scored either side of the interval before it became all one way traffic with Sharp adding two further tries Captain Tom Wilson and centre Zak Ward both crossing twice as well with a further Woodward contribution to complete their huge total.

Clifton showed their very best running rugby but recognised that next Saturday's Bristol derby fixture against Dings Crusaders will be a totally different proposition with a large crowd expected at Cribbs Causeway with a 1430 kick off.
