Abergavenny Hockey Club were jubiliant to receive the news that they have been offered a wild card entry to the 2014 World Cup.

Both the mens and womens sections were given the news at their End of Season dinner last weekend, but were forbidden from announcing the news until today due to contractual obligations on behalf of the broadcasters

This wild card entry is a new initiative by the FIH and is intended to reward high quality players who might not otherwise have their chance to display their skills on the world stage.

"This is exactly the reward we have been striving for since our 10 year programme was introduced" says Mens captain Luke Rees, with a nod to the efforts made by the coaches in the club over that period.

"We weren't expecting to get the letter at this stage, we thought maybe it would be the 2018 cup, but ho hum that's sport eh?!
