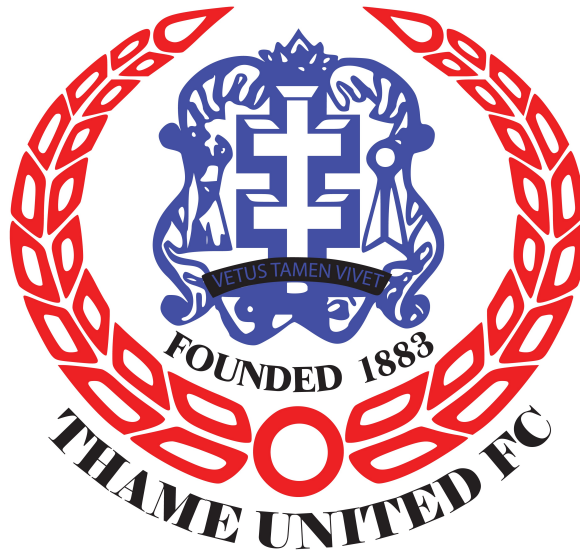

WELCOME



Good afternoon and welcome to the ASM Stadium for this Pitching In Southern Football League Division One Central match between Thame United and Kidlington. A warm welcome to all the players, officials and supporters from Kidlington and we wish them all an enjoyable stay and a safe, if short, journey home.

Over the last week we have had mixed fortunes on the pitch. Last Saturday we fell to a 3-1 defeat against North Leigh, but returned to winning ways on Wednesday evening with a 1-0 victory in the derby match with Aylesbury United. The win, secured by a second half goal from Dan West, was particularly pleasing and well-deserved – and, in reality, the winning margin could have been a lot greater if we had taken the chances we created.

Today we welcome a Kidlington side who come in to the match in their own good run of form, being unbeaten in their last four league fixtures, including a 1-1 draw with Didcot last weekend. We have, of course, also played twice before this season. The reverse league fixture in early October saw a close match with the only goal (in a 1-0 win) coming from Ryan Blake before, four days later, we progressed in the league cup with a win on penalties.

After today we are in cup action on Tuesday evening as we welcome Bicester Hallions to the ASM Stadium for a Quarter Final Oxfordshire Senior Cup tie (kick off: 19:45) Then, next weekend, we make the relatively short trip to second-placed Berkhamsted for a league fixture.

Elsewhere, the Reserves are in action today away at Wellingborough Whitworth. The side go in to the match with renewed confidence having secured their first win in ten league matches last weekend, with a Martin Griggs strike enough to defeat Langford (1-0)

The 'A' Team moved up to second in the Hellenic League Division 2 East with a fine 4-0 win at Taplow United last weekend. They have another difficult fixture this afternoon when they travel to fourth place Aston Clinton Reserves.

The Youth Team are without a match this week, with their next match on 14 February when Buckingham Athletic are the visitors to the ASM Stadium.

THAME UNITED HISTORY

Thame United were formed in 1883 making it one of Oxfordshires' oldest clubs. The early years were spent in various Oxfordshire Leagues and in 1906, 1909 and 1910 Thame won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup and the Senior League in 1907, 1908, 1910, 1930 and 1931. A switch to the Hellenic League then brought further success culminating in the Hellenic League title in 1961-62 and 1969-70, as well as being runners up in 1960-61, 1976-77 and 1980-81. The Oxfordshire Senior Cup was won in both 1976 and 1981 but a poor spell in the mid eighties preceded a crossing of the pyramid in 1988-89 to join the South Midlands League. The Club finished runners up in both 1988-89 and 1989-90 before eventually winning the title in 1990-91.

Thame received the green light to join the Diadora League in 1991/92. 1994-95 saw the Club win the Division 2 Championship with 93 points - an 11 point margin. In 1995/96 the Club reached the 3rd Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Trophy. In the league we finished a creditable 13th in our first ever season in the Isthmian League Division One. Andy Sinnott was appointed first team manager in June 1997 and, with a dramatically reduced operating budget, the side were relegated into Ryman Division Two. The Club bounced straight back into Ryman Division One and reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase. 1999/2000 saw the Club come within two points of achieving promotion to the Premier Division.

2000/2001 season the team lead the way for most of the season, putting together a club record of 12 consecutive league wins but a slump in form in the latter part of the season resulted in a 5th place finish. A mid-table finish followed in 2001/2002 season but the Oxfordshire Senior Cup was retained. Mark West was appointed player/manager when Andy left United during the Summer of 2003. In October 2003 the Club reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup for the first time in its history, before being beaten 1-2 by Conference side Farnborough Town.

After a mid-table finish the Club moved to the newly formed Southern League, Division 1 West. In October 2004 the Club again reached the FA Cup 4th qualifying round and finished the season 11th in the league. Mark West left to join Slough Town and defender Tony Joyce was appointed player /manager.

By July 2005 the Club were in financial trouble and, following a visit from Bailiffs acting on behalf of HMRC, the landlord enforced a clause in the tenancy agreement and evicted the club from Windmill Road. However, shortly thereafter Thame United reached a formal agreement with the new owners of Windmill Road that secured £1.7 million to enable a new facility to be constructed in the town and, after several options had been explored and found to be available, settled

on Church Farm on the northern edge of the town. Whilst the Club progressed procurement of the new site, and the necessary planning permission, a ground share agreement was reached with neighbours Aylesbury United and, with the side struggling at the foot of the Southern League Division 1 West, Tony Joyce resigned in December 2005, with a new joint managerial partnership of Richard Searl and Alan Thorne appointed. Relegation to the Hellenic League was confirmed later in the season. A ground share agreement was reached with AFC Wallingford for the 2006/07 season. Mark West returned to the Club mid-way through the season but could not save the Club from relegation to the Hellenic League Division 1 East. The 2007/08 season provided greater stability for the Club, with Mark West and new assistant, Frank Thompson, looking after first team affairs. A mid-table finish resulted, which was followed by a ninth placed finish in 2008/09. 2009/10 saw the Club win the Division 1 East title by six points and reclaim their place in the Premier Division.

The 2010/11 season was the most significant in the Club's recent history. With work on a new £3.1m ground at Meadow View Park commencing in March 2010, United returned to Thame at the ASM Stadium on 11 December 2010, just over five years after their enforced eviction from the town. Boasting eight pitches, a floodlit 3G training pitch and 8000sqft clubhouse, United now have one of the best sporting facilities in the County. The official opening against Oxford United on 18th January 2011 set a record crowd of 1,382.

Season 2016-17 was one of the most successful in the recent history of the Club. Going the whole league season without losing at home, United were crowned Hellenic League Premier Division Champions on the final day of the season, defeating Henley Town 9-0 to over-turn a seven goal deficit. United were duly promoted to the Southern Football League, returning after a spell of twelve years away. In the first season back at Step 4, United finished in a comfortable mid-table position, enjoying a successful run in the FA Trophy. In 2018/19 United secured an 8th place finish with the side occupying a mid-table position when the 2019/20 season was curtailed due to the pandemic. The 2020/21 season never really got going, with only seven league matches completed before the league was again curtailed, although the side reached the First Round Proper of the FA Trophy before losing out to Bognor Regis Town.

Prior to the 2021/22 significant enhancements were completed to Meadow View Park with associated organisational changes, including all teams within the Thame Football Partnership now playing under the 'Thame United' banner. This includes Thame United Reserves, who will be competing in the Spartan South Midlands League Division One.

THAME UNITED SQUAD

Craig Hill: Goalkeeper (Age: 26)

Re-joined United in December 2020 from Corby Town, who he joined from United in February 2020, having been first choice keeper for the Red Kites for three seasons. Previously with Aston Villa, Oxford City and Kettering Town.

David Lynn: Defence (Age: 26)

Solid and assured left back with good technical ability. Now in his seventh season with the Club having previously been with Oxford United, Chesham United and Banbury United.

Lewis Thorne: Defence (Age: 19)

Steps-up this season from Thame Rangers with an abundance of pace, energy and defensive qualities, whilst also dangerous going forward.

Harry Mephram: Defence (Age: 23)

Joined at the start of the 2017/18 season from Beaconsfield Town and has been a virtual ever-present since. Versatile defender who reads the game well and with good technical ability.

George Gilmore: Defence (Age:19)

Recent signing from Didcot Town, having come through the youth ranks at Oxford United. Imposing centre half who can also play at full back.

Brodie Gray: Defence (Age: 24)

Right back who Impressed during pre-season with his pace, strength and reading of the game. Joins from Dundonald Bluebell, having previously been with St Johnstone and East Fife.

Finlay Murray: Defence (Age:20)

Came through the ranks at Barnet FC. Solid and assured defender who can play anywhere across the back four.

Matt Peake-Pijnen: Defence / Midfield (Age: 23)

Versatile player who is comfortable on either flank. Joined United in December 2018 from neighbours Aylesbury United. Previously with Oxford City and Banbury United.

Greg Hackett: Midfield (Age 25)

Signed at the start of the 2019/20 season having spent the latter half of 2018/19 with Didcot Town. Another wide player who contributes his fair share of goals. Previously with Oxford United and Ardley United.

Jack Tutton: Midfield (Age: 22)

Joined United from North Leigh in January 2019 having previously been with Oxford City. Energetic and hard-working midfield player who gets forward and causes problems in the opposition area.

Harry Scott: Midfield (Age: 21)

Re-joined at the start of the season, having previously played in the 2018/19 season when he signed from neighbours Aylesbury FC. Tricky wide player with good pace and close control, but also an eye for goal. Also played for Beaconsfield Town, Aylesbury United and Berkhamsted

THAME UNITED SQUAD

Jack Tompkins: Midfield (Age: 19)

Signed at the start of the season. Combative ball-winning midfield player with bags of energy and who looks to get the ball forward. Previously with Barnet.

David Pearce: Midfield (Age: 30)

Vastly experienced player who joined the Club in October 2021 from Chesham United for whom he played over 300 games. Previously with Oxford City and Hemel Hempstead Town

Ryan Blake: Midfield/Striker (Age: 30)

Signed in the early part of the 2019/20 season from Chesham United. Brought with him a wealth of experience – quick and dangerous player with an eye for goal.

Daniel West: Midfield/Striker (Age: 28)

Joined nine years ago from Oxford United, initially as a midfield player, but moved forward scoring 25 goals in the Championship winning side of 2016/17 before claiming the Golden Boot in the Southern League East Division in 2017/18.

Lynton Goss: Striker (Age: 26)

Prolific striker who scored over 80 goals for United in the 2016/17 and 2017/18 seasons before making the move to Harrow Borough. Returned to the Club in October 2018.

Andy Gledhill: Striker (Age: 32)

Been with the Club for a number of years, enjoying his best goalscoring spell during the Championship winning side of 2016/17, before suffering bad luck with injuries. Now returned to full fitness.

Mark West: Manager (Age: 55)

Former player with Thame United who re-joined the Club for his second spell as Manager in January 2007. Prolific goalscorer with Wycombe Wanderers, Slough Town and Farnborough Town.

Stuart Blaik: Assistant Manager (Age: 50)

FA Level 3 Coach now in his seventh season with the Club. Previously with Aylesbury United, Corby Town, Nuneaton Borough, Brackley Town, Buckingham Town and Tring Town.

Ben Johnson: Coach (Age: 35)

Former player who has since gone on to manage the Development side and Reserve Team. Stepped-up to First Team level in 2018/19

Jen Pilcher: Physio

Joined the Club at the start of last season and has become an invaluable member of the management team.

KIDLINGTON FC HISTORY

Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football where rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played. In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success. By 1951 the Oxfordshire Senior League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town, Morris Motors, Pressed Steel and Thame United.

In 1953 The Hellenic League was formed and the Oxon Senior League lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League that season and joined the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington however, maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with 'The Greens' winning the County Intermediate Cup. In 1976-77 a squad of good young players produced what was Kidlington's best ever run in an FA competition. The team played every round bar one away from home and reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, eventually bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80.

The 80's were pretty uneventful and saw Kidlington return to Division One of the Hellenic League. The early 90's were steady. In season 1994-95, Martin Bakers Reserve side did the League and Cup double bringing some long awaited silverware back to the club, and an upturn in the first team fortunes occurred after Karl Grossmann was appointed manager, achieving top 6 finishes in four successive seasons.

The new millennium saw a major overhaul of the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of ex-player Kevin Walton, the first team finished in third place and achieved promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football and the team finished in a relegation position. However a national non-league restructure saved us.

In 2007/08, First Team silverware arrived for the first time in over 30 years when we won the Floodlit Trophy under manager Paul Lee. There were additional honours that season with the Reserves winning Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, the Youth team winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and Kidlington Veterans retaining their Veteran League crown.

In 2009-10 came a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and a new management team. Ex-player Gordon Geary was recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles to run the Reserve team.

Season 2010-11 saw the club achieve its most successful season ever, finishing seventh in the Premier Division, and a superb effort by all saw us play a very strong Oxford United team at the Kassam Stadium in the Final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup, where unfortunately we lost. We did win some silverware though, beating Purton 3-0 in the final of the Supplementary Cup.

In December of season 2011-12 Gordon and Barry resigned and two senior players Danny Leggett and Christian Perkins stepped forward to guide the club through until the end of the season with the club just maintaining its Hellenic Premier Division status.

For season 2013-14 the club installed Martin Wilkinson as First Team manager and finished sixth in the league, making club history. They also reached the Senior Cup Final again, but lost to Ardley United.

Season 2014-15 saw the team finish in our highest ever league position of fourth.

Season 2015-16 was a dream come true for everyone at KFC, with Wilkinson and his team of Paul Harwood, Julian McCalmon and Jermaine McSporran, leading our 1st team to the Hellenic League Premier Division title and promotion to the Southern League. We also had our best ever run in the FA Vase where we reached the last eight and had a very healthy run in the FA Cup, losing eventually to Conference side Gloucester City.

Season 2016-17, was our first at level 4 of the football pyramid in the Evo-Stik League South Division One Central but, due to work commitments, Wilkinson resigned after a month. Jermaine McSporran took over as Caretaker Manager until the club appointed Julian McCalmon as our new Manager, with McSporran and Paul Harwood as his assistants. The new manager and the team had a good season at this higher level and eventually finished in mid-table. Our reserves with Nick East as Manager, had a great season winning the Reserve Challenge Cup and finishing as runners up in the Hellenic League Division 2 West.

Due to the geographical implications from promotion/relegation, for season 2017-18 we were transferred across to the South West Division. Our reserve team achieved senior status with promotion to UHlsport Hellenic Division One West and were also re-branded as the "Development Team "

For season 2018-19, McCalmon resigned and Ady Fuller was appointed as First Team Manager. He had to form a completely new squad ahead of the season, and due to another F.A. national restructure we transferred back to South Division One Central. After a poor start the manager resigned in mid-October and we re-instated Julian McCalmon with Joe Davies & Elliot Osborne-Ricketts as his assistants. We avoided relegation on the last day of the season.

McCalmon resigned again in January 2020 and was replaced by Ben Sadler, assisted by Paul Braithwaite. The pair led Wantage Town to promotion as Hellenic League Champions in 2019. Despite their first two seasons being severely disrupted by Covid-19, we have seen positive changes and improvements both on and off the pitch and look forward to a successful 2021/22 season.

Cultured midfielder who reads the game well. Made the step up from the development team and excelled during the last two curtailed seasons..

Brad Cox: Age 25

Strong defender recently signed from Easington Sports.

Ollie Creed: Age 27

Utility Player previously with Abingdon United.

Luke Stokoe: Age 20

A promising young midfielder signed from Oxford City U'23's

Dan Stokoe: Age 20

Twin brother of Luke, another promising young midfielder recruited from Oxford City U'23's

Connor Matimore: Age 28
