PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE- COVID-19 ADVICE

No doubt you may have already received some advice regarding the Coronavirus from your employer or place of study, but I would just like to re-iterate the following:

1. You should not attend training sessions, matches or social functions if you are unwell.

2. If you are concerned about the possibility of Coronavirus infection (due to recent travel or contact with others that have travelled or are unwell) you should not come down to the club and should instead check 111 for advice via either:

- A very simple to use website: https://111nhs.uk/covid-19

or the 111 phone number

3. You should be fastidious with regards to hand hygiene and follow Public Health England Advice:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after using public transport, using the toilet and before/after eating. Using a sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.

- Always carry tissues with you and use them to catch your cough or sneeze. Then bin the tissue, and wash your hands, or use a sanitiser gel.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth and unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are unwell.
- Avoid shaking hands with other people

- Cough/sneeze into the inside of your elbow rather than your hands. If using a tissue - dispose of the tissue immediately and clean your hands.

Advice from the government is changing on a regular basis – there is not currently any advice to cancel matches, but this may come soon. Please just be sensible and inform the club if you have any concerns.
